Mission Statement: To Promote and Develop the Growth of Tennis

The United States Tennis Association (USTA) is the national governing body for the sport of tennis and the leader in promoting and developing the sport's growth on every level in the United States, from local communities to the crown jewel of the professional game, the US Open. Its volunteers, professional staff and financial resources support a single mission: to promote and develop the growth of tennis.

The USTA is a progressive and diverse not-for-profit organization and the largest tennis organization in the world, with 17 geographical sections, more than 644,000 members, thousands of volunteers and a professional staff dedicated to growing the game.

Community Tennis

Community Tennis strives to grow the game at every level and make tennis accessible to every person at every step of the tennis pathway. Its programs support and drive much of America's tennis activity, whether a player is picking up a racquet for the first time, playing youth tennis, experiencing the game in school or college, or taking part in adult and senior tennis. To inspire the next generation of tennis players, Net Generation was launched as the official youth tennis brand of the USTA, embracing all aspects of youth play for kids ages 5 to 18, with more than 456,000 players and parents connecting to the USTA via Net Generation. Community Tennis is also helping to develop the next generation of tennis industry professionals through USTA-U, which offers resources and educational opportunities in teaching tennis, club and event management, hospitality and sports science.

The efforts of Community Tennis are made possible by the collaboration with the 17 USTA sections, thousands of dedicated volunteers and industry partners committed to growing and enhancing tennis in America. Over the past decade, these collaborations have helped enact numerous grassroots efforts, including strengthening the tennis infrastructure in public parks and schools by building and/or renovating more than 41,500 tennis courts.

Player Development

Player Development works to develop world-class American players in partnership with private-sector coaches and programs. The program is based at the USTA National Campus at Lake Nona in Orlando, Fla., and also utilizes the USTA Training Center—West in Carson, Calif., and the USTA Training Center—East in Flushing, N.Y., as well as a network of Regional Training Centers located throughout the country. Player Development strives to be the best in the world, developing and utilizing education, training and coaching resources to serve Team USA.

Professional Tennis

Professional Tennis manages all aspects of the USTA's involvement in the professional sport. The USTA owns and operates the US Open—one of the world's largest-attended annual sporting events—and launched the US Open Series, linking WTA and ATP Tour summer tournaments in North America to the US Open. In addition, the USTA owns approximately 100 Pro Circuit events nationwide and manages and selects the U.S. teams for Davis Cup, Fed Cup, the Olympics and the Paralympic Games. The USTA also oversees all operations of the USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center, the home of the US Open, in Flushing, N.Y.

Designed to operate as a true sports marketing, entertainment and media group, Professional Tennis generates—through television, sponsorship, ticket sales, merchandising and digital media—significant revenue for funding the USTA mission and works to increase the popularity of the pro game to positively affect player participation.

Diversity and Inclusion

Leveraging diversity and creating an inclusive environment is essential to achieving the USTA mission to promote and develop the growth of tennis. The USTA is committed to removing barriers and creating opportunities for all to participate in all that we do. Furthermore, the USTA strives to serve as a model for all organizations that aspire to achieve maximum growth potential by reaching out to all of America. USTA National Campus

The USTA National Campus at Lake Nona in Orlando, Fla., was built to enhance the sport at every level and to create an unparalleled playing, training, coaching and educational experience for recreational players, competitive players, coaches and spectators. The campus opened to the public at the start of 2017.

Divided into dedicated areas that focus on the complete tennis pathway—from the youngest players to recreational competitors of all ages and ability levels, and from collegians

to future pros and professional tour-level players—the USTA National Campus stretches across 64 acres. It features 100 tennis courts—three kinds of hard courts (DecoTurf, Plexicushion and Rebound Ace), two kinds of clay courts (Har Tru green clay and European Terre Davis red clay), the adidas Performance Center with six indoor courts and the Nemours Family Zone with 36-foot and 60-foot courts for youths and adults to learn and play the game. Eighty-four courts have PlaySight live streaming so players can review their performance after a practice or match, and friends and family can watch from back home. There are 26



PlaySight SmartCourts with interactive touch-screen kiosks, enabling players working with a coach to use the cutting-edge technology for analyzing their footwork or stroke technique.

More than 250,000 people visited the USTA National Campus in 2019. More than 11,000 participants took part in programs, lessons and camps, while another 22,000 played in the 130 tournaments and events held at the campus. In addition to hosting the NCAA Division I Tennis National Championships, the campus welcomed more than 400 different college teams.

USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center

The home of the US Open since 1978, the USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center in Flushing Meadows—Corona Park in Flushing, N.Y., is a public tennis facility in the largest park in Queens. The USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center covers 42 acres and has 46 tennis courts (four stadium courts, 13 tournament courts, 17 practice courts and 12 indoor courts).

More than 90 percent of the original facility was revamped

during a five-year, \$600 million transformation project that was announced in 2013, implemented in three phases and completed in 2018. The enhancements and upgrades included the building of a roof superstructure with a retractable roof over Arthur Ashe Stadium; the construction of two stadiums—a new Louis Armstrong Stadium with a retractable roof and a new Grandstand Stadium; a complete rebuild of the West Stadium Courts and Practice Pavilion; and a redesign and rebuild of the South Campus and tournament courts. The strategic transformation of the USTA



Billie Jean King National Tennis Center reshaped the look, feel and functionality of the US Open grounds, enabling the Grand Slam tournament to maintain its place at the pinnacle of sports and entertainment events for years to come.

When the USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center is not staging the US Open, it is one of the world's busiest public tennis facilities, offering tennis camps, clinics, leagues and tournaments along with Junior Development Pathway and Competitive Training Pathway programs throughout the year.

STA

USTA ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE AND ROLES



The USTA is managed by its Board of Directors, which establishes the organization's overall policies and objectives and directs the staff, which manages the organization's dayto-day operational programs, policies and procedures. The Board of Directors is chaired by the President of the USTA, and the staff is headed by the Executive Director as the Chief Executive Officer of the USTA.

The Role of the Chairman of the Board and President.

The President of the USTA is the titular head of the USTA and Chairman of the Board. The President presides at all meetings of the membership, Governance Committee and Board. The President appoints committee chairs and committee members for the committees of the USTA whose appointment is not otherwise provided for in the Constitution and in the Bylaws. The committee members appointed by the President serve at the pleasure of the President. The President is the primary public spokesperson for the USTA. The President has final recommendation and approval rights over the President's Suite at the US Open and final review and approval authority over suite and courtside boxes at the US Open. The President is responsible for the on-court awarding of US Open trophies. The President is the USTA representative on the Grand Slam Board and leads the USTA internationally—including, without limitation, appointing the USTA delegates to the International Tennis Federation's Annual General Meeting and recommending to the International Tennis Federation's President U.S. candidates for placement on committees. The President is the representative of the USTA at the Davis Cup and Fed Cup ties and has final recommendation and approval rights over the selection of Davis Cup and Fed Cup Captains.

The Role of Leadership Councils. Leadership Councils are established to facilitate communication between the Board of Directors and the committees aligned under each council heading, and to optimize council activities in support of the USTA's mission. The use of councils to assess and recommend priorities for initiatives and resources requested by committees also assists the Board of Directors in making decisions and ensures that committee proposals are broadly constructed. Each council brings together the chair of each

of the committees aligned under that council heading under the leadership of the council chair.

The Role of Committees. The fundamental role of each USTA committee is to advise, assist, work and collaborate with USTA National Staff, the USTA network and overall tennis industry through appropriate organization channels. Committees use a consultative process with staff to research suggested or directed proposals; propose, refine, review, monitor or evaluate programs and activities that are within the scope of the committee's duties; and provide timely recommendations. Committees are generally headed by a committee chair who coordinates the committee's activities and deliberations.

The Role of the Chief Executive Officer and Executive Director. The Executive Director is the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the USTA and is subject to the direction of the Board and is fully accountable to the Board. The CEO manages the day-to-day operational programs, policies and procedures of the USTA and the functioning of the office or offices of the USTA. The CEO is directly responsible for executing all Board decisions and performs additional duties as may be requested by the President or the Board. The CEO carries out the operational responsibilities of financial management and controls the budgeting process, the keeping of member records, the calculating of voting strength and the giving of notice and keeping of minutes of meetings of the USTA. The CEO is hired by and serves at the pleasure of the Board. The CEO is an ex-officio member of all committees, except the Nominating Committee. The CEO shall be directly responsible to report to the Board any violation of the rules and regulations, keep records in the form prescribed by the Board and report when requested by the Board.

