

# Cliff's Notes

Psalm 46: 10: "Be still and know that I am God!"

A friend called today asking if I was available to get together for lunch. "Of course", I replied, until I looked at my calendar. I was surprised as to how busy my life gets and amusement parks are not even open yet! It is

not just ministry that keeps me busy, but also pleasurable times, such as events at Chestnut Ridge, meeting with friends, etc. My guess is that many of you would echo how crazy life gets, and how there are not just enough hours in the day.

The Lenten season begins on March 5th with Ash Wednesday. For many a Lenten discipline is to give up something, often food or a bad habit. For some it is trying again to follow through on a New Year's Resolution that we failed to keep past January 4.

This year my Lenten discipline is centered in Psalm 46:10, "Be still and know that I am God." My challenge will be to take time to sit still for a few minutes --- to be still – to sense God's Presence with me. Along with that I am going to set aside time for reading and study, more than is necessary for writing a sermon. This is time to be mindful of God's Presence and to listen to the urgings of His Spirit. This may be easier said than done.

How often have I visited someone when they have the radio or television playing. They only half listen because they really do not want to miss their program. I often ask if they could turn off the noise until after I leave. For the truth is, I get distracted as well. When that happens all hope for honest communication is lost. The same is true for the Voice of God. Unless one is still and intent on listening, it is hard to hear that Divine voice giving us a bit of guidance or inspiration or hope or whatever.

I encourage you to join me as we make some time during the day to be quiet so one can sense God's Presence in our midst. Be still. Let God speak to you and allow yourself to hear that message! You may end up reflecting on a prayer concern, or a Scriptural passage, or on a sermon. You may gain a deeper insight into a nagging problem. The starting point is to **BE STILL!** 

In addition to attending worship on both Sunday mornings and our mid-week Lenten services, this daily exercise may help break some of the stress and anxiety of the day as well as renewing and refreshing your Spirit. It's rather simple really... just relax. Be Still. Know the Ever-Present God who surrounds you.


The Joyous Noise Designee for the Month of March will be for the victims of the Western North Carolina Floods.

# FROM THE CHURCH BOARD


It's been cold, cold cold!.....
