In the dictionary the word *gratitude* is listed as both a noun and an adjective. As a noun the definition reads: "a feeling of thankfulness and appreciation". As a noun: "the state of being grateful; warm and friendly feeling toward a benefactor; kindness awakened by a favor received; thankfulness".

So, in other words, gratitude is a feeling, and/or a particular state we find ourselves in. I like the one that describes it as a "kindness awakened". Kindness can be a quality, or it can be a kind act. All of these are accurate definitions, but in my opinion, they still do not describe, in depth, what gratitude really is.

I think that gratitude can also be a verb...an action word...like love. Love is a feeling, but it is also what we DO...we love. Gratitude should not stop at a feeling...it should awaken a feeling that leads to action. A grateful heart wants to DO something in response to the feeling it has.

Thanksgiving Day will be upon us in no time, and it should not be just one day...it should be a feeling that we possess all throughout the year: a feeling of giving thanks for all that God provides...a feeling that inspires us to DO something. To give back, to pay it forward...whatever you name it when you are called to respond to that gratitude overflowing in your heart for the blessings you have been given.

Make it a gratitude month—and by gratitude, I mean the verb...the action word. Name your blessings, feel that feeling of thankfulness and appreciation and then respond in kind, thoughtful and loving ways. If you appreciate someone, tell them. If you are thrilled about something you have received, share that something with others. If you have joy in your life, do something that will bring joy to others. Act out your gratitude...live it every day and it will multiply like the loaves and the fish that Jesus shared with a hungry crowd.

May the days and weeks ahead be filled with much thanks and much giving!

WASP usually meets in the fellowship hall the third Tuesday of every month, unless a special event is planned. All women are invited to join them.




