# Retirees



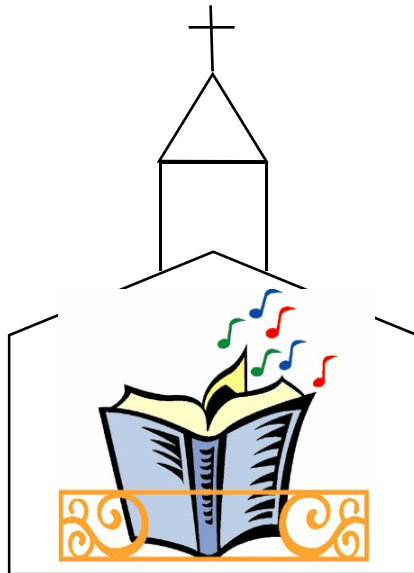

## Faith Doesn't Take a Vacation

As the summer months begin to roll in, they truly have a way of changing everything. Schedules begin to loosen. Alarms get turned off a little easier. Weekends begin to fill up with trips, cookouts, and time away. And before we even realize it, the rhythms of life that usually ground us such as church, our prayer life, time in the Scripture, can quietly drift to the margins. You see, these things happen not because we do not care, but rather because life just kind of shifts. Here is the gentle but important truth about our summers: **Faith doesn't take a vacation even when we do.**

We serve a God who does not take a step back when the weather gets nicer. Who doesn't take it easier when summer is here. His presence does not fade when our routines do. In fact, if we allow Him to, summer becomes one of the most powerful seasons to experience Him. To see creation, to worship Him in a new, fresh, unexpected way. To travel and see the beauty God has given us to behold. The bottom-line question is not whether God is present. The question becomes to us **will we make space to notice Him?** So, in typical fashion, here are 3 key takeaways for us throughout these summer months to focus on and to allow our faith to continue to grow this summer:

### #1. Stay Connected, Even When You're Away.

If you are traveling out of town, attending a gathering, or simply cannot make it to church, do not disconnect spiritually. You can join us online when you can. You can take 10 minutes with Scripture before the craziness of the begins. Take time to pray while you are out walking, sitting by the water, or taking in a beautiful sunset. Our faith isn't about perfection; no, it is about connection. Find a simple, consistent moment that you are able to spend with God, allowing Him to anchor your day and enhance the time we spend away. Be connected even in distance

### #2. See God in the Everyday Moments.

Summer is beautiful because of the fullness of moments that point us to the creator. In the stillness of an early morning, the laughter of friends and family, to the beauty of creation all around you. **Do not rush past these moments . . . receive them . . . enjoy them . . . see God in them.** Let each moments remind you that God is near, God is good, God is at work. Worship is not just on a Sunday morning in a sanctuary. Some of the most powerful moments of worship happen from a lawn chair or a beach chair with a grateful heart before our God.



### #3. Choose Intention Over Drift

No one plans to drift spiritually, but sometimes it just happens when we stop being intentional. We then feel like we need to make big promises to God to stop the drift but when we fail those, we keep feeling like we are too far gone. Instead, make a simple plan for this summer: Pick a short book of the Bible to read this summer. Set a realistic rhythm to your days (not an overwhelming one) Stay engaged with your church family, even if your attendance looks different You don't need to do everything, but doing something matters.

### Don't Miss This Season

It's easy to treat summer like a "pause button" on faith. What if this summer thought became a season of renewal instead of retreat? What if God met you not just in the big, scheduled moments, but also in the quiet, ordinary ones? Wherever this summer takes you, near or far, God is already there. So don't check out. Lean in. Because the truth is simple and powerful: faith doesn't take a vacation...and neither does God's grace.

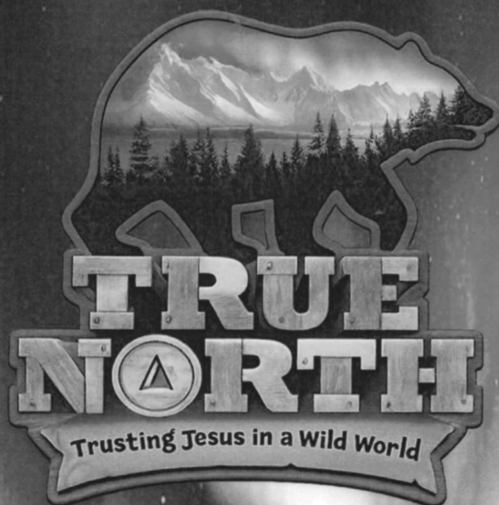

With your donation, you can make sure local children, families, and individuals have the warm winter essentials they need during the colder months. Your donations help to purchase and distribute hats, gloves, scarves, socks, hand and foot warmers, winter coats, snow pants, and boots through the Giving Tree locations at Depot Square Park and the Tamaqua Public Library. Because of the incredible generosity of people like you, more than 400 children stayed warm last winter. Over 3000 items are stocked to both locations. This year, Safer Streets is hoping to reach even more neighbors as the need for winter clothing and cold-weather gear continues to grow. Every dollar given goes directly toward helping members of our community stay warm, safe, and comfortable all winter long.*

