

INDOOR WORSHIP GUIDELINES for COVID19

For the health and safety of everyone, social distancing will be practiced in the sanctuary. Seating will be available in every other pew. Family members may sit together, but please allow six feet between other members and other families. Ushers will be available to assist with seating. Overflow seating will be available in the social hall, if needed.

Masks (worn correctly—covering both mouth and nose) are required at all times while in the church building. There will be no congregational singing at this time, but special music will continue to be offered. Offering envelopes may be placed in the plates at the entrances to the sanctuary. Holy Communion will continue to be celebrated on the first Sunday of the month. All who wish to participate are asked to bring their own bread (individually packaged wafers are available, if needed) and wine/juice will be safely distributed by the ushers.

Following the service, the ushers will dismiss the congregation. While we understand and appreciate that everyone wants to fellowship with their church family and friends, we are asking that members not gather in the building following worship. If you would like to engage in conversation with others, please do so outside of the building.

Attendance will be taken every Sunday; if someone tests positive for Covid19, all those present will be notified and in-door worship will be cancelled for two weeks. These procedures are in place to protect everyone, especially those considered more vulnerable to contract the virus. If you are feeling sick, please DO NOT attend in-person worship. If you become sick and test positive for Covid19, please contact the church office or the pastor immediately so protective measures can be put into place.

The Church Board appreciates your prayers, support, and patience as we resume indoor worship. We will continue to review the observance of the guidelines and adjust procedures as needed. As always, if you have any questions, concerns or suggestions regarding the guidelines, please do not hesitate to contact the Pastor or a Board member.

ST PETER'S HELPING HANDS OUTREACH COMMITTEE

St. Peter's Community Outreach Committee met on March 16 to discuss a mission statement and begin working on outreach projects.

It was decided that the committee will focus on one global project per year, or another project that reaches out to another area of our country and continue to serve the community through local outreach projects.

Global Project:

The committee determined that the first global project will be Food for the Poor. Food for the Poor, first introduced by guest preacher, Reverend Bruce Potteiger, is a charity organization that works with those in extreme poverty in Latin America and the Caribbean. Food for the Poor not only provides aid to those living in extreme poverty, but also provides support for a future for self-sustenance.

There have been donation boxes for congregation members to take home during the Lenten season to collect monetary donations. These donations will be collected by the committee members for Easter. The donations will be totaled up to purchase an item that will be sent to where it is needed the most. Further information is available at foodforthepoor.org.

Local Project:

Our first local community project will be a collection drive of tissue boxes for our local nursing homes. Many of the nursing homes have expressed a simple need of tissues for their residents. The committee will be hosting Operation Bless You Boxes for the congregation to donate boxes of tissues. There will be a collection bin down in the parlor area when you enter the church. The Bless You Boxes will be collected for the month of May.
