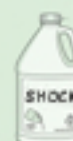


The Texas Weather & Storm Prep Guide

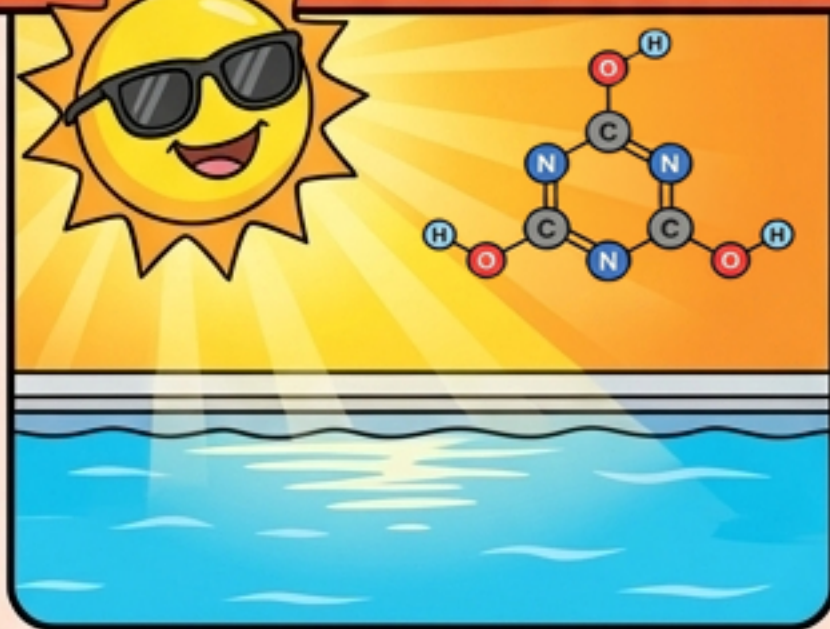
After Heavy Rain & Storms



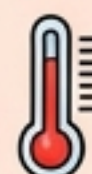
- **Dilution:** Heavy rain dilutes your chemicals and drops dirt, pollen, and organic matter into the pool.
- **Action Steps:** Check the water level and drain excess if it's overflowing. Test pH and chlorine immediately, add shock if necessary, and run the filter system for at least 24 hours.



During Intense Summer Heat Waves



- **Burn-off:** Extreme Texas UV rays eat up free chlorine rapidly.
- **Action Steps:** Keep a close eye on your stabilizer (cyanuric acid) levels to protect your chlorine, and anticipate higher evaporation rates (keep the garden hose handy to top it off).



The Winter Freeze Alert



- **Freeze Damage:** Standing water in pipes can freeze, expand, and crack your expensive equipment.
- **Action Steps:** Ensure freeze protection triggers are working. If not, manually set your pump to run continuously throughout the freeze. Moving water will not freeze in the plumbing.
