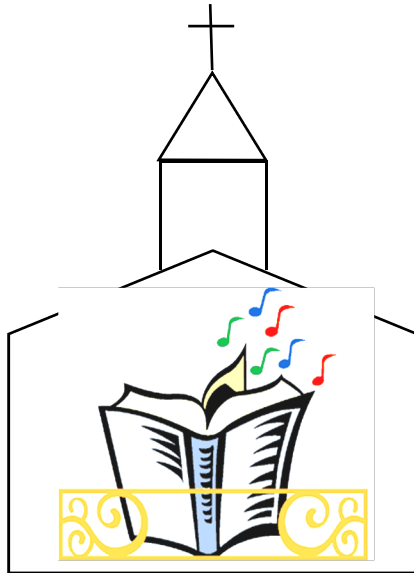

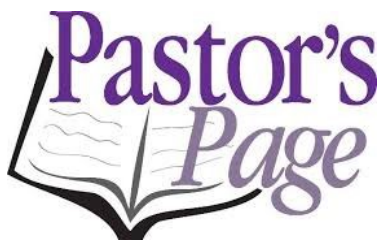

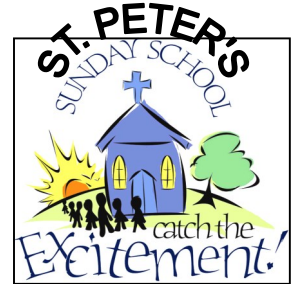

WASP usually meets in the fellowship hall the 3rd Tuesday of every month, unless a special event is planned. All women are invited to join them.

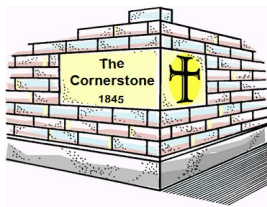

Joyous Noise Offering

PEOPLE HELPING PEOPLE TO MAKE CHRIST'S LOVE KNOWN

The Joyous Noise Offering in March totaled \$175.00 and was collected for the Concern Organization which helps children with foster care, children with medical and trauma needs, promotes adoption, community services, such as in-home care, transitional youth and case management, and behavioral health services such as crisis intervention and mental health services. Concern is making a difference every day . . . One child at a time.

The Joyous Noise for April will be for Samaritan's Purse, Ukraine. Samaritan's Purse has established an Emergency Field Hospital on the outskirts of Lviv, in western Ukraine, to care for those suffering as war rages on. They have scores of disaster response specialists on the ground between Ukraine, Poland, Romania, and Moldova. More than 2.5 million refugees have fled Ukraine to other European countries. Millions more are displaced internally. "God calls us to go into crisis areas to help those who are most vulnerable," said Franklin Graham, president of Samaritan's Purse. "As the conflict escalates in Ukraine, our international disaster response teams with doctors, nurses, and other specialists are equipped and ready to help people in Jesus' Name. We want them to know that God loves them and has not forgotten them."