The Role of the Senior Executive Staff. The senior executive staff of the USTA is appointed by and works for the Chief Executive Officer and Executive Director, and manages the staff of the USTA, which carries out the day-to-day operational programs, policies and procedures of the USTA and the functioning of the office or offices of the USTA.

Chairman and President



Patrick J. Galbraith

Patrick J. Galbraith is the Chairman of the Board and the President of the United States Tennis Association, a position he assumed in January 2019. He also serves as Chairman of the US Open.

Previously, Galbraith was First Vice President

of the USTA (2017-18). Prior to that position, he served two consecutive two-year terms (2013-16) as Secretary-Treasurer of the USTA and three consecutive two-year terms (2007-12) as a Director at Large on the USTA Board of Directors as an Elite Athlete. Galbraith has served as chair of the Budget Committee and vice chair of the Investment Committee and the Major Construction Oversight Committee, and has been a member of the Audit Committee. He also served as Treasurer of the strategic transformation of the USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center, as well as for the construction of the USTA National Campus in the Lake Nona neighborhood of Orlando, Fla. Before being on the USTA Board of Directors, Galbraith was a member of the ATP Player Council.

Galbraith grew up playing junior tennis in the Pacific Northwest Tennis Association and starred at UCLA, where he was a three-time All-American and teamed with Brian

Garrow to win the 1988 NCAA doubles championship.

Galbraith subsequently played as a professional from 1989 until 2000, rising to become the top doubles player in the world in 1993. He twice won the US Open mixed doubles championship—in 1994 with Elna Reinach and in 1996 with Lisa Raymond—and he completed the 1993 season as part of the No. 1-ranked men's doubles team with partner Grant Connell. That same year, he and Connell were named the ATP's Doubles Team of the Year, and in 1995, they combined to win the ATP Tour World Doubles Championship. In 1996, Galbraith paired with Patrick McEnroe to form the doubles team on the U.S. Davis Cup squad. Galbraith finished his career with 36 doubles titles.

After retiring from the professional tour, Galbraith went back to UCLA and earned his bachelor's degree in psychology in 2001. Since that time, he has worked for UBS Financial Services, Inc. and is currently Senior Vice President – Wealth Management. He also has attained the designation of Certified Financial Planner.

Galbraith has been involved with the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation in the Seattle area for the past 20 years. He also helped launch a grassroots tennis program in the state of Washington during his playing career. In his personal time, he enjoys playing tennis and snow skiing with his family.

Galbraith lives in Bainbridge Island, Wash., with his wife, Tammy, and two children, Ben and Annie. He is a member of the USTA Pacific Northwest Section.

Michael J. McNulty III First Vice President

Dr. Brian Hainline Vice President

Dr. Brian Hainline is serving his first two-year term as Vice President of the USTA and his third term on the USTA Board of Directors. He is vice chair of the Budget Committee.

Hainline previously was Director at Large on the USTA

He is a Fellow of the American College of Sports Medicine and the American Academy of Neurology, and is Clinical Professor of Neurology at Indiana University School of Medicine and New York University School of Medicine.

Thomas S. Ho Secretary-Treasurer

Thomas S. Ho began serving his second consecutive two-year term as Secretary-Treasurer of the USTA and his fifth two-year term on the USTA Board of Directors in January 2019. He is serving his second consecutive term as chair

of the Budget Committee and as vice chair of the Investment Committee. He is also a member of the Compensation Committee. A heralded junior player, he was named Junior Tennis Player of the Year by both *World Tennis* magazine (1988) and *Tennis* magazine (1985 and 1987). In 2011, Ho, who grew up in Winter Haven, Fla., was inducted into the Florida Tennis Hall of Fame.

Following his playing career, Ho earned a bachelor's degree in economics in 2001 from Rice University, where he was Phi Beta Kappa and served as a volunteer assistant with the tennis team. After graduation, he worked in the financial services sector for both UBS and Goldman Sachs. Currently, Ho is a partner at Heidrick & Struggles, a global executive search and leadership consulting firm, where is a member of the Global Energy and Financial Services practice. He is also the co-chair of Heidrick & Struggles' Professionals of Color Employee Resource Group for the Americas region.

He lives in Frisco, Texas, with his wife, Marcelle, and two children, Braeden and McHaley. He is a member of the USTA Texas Section and is a member of its Management Committee.

Jeffrey M. Baill

Jeffery M. Baill began serving his second consecutive two-year term as a Director at Large on the USTA Board of Directors in January 2019. He is the board liaison to the Adult Tennis Leadership Council and is a member of the Audit Committee.

Chuck Gill

Chuck Gill began serving his first two-year term as a Director at Large on the USTA Board of Directors in January 2019. He is the board liaison to the Delivery Leadership Council.

As a USTA national volunteer, Gill has been a member of both the 10 and Under Tennis Task

Force/Committee (2011-14) and the Adult Competition Committee (2015-18). Eleni Rossides

Eleni Rossides began serving her first two-year term as a Director at Large on the USTA Board of Directors in January 2019. She is currently the board liaison to the Competitive Pathway Leadership Council. Prior to joining the USTA Board, Rossides was a

member of the USTA Mid-Atlantic board of directors.

Rossides was the top-ranked junior in the USTA Mid-Atlantic Section, earning a scholarship to Stanford University, where she achieved the distinction of being the first female player to be on four consecutive National Championship tennis teams (1986-89). She became the nation's top-ranked player and earned ITA All-American honors in singles at Stanford. After graduating from college, she competed professionally until 1999, posting 138 career wins in singles and qualifying for the US Open main draw in 1985 and 1990. Rossides actually made her WTA debut as a 17-year-old high school student, when she entered the Virginia Slims of Washington, D.C., tournament and won two qualifying matches to advance to the main draw, where she faced Martina Navratilova, the world's No. 1 player.

Following her tennis career, Rossides earned an MBA from the Kellogg Graduate School of Management at Northwestern University. She worked at Johnson & Johnson,

McKinsey & Company and Black & Decker before becoming the executive director of the Washington Tennis & Education Foundation (WTEF) in 2004. Previously serving as a volunteer at the WTEF, she led the organization for 13 years, taking it from a local program to a national model and orchestrating the building of a state-of-the-art tennis, academic and community center in a low-income neighborhood. She also developed new corporate sponsorships and nationally acclaimed partnerships, most notably with Citibank, and managed the Citi Open tennis tournament. In 2018, Rossides joined Marriott International as Customer Experience and Growth Advisor to the Americas. She is charged with ensuring the voice of the consumer is kept at the center of everything: identifying, synthesizing and integrating industry trends, research, and customer data and analytics to inform key business decisions and designing and driving strategies that improve, innovate and grow the business.

Rossides, in 2009, won the EXCEL Leadership Award recognizing and honoring outstanding nonprofit leaders for excellence in the areas of innovation, motivation, community building, ethical integrity and strategic leadership, and in 2013 received a SmartCEO's Brava Award, which celebrates top female CEOs who combine their entrepreneurial spirit with a passion for giving back to the community. She was inducted into the Washington, D.C. Sports Hall of Fame in 2018.

Brian Vahaly

Brian Vahaly began serving his third two-year term as a Director at Large on the USTA Board of Directors in January 2019. He is chair of the Audit Committee. He previously served as Director at Large as an Elite Athlete in 2013-14 and 2017-18, serving as the board

liaison to the Youth Tennis Leadership Council and the Player Development Committee and as a member of the Investment Committee and the Audit Committee. After retiring from professional tennis, Vahaly went on to work at McLean Capital, a private equity fund in Washington, D.C. He later worked as the chief operating officer at the venture capital funds Venturehouse Group and NextGen Venture Partners. He currently is the chief finance and strategy officer for Solidcore.

Vahaly also has been active in community programs. In 2003, he founded the Brian Vahaly Brighter Future Foundation in Atlanta, dedicated to promoting academics and community service through tennis, and later served on the Southeast Tennis and Learning Center (SETLC) Board of Directors in Washington, D.C.

Vahaly lives in Arlington, Va., with his husband, Bill, and two children, Parker and Bennett. He is a member of the USTA Mid-Atlantic Section.



Kurt Zumwalt

Kurt Zumwalt began serving his first two-year term as a Director at Large on the USTA Board of Directors in January 2019, as well as a three-year term as a Director of the USTA Foundation and member of the Foundation's Audit committee.

Directors at Large Elite Athletes



Liezel H. Huber

Liezel H. Huber began serving her second two-year term as a Director at Large on the USTA Board of Directors as an Elite Athlete in January 2019. She is a member of the Budget Committee. She was previously the board liaison to the Pro Tennis

Leadership Council.

