

CONFIRMATION SUNDAY





Parker was in an ATV accident that required him initially to be life flighted to Lehigh Valley Cedar Crest Hospital. Due to the severity of his spinal cord injury he needed to be life flighted again, this time to CHOP in Philadelphia. He required surgery at the beginning of May for a trach to be placed. After he is discharged from CHOP he will be transferred to Shreiner's Rehab in Philadelphia for extensive Physical Therapy. In order to tend to his needs and be by his side through this very scary situation, Parker's family has not been able to work. This collection will be used to help offset the costs they have acquired for travel, lodging, food and medical expenses. 


