

Deb, unfortunately, does not have health insurance and will struggle to recoup costs associated with this emergency. Deb's medical status has left all financial burdens on her daughter, Marlena. Marlena is graduating from high school this year and is not in a place to take on the financial obligations of a two-person household. The family appreciates your support and ongoing well-wishes and prayers for Deb's recovery.

ST. PETER'S | FUNDRAISING FOR BUILDING EXPENSES

• Our Current account Balance: \$97,000.00

Due to numerous volunteers working hard and the generous supporters of fund raisers for St. Peter's building fund, there is currently \$92,000 available to support the new roof needed for our Church building. When the expansion/accessibility mortgage was paid off in 2013, the fundraisers continued as a way to prepare for future building and property expenses. In 2016, \$91,000 was paid from this account for the paving project.

Miscellaneous projects were accomplished in recent years such as air conditioning and painting of the social hall; new windows in the Sunday School wing; the purchase of a new convection oven to bake thousands of apple dumplings; touchless faucets; soap dispensers, & hand sanitizers were added throughout the building; and monies were forwarded to support the Discretionary Fund. The teamwork demonstrated to make all these projects happen is amazing. Nice work team!


Summer has gone by quickly, but we are very excited to get back to Preschool!

Summary from the Congregational Meeting held on Sunday, August 7, 2022

A Congregational Meeting was held on Sunday, August 7, 2022 for the purpose of voting for the replacement of the church roofs:

- Main Sanctuary Roof
- 2005 Addition Roof
- 1979 Sunday School Addition (including low slope roof between the Church and the Sunday School)
- The three porch roofs

A bid was received from W. S. and Sons Construction to remove existing shingles, install synthetic underlayment, and install 24 Gauge Standing Seam w/striations 19.5" wide for the amount of \$149,400.00. The vote passed with a unanimous vote in favor of the project.




Couples Retreat