During her 24-year professional tennis career, Huber was the No. 1-ranked WTA doubles player for 199 weeks and year-end No. 1 women's doubles player three times. She won 53 WTA doubles titles, including three WTA Finals year-end championships, seven Grand Slam tournament women's doubles titles (three at the US Open, two at Wimbledon and one each at the Australian Open and Roland Garros) and two Grand Slam mixed doubles titles (one at the US Open and one at Roland Garros). She competed for the South African Fed Cup team between 1998 and 2003 and later played for the U.S. Fed Cup team for six consecutive years after becoming a U.S. citizen in 2007. She was a member of the U.S. Olympic team in 2008 and 2012. Huber announced her retirement from professional tennis and played her last

match at the 2017 US Open.

Huber served as a member of the WTA Player Council from 2006 to 2014. She is a USPTR certified tennis professional (P rating) and is the owner of Huber Tennis Ranch in the Houston area, as well as a health and nutrition business. She was the tennis director at the Clubs of Houston Oaks prior to moving to New York, where she currently is the Executive Tennis Director at Cary Leeds Tennis Center for the NYJTL.

Huber has dedicated substantial time to volunteer and humanitarian efforts, including the nonprofit "Liezel's Cause" (2005-12), which was founded in the wake of Hurricane Katrina; the WTA Mentor Program (2007-14); the Liezel Huber Tennis Tournament (South Africa, 2005-18); the USTA Mentoring program (2015-18); Boys and Girls Country (2009-18); and the Big Love Cancer Care Annual Tennis event (2010-18). In 2016, she hosted an annual MS150 fundraiser to help fight multiple sclerosis. Huber is the recipient of multiple player service awards, including the WTA's Humanitarian of the Year (2005, 2007).

Huber resided in Houston, Texas, for 20 years. Along with her sons, Joshua and Benjamin, she now calls the Upper East Side in New York City home. She is a member of the USTA Eastern Section.



Neha Uberoi

Neha Uberoi is a clinical mental health professional, social entrepreneur and former professional tennis player. She began serving her first two-year term as a Director at Large on the USTA Board of Directors as an Elite Athlete in January 2019. She is a member of

the Budget Committee.

Uberoi completed her freshman year at Princeton University at just 16 years of age, and during her time there, she won the Ivy League Rookie of the Year award in the spring of 2003 while earning All-American honors in singles and doubles. Also in 2003, Uberoi reached the girls' 18s title match of the prestigious Orange Bowl championship. After her year at Princeton, Uberoi played on the WTA tour for five years. She achieved a singles ranking of No. 196 and a high of No. 108 in doubles, and reached two WTA doubles finals.

Since retiring from tennis in 2008, Uberoi completed her

undergraduate degree in 2012, after a six-year leave of absence, and she has advocated for mental health through research, direct practice, coaching, public speaking and digital content. Her articles and videos have reached hundreds of thousands of people worldwide. Uberoi continues to appear on various media platforms and speaking engagements to provide commentary on sports, women's empowerment and health and wellness, notably: the BBC, *Sports Illustrated, SportsBusiness Journal*, Columbia University, The Huffington Post, Mind Body Green and Al Jazeera. Prior to her career as a mental health professional, Uberoi worked as a marketing manager and independent consultant for small businesses in a variety of sectors.

Uberoi is completing her Masters in Clinical Social Work at Columbia University (June, 2020) and is passionate about working with current and former athletes. She is the co-founder and CEO of South Asians in Sports, a non-profit organization that advocates for, educates and promotes South Asians working in sports globally.

Uberoi resides in New York City with her husband and daughter. She is a member of the USTA Eastern Section.



Sam Warburg

Sam Warburg began serving his first two-vear term as a Director at Large on the USTA Board of Directors as an Elite Athlete in January 2019. He is a member of the Investment Committee.

Warburg was a four-time All-American at Stanford University and held the No. 1 ranking in

college tennis in both singles and doubles. The team captain at Stanford during his junior and senior years, he was the Pac-10 Conference Player of the Year in 2004, when he also won the NCAA doubles championship with teammate KC Corkery.

Warburg turned pro in 2005 after graduating from Stanford and reached a career high of No. 132 in singles and No. 117 in doubles in the ATP rankings. He won six singles titles and 12 doubles crowns on the ITF/USTA Pro Circuit and posted his best Grand Slam tournament results in 2008, when he reached the second round at both the Australian Open and the US Open.

After Warburg's playing days ended in 2010, he served as Vice President, Partnerships at Silicon Valley Bank for three years before becoming one of the founding members of the Dropbox for Business sales team. He subsequently worked at Sentry and is now Sales Leader at Plaid.

Warburg resides in the San Francisco Bay Area with his wife and two daughters. He is a member of the USTA Northern California Section.

Immediate Past President



Katrina M. Adams

After serving an unprecedented two consecutive terms as USTA Chairman and President, Katrina M. Adams began serving a twoyear term as Immediate Past President in January 2019.

Adams was the first African-American, first former professional

tennis player and youngest person ever to serve as USTA President. During her administration, the USTA achieved a number of major milestones, including the opening of the USTA National Campus in Orlando, Fla., and the completion of the strategic transformation of the USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center in Flushing, N.Y. She also spearheaded an unprecedented outreach effort into underserved communities—with an emphasis on Hispanic communities—in an effort to share the sport of tennis with more people.

An accomplished professional player, Adams competed for 12 years on the WTA tour. She ranked as high as No. 67 in the world in singles and No. 8 in doubles, winning 20 doubles titles and reaching the quarterfinals or better in doubles at all four Grand Slam tournaments. Her best Grand Slam singles result was reaching the fourth round at Wimbledon in 1988. She attended and played collegiate tennis at Northwestern University, majoring in communications and helping the Wildcats to a Big Ten Conference championship in 1986. That year, she was the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) Rookie of the Year. In

1986 and 1987, Adams was named NCAA All-American. Also in 1987, she became the first African-American to win the NCAA doubles title. In 1997, she was inducted into the Northwestern University Athletic Hall of Fame.

While an active pro, Adams served on the board of directors of the WTA as a player representative for four one-year terms and on the WTA's Player Association for five two-year terms. After leaving the tour, Adams was a USTA National Tennis Coach from 1999 to 2002. She joined the USTA Board of Directors in 2005, serving as a Director at Large and as the association's Vice President and First Vice President before assuming the presidency.

Adams was elected the Vice President of the International Tennis Federation in 2015 and re-elected in 2019. She serves as Chairman of the Fed Cup Committee, 2016-present. She was named Chairman of the Gender Equality in Tennis Committee in 2018 and, in 2020, was appointed to the Finance and Audit Committee. She was also named to Adweek magazine's "Most Powerful Women in Sports" list in 2016 and 2017, and Forbes magazine's "Most Powerful Women in Sports" list in 2017. Also in 2017, Adams was named to Ebony magazine's "Power 100" list. In 2018, Adams became a member of the board of directors of Pivotal Acquisition Corp., and in 2019 joined Pivotal Acquisition Corp. II, an emerging growth company.

Since 2005, Adams has served as the Executive Director of the Harlem Junior Tennis and Education Program, based in New York City.

A Chicago native, Adams currently lives in Yonkers, N.Y.



SECTION HIGHLIGHTS

There were 4,669 players who were part of USTA Leagues in the USTA Caribbean section, and three teams achieved first place at the National Championships: Men's 3.0, 40 & over from Torrimar, Guaynabo; Men's 3.0, 18 & over from Caguas; and Mixed 6.0, 18 & over from Baldrich, San Juan.

Also during 2019, USTA Caribbean continued to target new players to join USTA Adult League. More than 200 new players participated in the two seasons of the Adult Beginners' Program, and additional play opportunities were celebrated during the year, such as "La Ñapa" for youngsters, mixed league for 55 & over players, the Tri-Level League and World TeamTennis.

Junior Team Tennis also experienced good participation as the section focused on making it the premier recreational junior program. At the National Championships, Gabriel Cavere received the Sportsmanship Award.

For youth players, the Red Ball Challenge Grand Slam

Tour continued as a successful initiative, giving 8-and-under players the chance to experience and enjoy tennis on hard, grass and clay courts. In addition, the section held the Youth Team Tennis League and one-day events for the 10- and 12-and-under categories, with the participation of 227 players.

The Mini Tennis Tour continued, with five tennis clubs offering tournaments in the following categories: 8 and under-red ball; 10 and under-orange ball; and 12 and under-green ball. The tour attracted a total of 608 participants.

