

The snow covers up the dirt and makes the area look clean and refreshed. Unless you have to work or drive in it, it is a pleasure to look at it. That is until tomorrow when much of it is supposed to melt and much of that beauty goes away.

It reminded me of that passage in Psalm 51:7 which says "Wash me and I shall be whiter than snow." That is --- until tomorrow.

It seems to be human nature that we draw near to the Lord in faith, when we know the forgiving Grace of Jesus Christ which feels refreshing and renewing. We set our hopes high, pledging to live life with the best of intentions, showing love to everyone ... at least until tomorrow.

Then the realities of the world set back in, We encounter other's anger or stubbornness. Even the technology that is supposed to make our life easier seems to deliberately not work correctly which only tests our patience. Frustration set in. The beauty and refreshment of Christ's forgiveness melts away to remind us of some of our basest thoughts and feelings.

As an idealistic Pastor, I should just dwell on the whiteness of snow. But as a realist, I am aware that this renewal feeling only lasts so long. That is why we need to be constantly reminded of the Grace of Jesus that we find when we worship, read Scripture, pray or show kindness and love to another person. For me, that is the constant battle within each of us between the cleansing Grace of God and the challenge of living in an imperfect world.

Yet I cling to the knowledge that God knows and understands my imperfect nature, and the imperfect nature of this world. It is also trusting in God's Divine Mercy that I know that whenever I fall short, I look to Jesus to find some spiritual snow falling on my soul, giving it peace and forgiveness only found in Our Savior.

So for now, I will enjoy the snow, knowing that it comes from Our Creator. It gives me peace and hope for today and for everyday. May your time at worship and in prayer find that cleansing snow whitening your sins, restoring your soul and giving you peace.

CHANGES IN THE PENN NORTHEAST CONFERENCE

On Saturday, November 9, the four Pennsylvania Conferences of the United Church of Christ voted at their individual Conference meetings (all held at the same time) to begin a merger to become one Conference in the entire state to be known as the Keystone Conference.

This idea has taken several years of hard work, prayer, and planning. Thus, 2025 will be a year of transition for all four conferences including Penn Northeast. If all goes as planned, there will be one Conference headquarters at a place to be determined. All four of the current Conference Ministers will resign their posts.

For Penn Northeast, the current staff, including Dr. Bonnie Bates will be retiring to make way for new staff. The promise is that it will provide some efficiencies by uniting all of the Conferences and enable us to be more effective as Pastors and churches.

What does this mean for St. Peter's Church? Initially you will not sense any changes locally, but gradually you will hear of new staff that will resource our ministry and new locations where our larger ministry will be performed. Much remains to be decided, but we walk into the future feeling God's guidance. Please keep the Conferences of the United Church of Christ in Pennsylvania in your prayers as we make this bold new step.

EPIPHANY

Epiphany is commonly known as Three Kings' Day or the Feast of the Epiphany. It means "manifestation" or "showing forth". Epiphany refers not only to the day itself but to the church season that follows it – a season that ends when Lent begins.

It commemorates the first two occasions on which Jesus' divinity, according to Christian belief, was manifested: when the three kings (also known as wise men or Magi) visited infant Jesus in Bethlehem, and when John the Baptist baptized Him in the River Jordan. The Roman Catholic and Protestant churches emphasize the visit of the Magi when they celebrate the Epiphany.

Epiphany is one of the oldest Christian feasts. It was celebrated since the end of the second century, before the Christmas holiday was established.


