At Christmas, there are countless images and figurines of the Nativity of Jesus. Crosses are bountiful all year long—they hang on our walls, sit on our desks, they adorn us as jewelry. But at Easter, the empty tomb does not appear often on cards and gifts, nor does it grace the shelves in stores... colored eggs and bunnies take over! I've never seen an empty tomb necklace or earrings. It's almost non-existent, except in and around churches. I have numerous Nativity sets and

figurines, many crosses at home and in my office at church but only one replica of the empty tomb, hand-made for me by a congregation member. (Pictured above) It is beautiful and meaningful, and I have been looking at it more often recently, wondering why this symbol doesn't get as much exposure as the other two. Why do I only have one? It has prompted me to want more of them.

These three symbols that are the foundation of the Christian faith represent the life of Jesus: his birth, his death, and his resurrection...all equally significant, yet the empty tomb kind of takes a backseat to the others. Is it because we don't understand it? We can connect with the other two on a human level, birth and death are a part of our lives...but resurrection?? Not so much!

None of us have experienced bodily resurrection...but it is our Christian hope, it is the reason that Jesus was raised to life—so that we too can be raised to life again when our earthly life is done. Do you believe this? It's not an easy concept to grasp because no one has come back to prove it.

Or...have they? If you have lost a loved one, you know what I mean. We feel and experience their presence, they visit us in the form of cardinals, a butterflies, a scent, a faint whisper in our ear, a fluttering in the heart and we know it is real—this is our glimpse of resurrection. It is mysterious, there is uncertainty, but we know it is real, and that it is a gift for all of us. Jesus was born, lived, and loved, suffered, and died on the cross so that we could truly experience the empty tomb of resurrection...not just his, but the empty tombs of our loved ones and our own as well!

Resurrection is real and true, and Jesus is asking us to embrace it! Look for a symbol of the empty tomb, draw one, construct one, keep it where you can see it all year long to remind you that you are so precious and loved by God that He wants to spend all of eternity with you!

During this Easter season, may you feel the power of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ and the hope that it gives to the world.

#### THE LEGEND OF THE DOGWOOD

There is a legend, that at the time of the Crucifixion the dogwood had been the size of the oak and other forest trees. So firm and strong was the tree that it was chosen as the timber for the cross. To be used thus for such a cruel purpose greatly distressed the tree, and Jesus, nailed upon it, sensed this, and in His gentle pity for all sorrow and suffering said to it: "Because of your regret and pity for My suffering, never again shall the dogwood tree grow large enough to be used as a cross. Henceforth it shall be slender and bent and twisted and its blossoms shall be in the form of a cross...Two long and two short petals and in the center of the outer edge of each petal there will be nail prints, brown with rust and stained with red, and in the center of the flower will be a crown of thorns, and all who see it will remember."

#### PLEASE NOTE THIS CHANGE FOR OUR CHURCH NEWSLETTER

The costs for mailing our church newsletter has increased due to the post office rate hikes. Our yearly permit has increased \$40.00 (from \$250/year to \$290/year.). The cost for mailing the newsletter monthly has risen \$60.00 (from \$120.00/month to \$180.00/month). The Church Board has determined to now do a bi-monthly newsletter to help save cost (a savings of \$1,080.00/year).

This change will take effect for the MAY/JUNE newsletter and will then continue as a 2-month publication.

In order for this transition to run smoothly, all information/articles must adhere to a <u>strict deadline</u>. We will still adhere to the deadline being the 2nd Tuesday of every other month (i.e. ~ May/June deadline is Tuesday, April 11th, July/August deadline is Tuesday, June 13th, etc.).