This collection will be used at the discretion of Kerrie and John to help them and their two daughters get through these challenging times as they rebuild what they lost.*

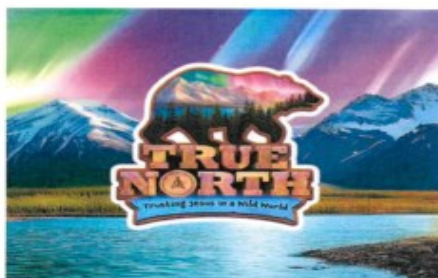

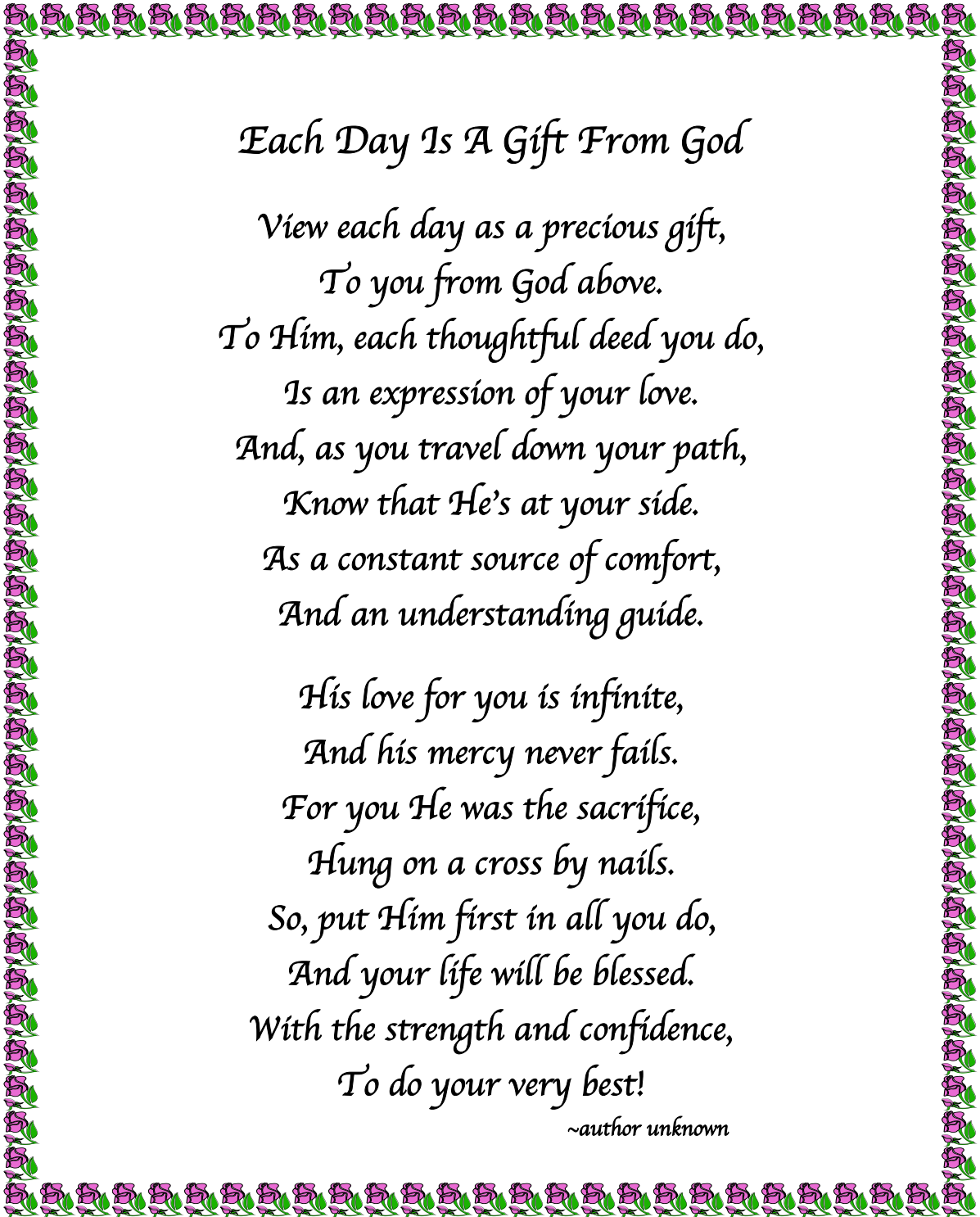
