Welcome Spectators

Hello and thank you for coming! There is a lot to know, firstly, this is NOT an airshow and your personal safety is our primary objective. We recognize the desire to get close to the cool airplanes but, due to various rules, we cannot allow the general public access to the aircraft parking area or "ramp". We encourage you to observe from the Airport Park, and its associated parking lot. Access to the ramp area is restricted for *YOUR* safety. These airplanes have poor pilot visibility on the ground and a spinning propeller is deadly. We welcome you to observe the aircraft from along the fence.

Parking

Parking is permitted in designated areas. The parking lot East of the Airport Park is acceptable for parking; however, you cannot sit in the trunk of your car and spectate from there as it is considered too close to the aerobatic area. Spectators must remain on the west side of the short height fence that runs parallel to the Airport Park. If you are in this area loitering or sitting, you will be asked to move.


How Does It Work?

Each competitor in categories from beginner to expert flies three flights. Competitors fly paths in the sky known as 'figures'. Figures can be a combination of loops, lines, rolls and spins. These figures are graded on factors such as precision of the lines and angles, symmetry and other factors spelled out in the official contest rules.

Flights are graded by a team of five judges who are assisted by two people each. These judges grade each individual figure as well as the way the sequence is positioned within the competition area called the 'aerobatic box'.

Judges have a printed copy of the sequence of figures each pilot will fly. The figures are graphically represented by symbols in a system known as Aresti. The graphical symbol representing each figure is also assigned a difficulty

The Aerobatic Box




Competition Categories

Primary: The primary sequence is composed of six simple figures. All pilots fly the same sequence three times. This is considered the entry level category.


Sportsman: All sportsman pilots are required to fly the known compulsory sequence. Most pilots fly the known sequence on all three flights however sports in pilot have the option of flying a free sequence for their second and third flights.

Intermediate: In addition to a more complex known compulsory, intermediate pilots are also required to fly an

Advanced: The advanced pilot must fly and even more complex and known and unknown compulsory as well as a free program.

Unlimited: Unlimited pilot flies the most difficult and complex figures of all competition pilots. They must fly an extremely high performance airplane capable of flying required figures. In addition to the known, unknown and free programs, unlimited pilots can choose to