With eight ranking sanctioned tournaments, juniors continue to have a competitive platform in the USTA Caribbean section. Seven teams from the section traveled and participated in USTA Zonal Events in the 12s, 14s and 16s categories; USTA Intersectional 14s and 16s; and the Boys' and Girls' 18s Team Championships.

The Tennis Service Representatives (TSRs) actively continue to impact schools, communities, public parks, and private and public schools. They also helped in assessing the

SECTION HIGHLIGHTS

In 2019, USTA Eastern remained focused on delivering quality tennis programming for players of all ages and bilities. Tennis has many great benefits; it's the goal of the USTA Eastern section to communicate those benefits in meaningful ways, as well as deliver energizing programming at every touchpoint, starting with students in school and continuing on through adulthood and retirement. The section believes there is a place in the game for everyone, and its staff works to incorporate programs and initiatives that attract new and diverse audiences. The section also believes that tennis needs to be engaging and accessible to retain the interest of new players.

To that end, in 2019, a major section priority continued to be engaging young players. USTA Eastern invested heavily in youth programming, such as Junior Team Tennis and

tennis programs in schools. The section has developed Net Generation partnerships with 272 schools, which amounts to approximately 12,240 students participating in the sport. USTA Eastern also continued to promote Team Challenges, a relatively new youth initiative. In 2020, USTA Eastern will continue to prioritize connecting school programming to community partners.

USTA Eastern also makes an effort to showcase individuals and programs that truly make a difference in increasing tennis participation. During its Annual Tennis Conference, USTA Eastern honored former USTA Eastern President Tim Heath as its Leslie J. FitzGibbon Tennis Man of the Year and former board member Roberta Feldman as its Tennis Woman of the Year. Both have contributed immeasurably to growing the sport in their area.

SECTION HIGHLIGHTS

The USTA Florida section in 2019 expanded its new Tennis Management Division, adding facilities in Fort Walton Beach and Gainesville to assist municipalities in managing public tennis facilities. An initiative to recruit new volunteers for the section and a new leadership initiative were highlights of a year that also saw a renewal of a partnership with the USPTA Florida Division to increase women in the teaching pro ranks.

In January, Fort Walton Beach celebrated the reopening of the formerly shuttered Fort Walton Beach Tennis Center with a Grand Re-Opening Festival; and in February, the Gainesville community celebrated its reopening of four tennis facilities.

Special pilot events during the year included a first-ever USTA Florida Blacklight Overnight 12-hour team tennis event, an ages 18-39 Invitational Event and new "Love to Learn" and "Love to Play" programs for beginner adult players. Family Play Days debuted across the state, introducing tennis to new participants in a format in which the "family unit" can learn the sport together, for all ages and skill levels. In May, USTA Florida and the USTA National Campus hosted more than 190 athletes playing singles and doubles for the 2019 Special Olympics Florida State Tennis Championships.

The boards of directors of USTA Florida and USPTA Florida signed their fourth consecutive two-year collaboration

agreement at their joint leadership meeting, expanding on the existing partnership and adding new growth priorities and a joint women's initiative.

Investing in the future of Florida tennis, the USTA Florida Board of Directors launched a new initiative to recruit new volunteers for the section and increase engagement of current volunteers at the local and section level. The USTA Florida Leadership Academy includes a volunteer development program designed to grow the professional skills and organizational knowledge of potential future leaders.

In September and October, USTA Florida recognized Hispanic Heritage Month by celebrating with "Tenis para Todos" events across Central and South Florida with a variety of play days, family festivals and other events to introduce tennis to people of all ages.

Also during the year, the USTA Florida Board of Directors announced the election of Dana Andrews as 2019-20 president-elect, replacing Chuck Gill, who announced his

decision to resign the office of president-elect at the group's board meeting in Austin, Texas. Andrews is the managing partner of the Kelley Kronenberg Law Firm's Tampa office and daughter of B.A. Grubbs, who served as president of the organization in 1984-85 and was inducted into the USTA Florida Hall of Fame in 1996. Andrews later in the year addressed a group of tennis volunteers and board of directors from the USPTA Florida and USTA Florida at their joint annual meeting, laying out a challenge to both organizations to commit resources for a new Pro-Women Initiative to bring more women teaching professionals and leaders into the game.

Clark Higgs, the current USTA Florida president, summed up the USTA Florida section moving into 2020: "It is great to see our strong board of directors and the fresh young faces come through our new volunteer program and leadership academy, putting their ideas to work for the benefit of the section and the game of tennis."

SECTION HIGHLIGHTS

The USTA Hawaii Pacific section achieved many accomplishments in 2019. At the top of the list was the section obtaining its IRS designation as a 501(c)(3) charitable organization. With this status, the section is now tax-exempt and able to apply for grants that support 501(c)(3) non-profits. In addition, donors to the section may receive a tax deduction for their support.

In 2019, USTA Hawaii Pacific also continued two of its premier tennis events. The popular Invesco Series Champions Cup was hosted by the Royal Lahaina Resort in May. It brought tennis legends Michael Chang, Tommy Haas, Mark

Philippoussis and Mardy Fish to the island of Maui for a twoday exhibition event. Haas successfully defended his title from the previous year, besting Fish in the final match, 6-4. Two months later, the section hosted its second Tennis Championships of Honolulu, a \$60,000 USTA Pro Circuit women's tournament. Usue Arconada, a native of Puerto Rico, clinched the victory in an hour-long match, defeating second seed Nicole Gibbs in straight sets, 6-0, 6-2.

At the end of 2019, the Hawaii Pacific section inducted local tennis icons Bruce Nagel and Dennis Lajola into the Hawaii Tennis Hall of Fame. Nagel, a lifetime tennis player,

has served as the General Manager of the Kailua Racquet Club since 1999. The club's annual Men's Night Doubles Tournament is one of Hawaii's most well-attended tennis events. Lajola made headlines at a young age through his tremendous success on the courts. He was chosen to represent the country in the 2004 Junior Davis Cup and played in the main draw of all four junior Grand Slam tournaments. He later became the first University of Hawaii player to win the

Western Athletic Conference's Player of the Year.

In 2020, the Hawaii Pacific Section is excited to bring more tennis events to the Hawaiian Islands. The Davis Cup returned to Hawaii in March for the first time since 1992, hosting Uzbekistan in a two-day Davis Cup Qualifier in Honolulu. Later in 2020, the Invesco Series Champions Cup is expected to come back for its third year to the delight of local fans.

SECTION HIGHLIGHTS

Strong leadership and a dedication to collaborative strategies launched another successful year for USTA Intermountain. Throughout 2019, USTA Intermountain celebrated the successes of its six districts (Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, Utah and Wyoming) as they collectively exceeded Dashboard goals in 11 out of 12 categories and crushed two Section Choice goals in Coaches Education and Diversity & Inclusion.

More than 600 coaches were trained throughout the year in various Net Generation workshops, junior and high school coaches trainings, junior play symposiums and adaptive play courses, to name a few.

The fourth annual USTA Intermountain Diversity Tennis-Fest week also was a huge success with all six districts participating. More than 1,250 attendees in an array of diverse audiences participated in free clinics and were provided free equipment. From bringing tennis to Native American reservations, to "Vets at the Nets," to LGBT communities, USTA Intermountain celebrated the achievements of pioneers, contributors and adaptive players embodying the message that tennis is accessible to all.

USTA Leagues and innovative social leagues continued to grow and thrive in 2019. Adult League total participation grew to more than 67,000 players (surpassing the goal of

64,500), and participation in mixed play (particularly in the 40 & Over divisions) maintained healthy increases. In 2019, five districts participated in the Adult 65 & Over League (more than 1,100 players), which culminated in a new Section Invitational that included 20 teams. All USTA Intermountain districts also now offer social leagues, which are growing exponentially.

Intermountain junior development continues to exceed expectations and has become a leader at the national level. Youth Progression (launched at the section level in 2018) saw substantial increases in 2019 (up 370 players in 10 and Under play from 2018). Junior Team Tennis offerings, including Team Challenges and Team Tournaments, grew exponentially. More than 58 Team Challenges with more than 1,400 participants were held in 2019 (up from 14 Team Challenges with 277 participants in 2018). Team Tournament numbers were also strong in the format's inaugural year.

USTA Intermountain's Tennis On Campus Sectional

Championship was held in March in Colorado Springs. Twelve unique schools participated, including first-time participants from Durango, Colo. Two schools new to the program in 2018 also brought additional teams to the championships in 2019.

On the national level, USTA Intermountain currently has 13 volunteers serving on USTA National committees, including Alden Bock, chair of the USTA League Committee. Section task forces continue to be the cornerstone of USTA Intermountain's collaborative governance approach with 100 percent completing meaningful and helpful policies, bylaws, rules and regulations, and philosophy clarifications that benefited the section.

