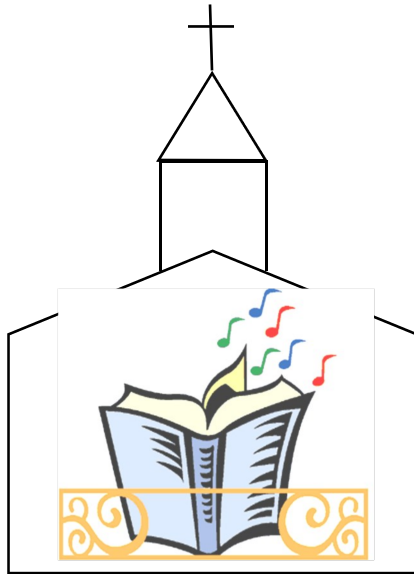

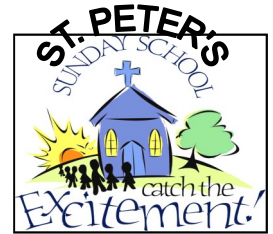

He enjoys playing soccer and with his sister, and all things Disney®

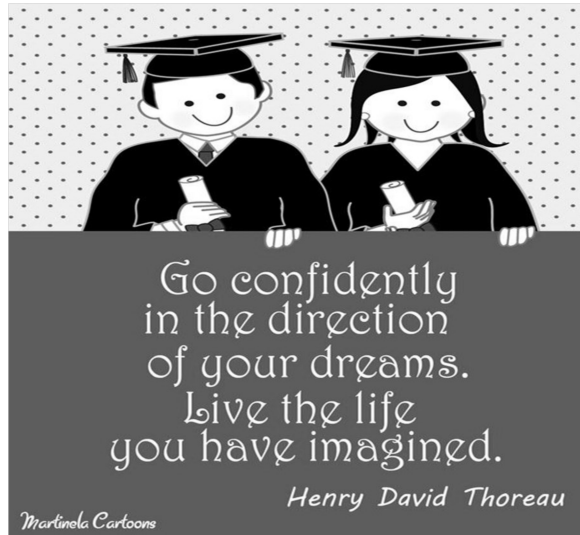
