

Can you give Jesus forty days? Lent is a forty-day astor's journey to prepare us for Holy Week, the last week of Jesus' life here on earth. Good Eriday is a sacred, some Jesus' life here on earth. Good Friday is a sacred, somber day where we recall the suffering Jesus endured for us and then on Easter Sunday, we celebrate his resurrection from the tomb. The time leading up to Easter is an im-

portant time that shouldn't be ignored; it's an invitation for us to walk with Jesus for forty days and give back to him for all that he gave for us and continues to give.

Can you give him some soul-searching, prayer, fasting and charity toward others? These practices help us to be closer to God and to one another; they help us to improve ourselves and our lives, so why wouldn't we put in some effort?

Soul-searching, self-reflection or self-examination...whatever you want to call it, is simply taking an honest look at yourself, admitting you've got some work to do and then committing to doing it.

Praying...we could all use more prayer in our lives. Prayer isn't simply using the right words to talk to God—it's quieting your mind and heart to LISTEN to God and giving God your time and attention. God wants to have a relationship with you!

Fasting is "giving up" something to make room for something else. If you give up candy or your coffee at the drive-thru (take some from home instead) you can use the money you saved to give to a charity. If you give up some screen time on your phone, you can use that time to pray or to the read the bible.

Give to those in need—find a charity to which you feel connected and give. If you know of someone struggling financially, leave a gift card at their door anonymously or take them some groceries...so many people are struggling right now.

Lent is a time to recall Jesus' life and death so that we can truly celebrate his resurrection on Easter Sunday. Give him these forty days and may they inspire you to give him every day of your life!

And, we utilize electricity all year long. Would you please consider making a contribution, in addition to your regular offering, to help us defray the cost of heating fuel and electricity.


In 2019 it cost approximately \$12,000.00 for heat and electricity.

INDOOR WORSHIP GUIDELINES for COVID19

For the health and safety of everyone, social distancing will be practiced in the sanctuary. Seating will be available in every other pew. Family members may sit together, but please allow six feet between other members and other families. Ushers will be available to assist with seating. Overflow seating will be available in the social hall, if needed.

Masks (worn correctly—covering both mouth and nose) are required at all times while in the church building. There will be no congregational singing at this time, but special music will continue to be offered. Offering envelopes may be placed in the plates at the entrances to the sanctuary. Holy Communion will continue to be celebrated on the first Sunday of the month. All who wish to participate are asked to bring their own bread (individually packaged wafers are available, if needed) and wine/juice will be safely distributed by the ushers.

Following the service, the ushers will dismiss the congregation. While we understand and appreciate that everyone wants to fellowship with their church family and friends, we are asking that members not gather in the building following worship. If you would like to engage in conversation with others, please do so outside of the building.

Attendance will be taken every Sunday; if someone tests positive for Covid19, all those present will be notified and in-door worship will be cancelled for two weeks. These procedures are in place to protect everyone, especially those considered more vulnerable to contract the virus. If you are feeling sick, please DO NOT attend in-person worship. If you become sick and test positive for Covid19, please contact the church office or the pastor immediately so protective measures can be put into place.

The Church Board appreciates your prayers, support, and patience as we resume indoor worship. We will continue to review the observance of the guidelines and adjust procedures as needed. As always, if you have any questions, concerns or suggestions regarding the guidelines, please do not hesitate to contact the Pastor or a Board member.