In December, USTA Intermountain hosted its annual Awards Ceremony. Nine total organizations and individuals were recognized for outstanding service while two USTA Intermountain members, Jim Landin (originally from Greeley, Colo.) and Jim Osborne (Orem, Utah), were inducted into the Section Hall of Fame.

SECTION HIGHLIGHTS

USTA Mid-Atlantic, a 501 (c)(3) charitable non-profit, is committed to promoting tennis by offering quality recreational and competitive tennis programs for people of all ages and abilities. As an organization dedicated to both the sport and its players, USTA Mid-Atlantic aims to make tennis the most accessible sport in the region. In 2019, through an established philanthropic path forward, USTA Mid-Atlantic strove to create a physically, socially and emotionally healthier community through tennis and provided opportunities for all people to experience the valuable benefits tennis provides.

The top priority for the section is to introduce the sport to more children so they can experience the transformative power that playing tennis provides. USTA Mid-Atlantic's afterschool and summer camp tennis programs help introduce

tennis to children, many of whom are learning the sport for the first time. In 2019, the program had more than 6,000 youth registered and, since program inception in 2016, has had more than 15,000 youth registered.

Through the Safe Place to Play Grant, USTA Mid-Atlantic supports projects that refurbish and revitalize tennis courts in the Mid-Atlantic to create inviting places to play and contribute to creating healthy, active communities. USTA Mid-Atlantic awarded nearly \$30,000 in grants to two local community projects, and each project is expected to break ground in the spring of 2020.

USTA Mid-Atlantic programs and services saw strong success in 2019 as did Net Generation within the section. USTA Mid-Atlantic had more than 1,500 Net Generation tennis providers approved and 152 physical education

teachers bringing the Net Generation curriculum into their classrooms. USTA Mid-Atlantic launched new adult social tennis programming in 2019, which included Team Up, Drop-In and Adult Social Leagues engaging 1,525 new adult social participants throughout the year.

USTA Mid-Atlantic adult and junior players had success in national and regional events in 2019. There were 36 Mid-Atlantic teams that advanced to represent the section at USTA League National Championships. Two Mid-Atlantic teams took home national championship titles: Women's Adult 40 & Over 3.5, and Men's Adult 18 & Over 4.5.

Robin Montgomery, a Washington, D.C., native, won the Orange Bowl 18s, and several Mid-Atlantic Section junior players were recognized at national events for sportsmanship, including Frank Thompson (B18s National Indoors); Mid-Atlantic Team B, lead by Coach Brian Flieshman (BG16s Zonals Competition); Ayana Akli (G18s National Clay Courts) and Anusha Iyer (G14s National Hard Courts). Mid-Atlantic Junior Team Tennis teams excelled on the national level as well; Mid-Atlantic 18s Intermediate were finalists and 14s placed third at the USTA Junior Team Tennis National Championships. The USTA Mid-Atlantic College Showcase was tremendously successful this year, helping juniors and seniors in high school find their tennis path in college, with more than 50 collegiate coaches and 200 attendees at the event.

The section proudly earned the CARE Award from the Northern Virginia Family Service for a fourth consecutive year in 2019, recognizing the deep commitment to employees and to giving back and strengthening local communities. In addition, USTA Mid-Atlantic was recognized as a Best Non-Profit to Work For in 2019 by *The NonProfit Times*, and the section earned the Guide Star Gold Seal of approval for charitable organizations.

SECTION HIGHLIGHTS

Through 2019, USTA Middle States impacted the game in new ways, as the section focused on growing and improving tennis opportunities from the grassroots all the way to the professional levels.

The impact on tennis in schools was a highlight of the year, as USTA Middle States coordinated trainings and tennis in physical education classes, while organizing frequent after-school programming. The Middle States Rally Stars out-of-school program had approximately 50 organizations participating, along with nearly 1,000 participants using the Net Generation community curriculum. These programs have connected with community partners and are running Team Challenges at the conclusion of the season, to give kids an introduction to competition.

On the competition side, USTA Middle States experienced

growth in Junior Team Tennis, USTA League and Tennis On Campus, among other programs. Much of this came down to a focus on the section's relationship with all six of its districts and the many volunteers who help move the organization forward. In the adult competition space, USTA Middle States has more than 3.000 players competing in Social Leagues, while adult tournament participation is rising with the introduction of new, creative events. In USTA League tennis, two Middle States teams claimed national championships.

Meanwhile, Middle States players and participants from every situation and background were involved with the game. Special Olympics Team USA Head Coach Mary Moore, from Delaware, traveled with the national team to the World Games and used Delaware as a local training

grounds for the team. In addition, USTA Middle States board member and teaching professional Nancy Wilkins ran countless adaptive programs and served on the USTA National Committee. Finally, multiple Middle States players represented the section at wheelchair events, including two players attending the Wounded Warrior Tennis Camp in San Diego.

Meanwhile, our section has been active in other ways in the wheelchair tennis space, as USTA Middle States ran a Wheelchair Tennis Training in February, and also has a great wheelchair tournament in Delaware each September.

As a section, USTA Middle States is working closely with its facilities and partner organizations. A major highlight is Middle States expanding its grant initiative with the creation of Building A Tennis Community. With innovative section funding, USTA Middle States also provided an additional \$70,000 in community grants to providers, as well as \$50,000 toward the Build It Forward facility program.

Professional tennis ties and results were strong again in 2019. Professional players who grew up in the section (Alison Riske, Ann Li and Madison Brengle, etc.) had years to remember. On the event side, USTA Middle States hosts three USTA Pro Circuit events, including the Koser Jewelers Tennis Challenge—one of the most popular USTA Pro Circuit events in the country. The event was featured on the front cover of TIA Magazine for its community impact and importance.

The Philadelphia Freedoms of World TeamTennis, meanwhile, had a great season, with players and coaches winning national WTT awards.

Finally, Middle States hosted its Hall of Fame event, which takes place every two years. The inductees included Dan Faber, Ann LoPrinzi, Virgil Christian and Shari Bucklin-Webber. This is a group that not only has grown tennis in Middle States, but also has had a significant impact on the game across the country.

SECTION HIGHLIGHTS

Western & Southern Open

Wheelchair/Adaptive Day. Adaptive Standing Tennis made its match debut at the 2019 Western & Southern Open in a fully umpired exhibition match. The match featured two of the country's best Standing Adaptive players: Carl Mower from Carmel, Ind., and Danny Scrivano from Shelby Twp., Mich. After the singles match, Mower and Scrivano teamed up with Greg Boyd from the USTA Midwest section and Brian Dean from Tipp City, Ohio, to play mixed doubles.

The tournament also welcomed three Adaptive Tennis showcases on five courts. Beginning with the Adaptive Standing clinic, Scrivano and Mower were joined by Troy Lawrence, from Muncie, Ind., and Thalita Rodriguez, from Brazil and an NCAA Division I player from Toledo University in Ohio, to showcase their doubles game. Fun games, drills and coaching were offered by Suzie Booker of Carmel, Ind.

In addition to the Adaptive Standing clinic, Special Olympics-Ohio (SO-Ohio) brought 11 adaptive players with

cognitive/developmental disabilities and four coaches from three different programs from around Ohio. SO-Ohio put on a practice for the players, which included warmups, drills and games.

Last, Buddy Up Tennis successfully debuted Net Generation's Team Challenge on three courts with more than 40 athletes, 16 Buddies and eight coaches. Beth Gibson, founder of Buddy Up Tennis, which serves players with Down syndrome, continues to grow the game and opportunity for her players.

A junior wheelchair tennis clinic was held, generating much interest around the grounds. Junior players were treated to a run/roll led by USTA Midwest's Greg Boyd as well as Brian Dean. MacKenzie Soldan, a former Midwest Paralympian who now trains at the USTA National Campus, also helped with the clinic.

Activities Around the Western & Southern Open. It was a record year for visitors to the grounds of the Western & Southern Open, and the USTA Midwest staff enjoyed interacting with many different individuals. With the addition of Play Tennis Cincinnati, a free summer camp for children focusing on the Net Generation curriculum, there were many great activities for the whole family. Here is a look at the tournament by the numbers: Kids' Day–1,200 attendees; High School Day–700 attendees; Pride Night–79 attendees representing five states; High School Showcase–4 matches/5 Teams/37 players; Net Generation On-Court Exhibitions–6 sessions/16 providers/126 participants; Net Generation Player Escorts–8 matches/16 youth; Family Zone–7 days/1,025 participants; Play Tennis Cincinnati–207 youth.

