



# Welcome back to Preschool! By: Barbara Nametko



I still pray for all those who might be tempted to think that violence accomplishes anything of lasting value. We've seen too much of it in the recent years.


Lastly, I still pray for every peace lover in this world.

#### CONTRIBUTTIONS REQUESTED FOR THE ORGAN FUND

On Sunday, July 21, the congregation of St. Peter's Church voted 64 to 4 to purchase an electronic organ from the Allen Organ Co. to replace our aging pipe organ at the cost of \$71,005. The Church Board has said that while we have put a down payment on the organ, we will not go ahead to fully purchase and commence installing it until we have raised the money to pay for it. Through some memorial funds and through the generosity of the Kitchen Crew, we already have about \$26,000 committed, which is a great start.

To help raise the rest of the funds, the Church will be "selling" organ keys and stops, which you can buy in honor or in memory of loved ones. Pastor Cliff has issued a "challenge" that if anyone or a group of individuals will contribute \$500 or more to the organ fund, he will give a sermon bag to the contributor(s) which they will return the next week. On that Sunday he will give a sermon (not a "children's sermon) based on whatever is in the bag. Please note: the same rules apply – nothing alive shall be placed in the bag.

Members and friends may also contribute simply by placing their gift in a plain envelope marked for the organ fund with your name and envelope number written on the envelope.

Could we raise \$71,005 for the new organ by Christmas? What a wonderful gift this would be for our church to be able to have the organ paid by the end of the year with the potential of having it installed for use by **April 20, 2025,** which is Easter.
