



Fall is my favorite time of year. I love when the leaves begin to change, and the landscape reflects the artistry of God's magnificent creation. I love the pumpkins, gourds, mums, fall festivals, the seasonal foods and drinks, the cooler weather—pulling the sweaters and the boots out of the closet, journeying on the walking trails to see the changes in action as the leaves are scattered on the path before me. I really enjoy the way that nature teaches us about change—not just the changing seasons on the calendar but the changing seasons of our lives.

Change IS a guarantee of life. As much as some of us would like things to stay the same because we are safe and secure in our “comfort zones” life does not work that way. I think the concept of change has hit all of us extremely hard this year...everything has changed—our world has completely turned upside down. And in this brand-new season for which we were not prepared, we are being reminded of that one guarantee of life: change.

As the season of Fall reminds us: change does not have to be a bad thing; in fact, I know this from personal experience (my own and others) that change equals growth. Do we think that when we reach a certain age we stop growing? Sure, we stop growing physically but why would we want to stop growing emotionally and spiritually? And change (whether we like it or not) forces us to grow.

Can you resist change? Of course, you can—you are the master of your own attitude and actions. But what will that resistance cost you? Bruce Lee once said:

“Notice that the stiffest tree is most easily cracked, while the bamboo or willow survives by bending with the wind.”

Resistance often damages us in ways we might not even realize; it can place cracks in us and leave us in need of repair. But bending with the wind helps us to survive: physically, emotionally and spiritually. We need to remember that God is in charge; God is the Master of the Universe and God uses all kinds of changes in our lives and in our world to help us grow. If you are resisting change, are you also resisting what God is trying to do in your

life? God's Spirit blows through our lives like the wind; let's not be so resistant to the changes to which God has in store for us that we crack, but rather let's bend a little and see what great things God will do!






Nov Special Events

CHURCH BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

From Board Meeting of -- October 25th~

Mike Hunsicker reported that he only received 1 quote so far for replacing the roof over the sanctuary and that it probably won't take place until Spring. However, it was noted that there are 2 shingles that need replacing now. He stated that he will donate the labor for this project but he will need to rent a lift in order to do the work. This was approved by the Board.

Mike also stated that Emery Brothers agreed to meet with him sometime after Easter in order to obtain a list of repairs and the costs involved for the organ.

It was noted that volunteers are needed in order to learn the sound and video aspects of streaming the services. If interested, please contact Pastor Ginny, Justin Imbody or call the church office.

The Board has hired Carol Steigerwalt as our new Director of Music.

It was reported that the Blood Mobile held at the church in September resulted in 24 pints collected. Thank you to everyone who participated.

A motion was made and approved to recommend the benevolence goal for 2021 at \$15,000.00 or \$7,500.00 to each denomination.

Since we will still be under Covid guidelines in December, it was determined that in order to meet these guidelines, signup times for the Christmas Eve services is necessary. A form is to be included in the newsletter, available online, and available at each entrance to the sanctuary in order to fill out preferences. Paper forms can be mailed to the church or put in the collection plates on Sunday.

The next meeting of the Church Board will be held on Sunday, November 15th at 10:30 AM.




The next meeting of the Women's Association of St. Peter's is scheduled on **Tuesday, November 17th** at 7:00 PM.

- 6) On an old man's shirt was written: "I am not 80 years old, I am Sweet 16 with 64 years of experience." That is **ATTITUDE**.



Due to the current COVID restrictions, we will be unable to hold our annual basket raffle. However, keep an eye on our Facebook page for a special raffle that we will be holding.





INDOOR WORSHIP SERVICE GUIDELINES

The Church Board would like to thank everyone for taking time to complete the COVID -19 survey. The congregation's input is appreciated and helpful in planning ongoing worship services. The Board has reviewed the responses and the current recommendations from both the PNEC and NEPA Synod.

The worship services will be streamed live via Facebook at 9:00 a.m. for those who do not feel comfortable worshiping in person.

In an effort to continue to keep everyone healthy and safe, social distancing will be practiced in the sanctuary. Seating will be available in every other pew. As was the practice outdoors, family members are encouraged to sit together and allow six feet between other members/families. Ushers will be available to assist with seating. Overflow seating will be available in the social hall, if needed.

Additionally, masks will be required at all times while in the church building. We will continue to have special music, but there will not be congregational singing at this time. Members may place their offering in the plates at the entrances to the sanctuary rather than passing the offering plates. Holy Communion will be celebrated on the first Sunday of the month following the same practice as was utilized during the outdoor worship services. Members are asked to bring their own bread (individually packaged wafers are available, if needed) and wine/juice will be distributed by the ushers.

Following the service, the ushers will dismiss the congregation. While we understand and appreciate that everyone wants to fellowship with their church family and friends, we are asking that members not gather in the building following worship. Social distancing following the service was a specific area of concern listed in several of the survey responses. Hopefully, this practice will help everyone feel more comfortable attending indoor worship.

The Church Board appreciates your prayers, support and patience as we resume indoor worship. We will continue to review the procedures and make adjustments as needed. As always, if you have any concerns or suggestions, please discuss them with a Board member.