Western & Southern Booth. The USTA Midwest booth ran for the duration of the 2019 Western & Southern Open. While giving away gifts to USTA members, Midwest staff members were able to relay information about all of the exciting programs happening within the section.

It was a record year for attendance at the tournament, and a total of 2,500 members were recorded at the booth.

Midwest Tennis Ambassadors

Ambassadors are volunteers who share their passion of tennis throughout the USTA Midwest section and in their hometowns. They promote the sport on behalf of their tennis facility through social media channels and word of mouth. The program is in its second year with 28 Ambassadors and continues to grow across the Midwest.

Social Play

Nightmare at the Net (CITA). The year 2019 saw the first Nightmare at the Net social play opportunity in the Central Indiana District. The event was a one-night social play opportunity for adults to play in a round-robin doubles format and generated much interest throughout the District. A total of 46 players participated, making the event a success.

Pride Night at Western & Southern. Now in its fifth year of operation in Ohio, the 2019 Western & Southern Open Pride Night welcomed 79 participants, the most the tournament has seen to date.

Originally started by the national USTA Diversity and Inclusion Department at a few of the US Open Series tournaments, the event has morphed from a small movie screening about diversity and inclusion to a large reception. Tournament directors at the Western & Southern Open and staff of the USTA alike have enjoyed watching the event grow over the years, hearing the positive remarks each year and witnessing lifelong friendships form.

Wimbledon in Wisconsin. This event, hosted by the Wisconsin District, was a hit with all participants. The event was hosted at a new facility within the district, where there had been very little, if any, USTA programming. The grass courts provided a unique surface to engage players and encourage something new. Overall, 139 players, ages 6-87, participated in match play and team-style events. Players were unanimous in saying how well the event was run and are eagerly awaiting a second opportunity to play on the grass courts.

Midwest Youth Team Tennis

The numbers for Midwest Youth Team Tennis in 2019 were: Total Participants–4,593; Total Sessions Offered–176; Total Markets/Cities–88.

The USTA Midwest section also featured 55 sessions last year in the new Midwest Youth Team Tennis diversity program, which offers tennis in diverse markets for a significant discount, making tennis affordable for all. These programs were featured in Mid-South Illinois and Northern Illinois districts, along with programs in Chicago, Northeast Ohio and Northwest Ohio.

For the traditional Midwest Youth Team Tennis programs, the Madison, Wis., program had its highest winter program participation ever, reaching nearly 200 participants for the winter session. This was the top in the Midwest section. This is one of three MYTT sessions the Greater Madison Tennis Association runs on an annual basis.

Tennis on Campus

Badger Classic. In November 2019, the University of Wisconsin's Red and White teams welcomed more than 30 universities from across the country to participate in the 15th annual Badger Classic.

Three other sections were represented in the roster of teams present: Intermountain, Northern and Missouri Valley. With play beginning on Friday, November 15, at 8:00 a.m. and continuing through Saturday evening, Purdue University came out on top after their victory against the University of Michigan.

This tournament continues to be one of the largest student-run events in the country.

Wheelchair Tennis Updates

Net Generation Youth Focus. The USTA Midwest section conducted seven junior wheelchair tennis clinics offered throughout the section between May and August, generating three new local wheelchair tennis programs that hit the ground running.

Forty new providers were reached and more than 80 kids were introduced to the sport. New programs in 2019 included: Greater Midland Tennis Center, Toledo, Ohio, and the University of Michigan.

The section also created new marketing tip sheets for new programs to have on hand, as well as materials to have when conducting new clinics and camps that promote all of the programs in the Midwest, all of the tournaments and any information about wheelchair tennis.

Five one-day clinics at various other wheelchair sporting events were held in the section to collaborate with other wheelchair sports for kids.

The section gained two new USTA-sanctioned wheelchair tennis tournaments in 2019 (one each in Indianapolis and Cincinnati). Both were successful, with over 20 participants in each tournament. This increased the total number of wheelchair tournaments in the section to five, two of which are ITF-sanctioned, and draws more players from around the country and international players to section events. The section held the second annual junior wheelchair tennis camp in Holland, Mich., which attracted 20 kids from around the section to attend a one-and-a-half-day junior camp in June to help jump start summer programs and get kids the additional skills needed.

Article Spotlights

Dream Center. Steve Mazur and his fellow instructor, Don Egler, partnered with the Dream Center of Pontiac, Mich., to provide full scholarships to nine children from the Dream Center program to play for free in the Bloomfield Tennis Club's junior winter programs.

Dorothy Kohl. Caty McNally, Francesca Di Lorenzo, Reese Brantmeier, Caroline Dolehide and Ellie Coleman were winners of the Dorothy Kohl Award, which helps rising Midwest stars fund their travels. tournament entry fees and more.

Junior Spotlight: Nishesh Basavareddy of Central Indiana was crowned the boys' 14s champion at the Orange Bowl without dropping a set during the tournament.

SECTION HIGHLIGHTS

It was an eventful year full of great success for USTA Missouri Valley. The section, in 2019, put a great emphasis on Net Generation education, hosting seven Net Generation Community Coach Workshops and 19 schools workshops, and creating 138 new school partnerships. The USTA League program once again saw an increase in participation in 2019, and multiple USTA Missouri Valley League teams represented their section well with high-place finishes at the USTA League National Championships.

The USTA Missouri Valley hosted many major events,

including the US Open USTA Wheelchair Championships, the USTA 30s National Hard Court Championships, seven USTA League Section Championships, two USTA League National Championships, two Tennis On Campus sectionlevel tournaments, the Junior Team Tennis Section Championships and the final Sweet 16 tournaments. Pro Circuits continued to flourish in Missouri Valley, with the section hosting seven USTA Pro Circuit events that welcomed many notable names, along with many grassroots-level community events.

The USTA Missouri Valley was represented at the national level by many players, including three Junior Team Tennis teams, four Tennis On Campus teams, an Adaptive tennis team, multiple Senior World Championships teams, 30 NTRP Nationals-competing athletes and dozens of junior athletes at the USTA Girls' and Boys' National Championships. Professional athletes Madison Keys, Jack Sock, Nick Taylor and Casey Ratzlaff represented on a high level as well, with Keys reaching the third round or higher at the US Open, the Australian Open and the Brisbane International, Sock advancing to the doubles semifinals at the US Open, and Taylor and Ratzlaff finding success with Team USA. In July, the Springfield Lasers earned their second consecutive World TeamTennis championship.

The USTA Missouri Valley's Net Generation Ace and Net

Set Ambassador both represented the section at the US Open. The USTA Missouri Valley was also represented by nine officials at the US Open as recognized during the USTA's first-ever national Officials Appreciation Week. The NJTL's 50th anniversary was celebrated in 2019, and the section recognized this by spotlighting all nine of its NJTL programs.

Ames Fitness Center (Iowa), Racquet and Health 91 (Oklahoma) and Wall Park Tennis Complex (Kansas) were recognized in the 2019 USTA Facility Awards, and the Greens Country Club (Oklahoma) was chosen for the USTA Organization Member of the Year award. Jane Hines of Omaha, Neb., and Sara Rasmussen of Wichita, Kan., were both honored as Champions of Tennis by *Racquet Sports Industry* magazine. SECTION HIGHLIGHTS

In 2019, USTA New England continued to thrive in fulfilling its mission, "to promote and develop the growth of tennis," by maintaining focus on its strategic priorities: junior and adult participation growth in USTA programming with a special focus on youth tennis, enhancing our delivery infrastructure, partnership development, diversity and inclusion, and volunteer and staff development.

Our community tennis staff worked tirelessly to uphold the relationships they have built over the years in schools, parks and recreation departments and other organizations while expanding into new areas. By the end of 2019, USTA New England trained 330 PE teachers and community partners and connected 130 schools through workshops. The number of schools that signed partnership agreements increased from

42 to 128 in 2019.

Tennis in the Parks became a priority in 2019, with nine successful programs completed across five states (four of which completed multiple seasons). Nine new Tennis in the Parks programs were secured for 2020, with many more expected to come.

In addition, 3,941 Junior Team Tennis players competed on 562 teams throughout New England. The summer season culminated with New England Sectionals, which featured 17 teams competing for their shot at Nationals.

As Team Challenge continues to grow nationally, its numbers are increasing in New England as well. The section hosted 145 Team Challenge events with 2,733 players in 2019. In addition, New England hosted 52 Team Tournament

events with 922 players.

