#### Os--

- 5. Christmas Gala and Parade—Tarsha Taylor presented information about both. She stated that candy was needed for the parade and the best time to buy it is Nov. 1 when Halloween candy is on sale—no peanut butter, nuts or candy corn, please due to allergy concerns.

The Christmas parage is Sunday, December 8 at 3 p.m. Line up will be at 1:30 at the fire station—floats and vehicles will meet at the church parking lot.

The Christmas party will be November 23 from 4-7 p.m. at the Barn on Solley's lane (dirt road off McKnight Forest). Volunteers are needed for food, decorations, and entertainment. The theme is Western—hats/boots welcome but not required.
