

Thank you to all the neighbors for contributing to AONA, participating in our neighborhood events, and making Arden Oaks a special place to live.



SECURITY REPORT

"The security does an excellent job! We have a second home and are gone a month at a time. They regularly check our house and [they] are amazing! So happy to have them!"

These are the words of one of our neighbors here in Arden Oaks, which so well expresses how grateful many of us are to have such an effective neighborhood security program.

This year we are pleased to report that AONA reached out to residents in the areas just east and west of the Arden Oaks Neighborhood Preservation Area (NPA) boundaries, and a significant number of these residents are now contributing to the Arden Oaks security program. This resultant increase in contributions means that we've expanded our security program to provide regular coverage of all the residential areas north of Arden Way, between Watt Avenue and Eastern Avenue, south of and including Winding Creek Road, Rockwood Drive, and Maple Glen Road. This expanded coverage not only provides additional security to residents in these adjoining areas, but it also provides regular coverage of all of the entry points to Arden Oaks. There is definitely power in numbers, and with the new participants in the security program and the expanded coverage, we're hopeful that together we can keep our neighborhood as safe and well protected as possible.



The off-duty sheriff deputies continue to maintain a regular patrol schedule, now in the expanded Arden Oaks area. In general, there are six to seven patrol shifts every week, with each shift lasting from four to six hours, which can occur in the morning, afternoon, evening, or late night. The timing of the patrol shifts vary from day to day and week to week to avoid any predictable set pattern.

By and large, the sheriff deputies have reported few noteworthy incidents throughout the neighborhood these past several months. There was one report of a residential burglary in July, and several reports of mail theft and mail box break-ins. In all cases, the security patrols were notified of these incidents, and the sheriff deputies followed up to try to prevent further occurrences of these incidents.

Thank you again to all the residents who have so consistently and generously contributed to the security program. The success of this program is based entirely on your contributions. See the list at the end of this newsletter for the many neighbors who have contributed to the program for 2023.

SECURITY REMINDERS:

- · Bring in your mail every day.
- · Keep your doors and vehicles locked and to take your packages inside as soon as possible.
- Get to know your neighbors, keep an eye out, and report suspicious activity or people in the neighborhood.
- Use the Sheriff's Department non-emergency phone number (916-874-5115) to report any suspicious activity or concerns.
- If there is an emergency call 911. This call will reach the off-duty officers if they are on duty.
- If you become victim to vandalism, mail or property theft, or illegal dumping the Sacramento Sheriff's Department asks that you file a crime report online at: https://www.sacsheriff.com/pages/crime_re port.php. A crime report takes less than 5 minutes to submit. Since patrol decisions are based in large part on where crime is being reported within the County, submitting a report can help ensure that Arden Oaks receives the adequate level of service from both on-duty and off-duty sheriff patrols.

SMUD PROPOSED RATE INCREASES

SMUD is proposing an increase in rates in 2024 and 2025 for residential and non-residential customers. The proposed rate increases are needed due to increased costs associated with reliability (including wildfire mitigation and outage management in severe storms), infrastructure improvements, increases in material, services and labor costs, and compliance with state mandates for renewable energy. The specific rate increases will depend on how much electricity individual customers use each month. However, on average, the rate increases would be less than \$4.00 per month, with increases taking effect on January 2024, May 2024, January 2025, and May 2025. Even with these rate increases, SMUD's rate would remain substantially lower than PG&E costs for residential customers. The final decision for the rate increases will take place at the SMUD board meeting on September 21.

WATER DISTRICTS EXPLORING POSSIBLE MERGER

Here in Arden Oaks, our water service is provided by the Sacramento Suburban Water District (SSWD), a publicly owned and operated water utility regulated by the state. Our water primarily come from ground-water in the local area, and we enjoy consistently excellent water quality. Formerly, we were serviced by the Arcade Water District, which combined with the Northridge Water District in 2002 to become the Sacramento Suburban Water District, which now has a service area of 36 square miles and serves a population of about 200,000.

Starting in 2020, SSWD began working with the neighboring, smaller Carmichael Water District to explore combining the two water utilities to encourage efficiencies, reduce costs, improve water supply reliability, and enhance customer service. The Carmichael Water District has a service area of about 8 square miles and serves a population of about 40,000; its primary water supply is surface water from the American River.

In February 2023, the two districts completed an initial study of the potential advantages and disadvantages es to combining the districts. Potential advantages include: improved efficiencies to both districts, greater water resources sharing, greater reliability, and more rate and financial stability. Potential disadvantages include: perceived loss of local control, larger organization with more bureaucracy, and challenges to combining existing water resources.

Currently, the two districts are completing a public outreach and undertaking additional technical analysis before moving forward with a decision. For more information, see the Sacramento Suburban Water District's website at <sswd.org>.

REMINDERS ABOUT WEEKLY CURBSIDE GARBAGE COLLECTION

Weekly waste collection in Arden Oaks is Tuesday for homes west of Maple Glen Road and on Wednesday for homes east of Maple Glen Road. As a courtesy to the County and to your neighbors, please remember to:

- Have your carts at the curb by 6 a.m. on your pick-up day.
- Be sure the card lids are closed to avoid littering the streets.
- If possible, place the carts in your driveway or walkway. Try not to block the streets.
- After the pick-up, please return to carts to your yard as soon possible, and keep the streets clear.
