SUMMER MUSIC INSTITUTE

A WEEK OF MUSICAL POTPOURRI

If you have never attended the Summer Music Institute, boy are you missing out! A week of idea sharing with colleagues is a great way to prepare for the upcoming school year. Give up one of the last weeks of summer vacation to spend it in a workshop? I know how that sounds, but it is totally worth it!

Our week consisted of 7 half day workshops and one final session showcasing all that we had done during the week. Kim Roberts presented 'A Little Bit of Everything!'. Singing games, folk dances and assessments were the focus of the first morning. The afternoon consisted of a 'Part 2' to Noemi Perez-Silva's 'Music and Science' workshop presented this past spring. The book/CD Science Songs and Stories for the Big Question would be a valuable resource to add to any music teacher's library. Frank Hannaway gave us instruction on guitar methods on the second day. His reproducible chord charts





were quite helpful and the content of his website a handy tool. Two of his guitar students from Macfarlane Park performed for us and they were amazing! To "Glee" or not to "Glee" was the question Ernesta Chiklowski posed to us. She provided simple ways to 'Razzle 'em and Dazzle 'em' with show choir style choreography. We even created our own choreography to song 'mash ups' (two songs 'mashed' together) and performed for each other! Matt Stone had us up and dancing early on day three. We learned dances for both intermediate and primary students from many different cultures. Wrapping up day three was Cliff Fouts and his session on using a SMART board in the music classroom. We created lessons using the SMART board and learned where to find additional lessons posted by other teachers. Our fourth and final day began with an idea exchange. Each of the participants presented a short, favorite lesson. So many great ideas were shared! The end of the workshop was a music and art showcase. This showcase gave the art teachers a chance to see what we had been up to all week, and vice versa. We taught the art teachers some of our songs and dances, and they displayed their amazing art projects for us.

The Summer Music Institute was a fun-filled week of song, dance and music making. We are lucky to have such wonderful teachers in our district who are willing to share their tips and tricks with everyone. What a fantastic way to kick off a new school year!
