

We welcomed Pastor Bruce Potteiger to share the good news about *Food for the Poor* on Sunday, January 24th. Pastor Bruce has served our Lord in 40 years of parish ministry in the ELCA. His ministry was spent in Northeast Pennsylvania. He has been on over 30 mission trips with his parish churches, rebuilding homes throughout the United Sates, and has most recently visited Haiti and

Nicaragua with *Food for the Poor*.

Over the past 38 years *Food for the Poor*, a Christian based nonprofit organization, has worked in 17 countries in the Caribbean Islands and Latin America, working with local pastors to serve the poor and spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Over 94% of all gifts including donated goods, go directly to help the poor, providing not only food but also emergency relief, clean water, medicines, educational material, building homes, micro-enterprise projects, prison ministry, support of orphans and the aged.

We have enclosed a brochure if you are interested in supporting this ministry; the brochure also describes how this organization helps to feed people in 17 countries.

Pastor's Message

Love is patient; love is kind. Love isn't envious, doesn't boast, brag, or strut about. There's no arrogance in love; it's never rude, crude, or indecent—it's not self-absorbed. Love isn't easily upset. Love doesn't tally wrongs or celebrate injustice; but truth—yes, truth—is love's delight! Love puts up with anything and everything that comes along; it trusts, hopes, and endures no matter what. —1Corinthians 13:4-7 (The Voice)

When we were first dating and in the early years of our marriage, my husband and I did the Valentine's Day thing: expensive flowers, gifts and dinners, mushy cards, even some funny gag gifts. But as the years went on and our love for each other grew in different ways...we agreed to stop celebrating Valentine's Day because we realized we became pretty good at celebrating our love every day of the year and we still do to this day. We stopped buying into the expensive "Hallmark Holiday" that Valentine's Day has become.

Love should be celebrated every day of the year and not just celebrated by couples in love. We should celebrate the love of families and friends; we should rejoice in the love found in the communities to which we belong. The love of creation and the extraordinary world we live in should be loved and appreciated every day of the year. And most of all...we should be ecstatic at the love that God has for us—a love that is shown to us in a myriad of ways.

Our world, our country, our lives and our relationships with one another need this kind of love that Paul speaks of—the kind of love that Jesus taught and lived out daily in his life. We need love that is not arrogant, indecent, or self-absorbed; we need love that isn't easily upset, we need love that doesn't take sides because it sees the love of God working in everything.

We need love that doesn't celebrate injustice—we need love that knows the definitions of justice and injustice...explained by Jesus in the Gospels. We need love surrounding us and embracing us, we need acts of love daily now more than ever before. So, regardless if you celebrate

Valentine's Day or not...celebrate the LOVE in the world. Don't focus on all the hatred among us being acted out...celebrate the love you give and receive, live love in your life and BE LOVE...love that trusts, hopes and endures!
