
# Retirees

# Cliff's Notes

Jesus said: If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. (Matthew 16: 24)

Henri Nouwen wrote in his book, "Bread for the Journey": Each of us has a cross to carry. There is no need to make one or look for one. The cross we have is

hard enough for us! But are we willing to take it up to accept it as our cross?

Maybe we can't study, maybe we are handicapped, maybe we suffer from depression, maybe we experience conflict in our families, maybe we are victims of violence or abuse. We did not choose any of it, but these things are our crosses. We can ignore them, reject them, refuse them or hate them. But we can also take up these crosses and follow Jesus with them.

Nouwen reminds me that we are all unique individuals. Each of us have our own histories, our own challenges, our own crosses to bear. Yet, if we actually accept these challenges, as hard as that may be, we take a giant step in equipping ourselves to follow Jesus and serve others in his spirit. But taking that step is often hard opening ourselves up to feeling inferior or filled with shame. Yet this has never been the message of Christ. Doesn't God fully understand who we are and what we can do? Yet I think that too often we sell ourselves short, thinking that we could never do anything, thereby dismissing the God-Given gifts that our Creator has blessed us with.

Many are afraid to try anything new fearing that they will fail. I can promise you that whenever we try anything new, we will make mistakes.... But that is part of the process. That is part of learning. We learn from our errors. The God I know and trust in never penalizes us for making mistakes. For the One who is shown to us in the words and deeds of Jesus is one who challenges us to learn from our mistakes and to keep trying so we can be the best that we can be.

It would be easy for me to tell you all of the things I am not good at. For example, I am very uncoordinated and am a real detriment to any sport I engage in. But does that make me unworthy of God's Love? Of course not! I was not created to play professional sports, but I believe I am good at helping others. Have I made mistakes in ministry? You bet! Am I a failure? Not in God's eyes.

We are the same way. We are to strive to serve God as best we can. Doing things with a sense of joy and purpose. Thus, instead of putting ourselves down, let us accept our crosses. Find healing because of them and then use the wisdom that we have learned to help others.


#### Senior Recognition Updates:

June's Joyous Noise totaled \$727.14 and was designated for Parker Brode. Parker was in an ATV accident that required him initially to be life flighted to Lehigh Valley Cedar Crest Hospital. Due to the severity of his spinal cord injury he needed to be life flighted again, this time to CHOP in Philadelphia. He required surgery at the beginning of May for a trach to be placed. After he is discharged from CHOP he will be transferred to Shreiner's Rehab in Philadelphia for extensive Physical Therapy. In order to tend to his needs and be by his side through this very scary situation, Parker's family has not been able to work. This collection will be used to help offset the costs they have acquired for travel, lodging, food and medical expenses.