Among our junior tournament players, 11 New Englanders finished in the Top 50 on the USTA National Standing List. Our junior standouts included: Lauren Zhang (No. 13, girls' 12s), Alex Visser (No. 15, boys' 16s), Daniel Milavsky (No. 17, boys' 18s), Walker Oberg (No. 21, boys' 16s), Joseph Oyebog (No. 22, boys' 12s), Sydney Jara (No. 24, girls' 12s), Jennifer Riester (No. 34, girls' 18s), Nathan Mao (No. 34, boys' 16s), Alex Finkelstein (No. 41, boys' 18s), Lana Mavor (No. 47, girls' 18s) and Max Frias (No. 48, boys' 12s).

New England juniors also saw several individual achievements throughout 2019. Alex Finkelstein earned a bronze ball at USTA Nationals in the boys' 16s singles, while Walker Oberg took home a silver ball in boys' 16s singles at Indoor Nationals. At the same tournament, Alex Visser earned a bronze ball in boys' 16s doubles.

New Englanders Sasha Wood (No. 219), Alex Finkelstein (No. 315), Jennifer Riester (No. 426), Victoria Hu (No. 681) and Olivia Lincer (No. 891) each earned ITF World Junior Rankings, while Maria Mateas (No. 505), Safiya Carrington (No. 955) and Emma Davis (No. 1,210) earned WTA Rankings.

On the adult side, New England USTA League once again saw growth in 2019. Participation was up almost 3 percent for the second straight year, with 34,622 total players on 2,595 teams in 102 local leagues. New England also hired 14 Local League Coordinators in 2019 to run the day-to-day

operations throughout 10 local areas. New England's best finish at League Nationals came courtesy of Captain Jennifer Licciardi and her Mixed 40 & Over 6.0 team, out of Cedardale Health & Fitness in Haverhill, Mass. The team finished fourth. The huge League success in New England is driven by the important work and dedication of more than 200 energetic volunteers.

The Tennis On Campus program had another terrific year in New England, with a record 36 teams. Total participants grew by 64 percent, reaching approximately 1,150 in 2019. Three new teams were added in 2019: Quinnipiac University, University of New Haven and Amherst College, while at least two more are set to join in 2020. New England's TOC program continues to demonstrate strong growth and is recognized as one of the most successful Tennis On Campus programs by USTA National. Brown University highlighted this year's season by winning the New England Championships.

Lastly, our New England social tennis league continued to make headlines in 2019. Total participation increased by 39 percent from 2018, with league participation up to 918 players. It continues to be one of the most successful adult social leagues in the country.

In the end, we never could have accomplished all of this without our committed base of volunteers. From the USTA New England staff and board of directors, we want to thank you for your hard work and dedication to help "Promote and Develop the Growth of Tennis."

SECTION HIGHLIGHTS

In 2019, USTA Northern broke new ground in its mission to promote and develop the sport in Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota and northwestern Wisconsin. The section experienced huge growth in Junior Team Tennis, developed social play opportunities for adults and continued the success of its Tennis In Your Park program from previous years.

Participation in Junior Team Tennis increased by 143 percent in 2019, reinforcing recent research about kids' preference toward team play in youth sports and generating a broad universe of potential players for future programming. Sadie Reiners of the Hastings Tennis Association won the Janet

Louer JTT Organizer of the Year Award for her fantastic work building a successful program and promoting community involvement.

Meanwhile, USTA Northern's adult recreational lesson program, Tennis In Your Park, grew by 15 percent. Tennis In Your Park is made possible through coordination between the section and community parks and recreation departments and was held in more than a dozen communities with 508 total registrations.

A brewery tour provided social play opportunities for adults from June to September; the section partnered with

multiple area breweries to host red ball pop-up tennis throughout the summer.

With nearly 13,000 registrations in 2019, USTA League enjoyed another good year, while both the Twin Cities area and Fargo recorded substantial increases in local league participation. Forty-three teams represented USTA Northern at the National Championships, capturing two titles: Men's 55 & Over 6.0 and Men's 55 & Over 7.0.

Huge strides were made on and off the court in youth tennis. Registration fees were cut by 25 percent to make participation more affordable for players attending a National Team event. The plan is to reduce fees again in 2020. The section also hosted two Team USA Camps in April and September and eight Early Development Camps throughout the year.

Additionally, staff has been—and continues to be—hard at

work educating parents, players and tournament staff on the changes coming in 2021 to the junior competitive pathway.

It was also a year of "firsts" for the section, holding its first Unified Doubles Championship and sending an adaptive athlete to the National Championships, and hosting the inaugural Minnesota Tennis Teachers Conference with the Minnesota Tennis Coaches Association and the USPTA Northern Division. The event brought together 200 attendees and coaches of all levels from around the section for three days of workshops, guest speakers and more.

USTA Northern donated nearly 400 racquets, bags and shoes around the section as part of its culture of giving. Additionally, more than \$100,000 in funding was awarded to support community tennis programs and facilities.

SECTION HIGHLIGHTS

USTA Northern California continued its efforts to drive innovation and increase tennis participation in 2019, focusing on not only growing the existing membership base, but also engaging players at multiple levels across the community.

NorCal's youth programs saw significant growth across the board in 2019. Participation in the H.I.T.S. program, which focuses on helping youth build life skills and character development, was strong, with more than 5,000 kids participating and training provided for more than 100 teachers and coaches. Building off 2018's launch of the H.I.T.S Red Ball Junior Team Tennis Program, more than 1,500 players participated in 2019, leading to more 10U players transitioning into local orange ball programs. Support for training and education was also a top priority in 2019, with 18 school workshops hosted for more than 150 P.E. teachers to implement the National Shape Tennis P.E. Program, as well as close work with 17 NJTL programs to enhance their tennis and

educational development, USTA Northern California also continued to foster its partnerships and collaborated with close to 50 CTA programs in the section and its Capacity Building Chapter, the Sierra Junior Tennis and Learning, to support the growth of our tennis initiatives. Lastly, NorCal also hosted the first ever High School Play Series Events.

Junior Team Tennis (JTT) leagues greatly increased its footprint with participation growing from 5,700 players to 8,400. In addition to increases in youth participation, NorCal junior teams had an excellent record of success in 2019. Most notably, the USTA Northern California 14s Intersectional team won the BG 14s Intersectional Team Championship, the highest level of team competition in the U.S. between teams from the 17 sections of the USTA. They also took home the Team Sportsmanship Award voted on by their peers and tournament staff.

In addition, 2019 proved to be a fruitful year for NorCal's Adult League program, as it ranked third in the nation in participation and ranked fifth in unique player registration. The Get Connected program, connecting adult players with teams in their area, was a big contributor to players' satisfaction, assisting more than 500 players in finding a team. The Daytime League continued its success from last year and supported 4,137 players in 273 teams across multiple levels in three leagues. There was also a great turnout for entry-level adult tennis with close to 350 participants in the Ready, Set, Rally! program and many participants following that up with Try Team Tennis events.

The 18-39 league hosted 431 players in 2019 and took action to expand the league to the age of 45 based on valuable insight gained from past participants. The launch of the 18-45 team singles league kicked off with 691 players participating. NorCal League teams represented well on the national stage and finished the championship season with three national championship teams and five teams that placed in the top four at their respective levels. In addition to league play, NorCal had 125 tournaments and 4,900 unique adult tournament players in 2019.

USTA Northern California continued its rich history of making tennis inclusive to everyone with the ninth annual North/South Wheelchair Tennis Challenge at the Copper River Country Club in Fresno. Always a fun, competitive showdown between sections, NorCal edged out a 16-7 victory and retained the trophy for the second year in a row.

In 2019, USTA Northern California's Diversity and Inclusion (D & I) team furthered its mission to create an organization that fosters diversity and inclusiveness and was integral in promoting the growth of tennis through grants, sponsorships and community outreach. Several notable accomplishments included grants that helped three tennis organizations enhance their existing programs; sponsorship of the D & I's first travel team helping 12 diverse junior players with tournament, match play and practices; and establishing the first all-women USPTA Women's Coaches Conference in collaboration with USPTA. The D & I team also helped promote USTA NorCal programming and resources and engage with the community at 17 events impressing more than 40,000 people, held a Hispanic Heritage Month event in collaboration with the Pancho Gonzalez Foundation, and sponsored and hosted its annual Kids' Day at the Mubadala Silicon Valley Classic tennis festival.

