

### Why the **pathway** is important for player development:

## Important Pathway tools:

Download the "NetGen" app and connect with your coach!  
Your coach can move you to your appropriate ball color!



## Playtracker points:

A player must collect a certain amount of each type to move to the next ball color.

**Play points:** (participation) points awarded for playing in a USTA event!



**Win points:** (results) points awarded for winning a match!

(100pts. for singles win, 50pts. for doubles win)



## USTA age recommendations:

Players aged 5-7 years old are recommended to play in red ball programs.

Players aged 7-9 years old are recommended to play in orange ball programs.

Players aged 9-11 years old are recommended to play in green ball programs.

**Note:** players can earn a maximum of 500 play tracker points per event or Junior Team Tennis season (100 play points / 400 win points)



### RED to ORANGE:



Players need **1,000 RED BALL** play points to advance to **ORANGE BALL**

OR turn 7 years old

\*10 red ball events\*

Play Points, to advance to **orange** ball, are earned by registering for "[Team challenges](#)"

Your coach can also move you to **orange** ball if they think you are ready!

### ORANGE to GREEN:



Players need **1,000 ORANGE BALL** play points to advance to **GREEN BALL**

OR turn 9 years old

\*10 orange ball events\*

Play Points, to advance to **green** ball, are earned by registering for "[Junior Circuits](#)" & "[Junior Team Tennis](#)" events.

Your coach can also move you to **green** ball if they think you are ready!

### GREEN to YELLOW:



Players need **1,500 GREEN BALL** play & win points to advance to **YELLOW BALL** OR turn 11 years old.

Play Points (Max: 500 pts.) & Win points (Required: 1,000 pts.) are needed for a player (under 11 years old) to advance to the yellow ball division.

Play Points are earned by registering for "[Junior Circuits](#)" & "[Junior Team Tennis](#)" events.

Other opportunities include registering for "[Level 7 tournaments](#)" that include a 12U **green** division.

[USTA Junior Circuit](#) - Series of non-elimination tournaments (2 - 4 hours).

- These fun events give players the opportunity to develop their skills through level-based play while learning and demonstrating good sportsmanship.
- Players are expected to be able to serve, maintain a rally and know how to keep score plus have some competitive tennis experience.
- A single event, up to a half-day, providing a competitive environment and guaranteeing individual match play for all players.
- Play between 2 and 4 matches based on the number of players in each flight.

[USTA Junior Team Tennis](#) - Season of local team-based match play (4 - 8 weeks).

- Why wait until high school to join a tennis team? USTA Junior Team Tennis, or "JTT", brings together boys and girls, ages 5 to 18, to play singles, doubles and mixed doubles against other coed teams.
- **Parents can get involved today**, whether they're pros or if they've never picked up a racquet. They can even start a team if there isn't one nearby.
- Players will also learn that success isn't just about winning; it's about how you play the game and respond to challenges.

USTA Junior Tournaments - When a player is ready to play ranked competitive tennis (1 - 4 days).

- The structure of USTA Junior Tournaments utilizes seven levels of events, ranging from Level 7 (Intermediate) to Level 1 (National Championships) and a universal ranking system that distributes points consistently across the country. For intermediate players who are ready to earn ranking points, you can start by playing in Level 7 and Level 6 events which offer low cost of entry.
- A player should only advance to the next level if they are consistently winning more matches than they are losing.
