

### **Lent: The Fast before the Feast**

The church year from November to April certainly keeps us on our toes. The Christmas decorations are barely put away and here we are on our way to the next great event in the life of the church: the season of Lent that prepares us for Easter and the Resurrection of our Lord.

Did you ever go on a diet before a vacation so that you could really live it up and eat anything you wanted to eat? Lent is not only a time to fast from food so that we can enjoy our feast on Easter Sunday. It is a time to pull back into a kind of spiritual desert so that we can truly rejoice in the Resurrection and embrace the power and the meaning of it in our lives. When I was in seminary, I noticed a copy of "The Passion of Christ" in the library during Lent in my second year. Although the movie had already been out for almost 7 years, I had never watched it. I didn't want to see it because I had heard how horrific it was. But that year, something told me to watch it. It was shocking and terrifying and I wept for the pain that Jesus endured for me, for all of us and for the world. I can still see those awful images of the crucifixion in my mind, and I purposefully try to think about them during the season of Lent because that is part of my fast before the feast.

I picture what Jesus suffered so that I can genuinely and wholeheartedly rejoice on Easter Sunday as his disciples, friends and family did when they finally realized that he had been raised from the dead. We cannot truly appreciate victory until we have tasted defeat, we don't know true freedom unless we have once been in bondage, and how would we know what light was if we never knew darkness?

It is a somber time of year for a reason, it is a time for darkness that prepares us for the greatest light we will ever know. Jesus suffered and died, he took the sin of the world upon himself and defeated sin and death so that we do not need to fear anything. My prayer for all of us is that we take this time of year seriously. Make it a fast, however you choose to do that, so that you can rejoice in the feast of Easter Sunday and take part in the Resurrection as you see it happening in your own life and in your own heart.

The current account balance is \$5,100.00

- The Building Fund transferred 5% of the 2022 fund raising profits to the St. Peter's Discretionary Fund. The amount was \$1,203.95.
- A check in the amount of \$8,000 was issued for the roof project.
- We appreciate the generosity of the members who direct their Thrivent Choice Dollars throughout the year to the Building Fund account. The 2022 monies received was \$3,534.

January's Joyous Noise Offering for the month of January totaled \$458.37 and was designated for The Community Fire Company of New Tripoli. On December 7<sup>th</sup>, 2022 many fire companies from around our area responded to a fire in West Penn Township. Ultimately, two firefighters, Zachary Paris and Marvin Gruber, both from New Tripoli lost their lives in the line of duty.

Thank You to everyone for your continued efforts of fundraising and your support of the church. The 2nd phase of the roof project was completed in December. Included in this newsletter is a Capital Campaign envelope to help with the cost of this project. Thank You in advance for your monetary support of this project.




