

St. Peter's Church Mission Statement

Dear Members:

There will be a Congregational Meeting on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>August 7th</u> to discuss and vote on moving forward with the repair of the church roof(s). Over the past several years, there has been leakage, shingles blown off and general degradation of the roof structure. Before more damage (both inside and outside) occurs, the Board is recommending replacement of the following roof structures:

Main Sanctuary Roof

2005 Addition Roof (including the low slope area between the Sunday School and Sanctuary

Three porch roofs including the main entrance, roof to parking lot at bell tower and roof to the parking lot on the side street.

In 2021, the Board explored pricing and material for this endeavor. Several contractors were contacted but only one actually came out to "bid" the job. Since that time, we have been attempting to obtain other bids for the job with no success. Earlier this year, we renewed our efforts to obtain bids from several contractors. The original contractor that provided a bid in 2021 did not respond to our request. The only contractor that would bid the job was W.S. & Sons Construction. Justin (who has taken over for his dad who has retired) and his family have worked on many structures in our community – mostly barn roofs and commercial buildings. Given the current environment where it is difficult if not impossible to obtain multiple bids from multiple contractors, the Board feels that we should move forward with the bide from W.S. & Sons construction.

The recommendation from the contractor and the Board is to replace the roof with a standing seem metal roof. We believe that given the height and pitches of the most of our roofs, this is the best investment.

Currently, St. Peters has enough funds to coverage at least 75% of the cost of this project. We feel confident that our continued fundraising activities and capital contributions would allow the church to comfortably cover the cost of this project without the need to take a loan. With God's guidance and your continued generosity, we feel that this is the time to take action before more structural damage occurs.

Please consider attending services on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>August 7th</u> as we discuss and vote on this important project. More detailed information will be available at that time and the Board will entertain and respond to all questions from the congregation. In the meantime, please give this matter your prayerful consideration and, if possible, consider contributing to this important project for St. Peter's Church.

"Jesus said: 'I am the light of the world, whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life.'" ~John 8:12

On my recent trip to New Paris, I traveled to western PA and had to drive through four tunnels: Lehigh, Blue Mountain, Tuscarora, and Kittatinny. I'm used to driving through the Lehigh Tunnel when I travel to Allentown, and I'm never thrilled about it but it's the quickest way to get there. I wouldn't call myself claustrophobic, but tunnels just make me uncomfortable and so driving through four of them (to and from my destination) was not my favorite part of the trip.

There is insight to be gained from every situation so I thought I might try to understand my uneasiness about these tunnels. I realized that when I'm driving along in the daylight and a tunnel is up ahead, I know that I am going to be plunged into a dark, enclosed place that seems to have no end. I tend to slow down because it feels unfamiliar; the other cars go whizzing by and I wonder how they are so unaffected by this sudden dark, tomb-like place. But I keep going, because...well, I certainly don't want to cause an accident! I also know there is an end. I know this tunnel is taking me through a mountain that I can't simply go around. I know I need to get to the other side and when I begin to see the opening up ahead and the light beginning to peek in, I start to relax and feel relief.

It is very similar, I believe, to the many challenges we face in life. We are driving along happy and content and then, suddenly, we become immersed in a darkness for which we are unprepared, even if there was a signpost that told us what was up ahead. We still get that feeling of uneasiness or even dread; we think there may not be an end and we start to slow down while everyone else is whizzing by us. Life is like that, but if we are believers in God, we know there is always a light at the end of all our tunnels and dark places. We know we can't go around them and we must go through them. And...it's okay to slow down and take it easy, it's okay to feel uneasy and even a little scared—we are human, and we don't necessarily like dark places. But with God, the dark places don't last, there is always an end, there is always light up ahead.

Jesus pronounced that he was (and is) the light of the world. He also said that we are children of the light and that we are not to hide our light but share it with others. We don't have to be afraid of the tunnels—there is light at the end. And

when we see someone slowing down, instead of whizzing by them in a great big hurry, maybe we could slow down to their speed, share our light, come alongside them—travel through the tunnel together and rejoice with them when we get to the other side and experience the light and life that Jesus promised!





THE CHURCH IS NOT A BUILDING

(1 Timothy 5)

When the word "church" comes up in conversation, the first thing we think of is a building. We have this mindset that church is a place we go to on Sundays. As we get our family dressed, fight through traffic and get a good seat, it's easy to lose sight of the fact that we aren't just going to church; we are the church.

In <u>1 Timothy 5</u>, Paul describes the church as people dedicated to doing whatever it takes to reach out and help others. We have a responsibility to serve and help others in need as the church. Caring for each other as well as those outside of the church is the quickest way to see Jesus change lives. Too often, we see a need and wait for the pastor or someone on staff to take responsibility. But that's not the way church works.

Each of us has been given skills, abilities and opportunities to serve. In Timothy's church, for example, the women ran a widows ministry (1 Timothy 5:16), and elders directed church affairs while others were devoted just to teaching and preaching (1 Timothy 5:17).

In the Bible, church is always a reference to people, not a place. The church is a body of believers that live out the Gospel in their words and actions. The church is at its best when people inside the building take Jesus' message outside the building and serve those they meet.
