William Muxlow question if a person is pulled over due to marijuana will they be arrested, and is it a Federal Offense.

Chief McKibben said Yes, but there would have to be a reason to pull someone over.

PARK BOARD:

Wellhead Protection Program: The Wellhead protection committee got together to continue to go over potential sites that would be a good spot for a new well in case the City's needs replacing. The group has narrowed it down to four, our grant administrator is going to get with EGLE on what they think about these potential sites.

Part of the grant is community involvement. Ethan is working on this with the school. Some of the ideas we are working on is taking the science class to the well pump station so they can see where their water comes from. Getting a ground water diorama and doing a presentation in the science class. Potentially painting some Storm Sewer Manholes with water conservation art. Site approval good for long term.