In addition to receiving National funding, these initiatives and programs were made possible by membership dues and fees collected from participation in tournaments and leagues. As a 501(c)(3) association, USTA Northern California relies on membership dollars to support community programs, committees, schools, parks and recreation, educational programs and adaptive tennis, as well as the incredible tournaments and league events hosted during the year. USTA NorCal thanks its members for their continued support of these successful programs, and we look forward to building on the momentum for 2020!

opportunities for the year, and the suite of products is made possible through strong and growing partnerships with park and recreation departments, school districts and community organizations. In the section's continued efforts to build a footprint in every community, more than 350 seasonal jobs across four states were created, drawing staff from diverse local neighborhoods and also simultaneously providing job training and positive economic impact. Overall, the goal of RecTennis™ is to provide affordable, fun and accessible health and wellness opportunities through tennis to as many people as possible. These new players are then fed into existing indoor facilities and Net Generation products.

USTA Pacific Northwest had another outstanding year in USTA League play, including three national champions and four national finalists. USTA Pacific Northwest continues to be one of the nation's leaders in player retention, as well as Total and Unique Participation Growth, coming in the top four in every category. Leading this growth was Northwest Washington Area League Coordinator Jill Borgida, who once again finished second in the country in Total Participation Growth.

The year 2019 demonstrated success for junior competition as well. Junior Team Tennis total participation grew 8 percent from the previous year. PNW juniors were well represented during the 2019 National Championships and Easter Bowl with three semifinalists and three quarterfinalists. Annika Renganathan (girls' 12) and Thomas Paulsell (boys' 16) were Easter Bowl semifinalists. Lamija Avdik was a girls' 14 semifinalist. Katja Wiersholm (girls'

16) and Cash Hanzlik (boys' 18) both reached the National Championship quarterfinals, and Vincent Yang made it through to the Easter Bowl boys' 12 quarterfinals.

USTA Pacific Northwest continues to live Its missionbased strategic initiative to revitalize and manage indoor tennis facilities, while expanding the tennis infrastructure and collaborating with communities to provide accessible play opportunities for all. For the Galbraith Tennis Center and Vancouver Tennis Center, 2019 was the first full year of operations under USTA Pacific Northwest management, with membership and participation growing each month, while continuing to provide free court hours to nearby public high schools and engaging in multiple partnerships with parks and recreation departments, elementary school districts, local foundations, and military bases and families. Investing in facility infrastructure with revitalizing facilities like the Galbraith Tennis Center and Vancouver Tennis Center continues to address the single greatest challenge of growing the game of tennis specific to the Pacific Northwest: public access to indoor courts for all.

In working with the various departments, USTA Pacific Northwest continued to deliver target marketing strategies that integrated traditional, print and grassroots efforts with new and engaging digital platforms, with an emphasis on social media engagement and outreach. By using these various mediums, USTA Pacific Northwest was able to communicate its organizational story in a visual and engaging manner to inspire a new group of traditional and non-traditional players.

The section officially announced plans for the Carol Kimmelman Athletic & Academic Campus in Carson, launching the initiative to create one of the largest and most extraordinary nonprofit community-serving centers in the United States.

Working with the City of Los Angeles Rec & Parks, as well

as the Los Angeles Unified School Districts, USTA Southern California provided training for more than 250 R&P staff in 2019, introduced tennis curriculum to physical education classes at more than 150 LAUSD schools and incorporated tennis into after-school programs at 18 schools in the region under the USTA Net Generation initiative. Additionally, the section escalated capacity building for six local NJTL chapters.

In junior tennis, the Final 8 Masters Championship premiered in 2019. Held along the picturesque Malibu shores, the tournament pooled the top eight players in each junior age

division in round robin play, culminating in a Sunday finale that saw each age level crown an inaugural Final 8 champion.

The 117th SoCal Junior Sectionals added much pomp and circumstance to the largest youth sectional tournament in the nation. Among the highlights was the performance of topseeded Thea Frodin, who collected the girls' 10s singles, doubles and mixed doubles sectional titles in 2019.

Several SoCal-based players exceled on the national level, including emerging pros Brandon Nakashima, Junior Fed Cup champion Katrina Scott and Zachary Svajda. In winning USTA Boys' Nationals, Svajda earned a berth in the US Open men's singles main draw and made his Flushing Meadows debut in front of a boisterous crowd.

UCLA triumphed at the Tennis On Campus National Championships to conclude an impressive collegiate club tennis season. The team won its first TOC title since 2011 with an exciting win over California.

At Adult Open Sectionals, Riley Smith swept the men's singles and doubles, including a win alongside his father,

Peter Smith. Midori Castillo, along with Delanie Dunkle and Maia Sung—all winners at Junior Sectionals—stepped into the adult competition to notch the women's open singles and doubles crowns, respectively.

In national play, the women's 75s team captured yet another Gold victory at Intersectionals, helmed by captain Suella Steel along with Cathie Anderson, Anne Russ and Teri Eggers. Southern California teams also notched silver medals in the 65s and 55s divisions, plus a bronze medal in 35s.

At the ITF Super Senior World Team competition in Croatia, captain Tina Karwasky helped Team USA continue its dominance at the Kitty Godfree Cup women's 65+ competition, earning a crucial singles win to help the squad sweep Germany in the championship final. Liane Bryson and Team USA's 70+ team swept Great Britain in the final of the Althea Gibson Cup. David Dollins and Dean Corley competed as part of the men's 75+ team that outlasted Austria, 2-1, in the Bitsy Grant Cup finale.

SECTION HIGHLIGHTS

For USTA Southwest, 2019 was a banner year, as we underwent a significant leadership transition and a new mode of operation, transitioning away from a district structure to a more centralized and streamlined form of governance in which the section takes on more tasks and responsibility for what happens locally. This move was spearheaded by the USTA Southwest board and volunteers, and is designed to propel the section forward and better deliver our programs.

Our League program continues to be a beacon of optimism, as total registrations in the program in the Southwest remained on an increase, as it has every year since the program's origination nearly four decades ago. USTA Southwest squads fared well at USTA League National Championship events, and it was our women who led the show. We had a USTA National 40 & Over 4.0 championship squad from Scottsdale, and our 5.0+ 18 & Over women (from Albuquerque) were runners-up nationally.

We continue to push forward and develop new offerings locally in our adult realms, especially in the areas of social league tennis with millennial-aged players. Our team tournament and event numbers across the section are growing exponentially and seem to show a real trend we already knew about and embraced: This sport is inherently social, and our players will do just about anything to create and be on a team with friends or develop new ones from the sport.

In junior areas, our focus has worked on trying to be a leader nationally in how to run events and making clear, understandable pathways for our juniors to follow. Our Junior Team Tennis programs are continuing to thrive and be added in smaller communities, which is also a goal. We held our Section Championships for JTT in Flagstaff, the first time the city has ever hosted a sectional event.

Our great segue programs such as Tennis On Campus keep taking off as well, as we add ever more collegiate teams to our annual event. The University of New Mexico was our 2019 Tennis On Campus section champ for the second year in a row and for the third time overall.

Both our junior and adult tennis participation numbers in tournaments (particularly in Phoenix with the advent of yearlong "Series events") have grown slightly. We try to be creative in increasing opportunities and use new formats—from Fast Four concepts to different types of pairing events (e.g., Junior Dynamic Duo, with one girl and one boy playing as a "team," competing in singles, doubles and mixed). We will continue to try to innovate in these areas.

The recently created USTA Adult NTRP National Championships have been a success and have reached down locally, as players opt to play more local tournaments in the hope of making the national event. One of our players—Thomas Roller of Morristown, Ariz.—captured a national title at the 4.0 level in the 2019 50 & Over USTA NTRP National Championship event.

In the competitive junior realm, players form the Southwest garnered some impressive results in 2019. Gianna Pielet of El Paso, Texas, and Niroop Vallabhaneni of Paradise Valley, Ariz., reached the 2019 US Open Junior Championships. Pielet (girls' 18s) and Adam Sun of Phoenix (boys' 14s) also finished with Top 10 national rankings.

Our adults, led by Santa Fe's Jimmy Parker, also had stellar years. Parker's was quite amazing, sweeping the men's 75 singles USTA National Hard Court, Clay Court, Grass Court and Indoor titles. He came one match short of a full Grand Slam in doubles (losing in the semifinals of the Hard Courts), on his way to the No. 1 ranking in both singles and doubles for 2019. It was the second year in a row he won all four major singles titles.

Our USTA Southwest community tennis programs are going strong, and we continue to support them with nearly \$25,000 in grants annually. A new professional event also was added to the calendar in 2019, as the Arizona Tennis

Classic, a high-level ATP Challenger event, took place in Phoenix in the spring.

Lastly, one of our best-ever juniors and former WTA Top 11-ranked player, Meghann Shaughnessy, was inducted into our Hall of Fame in 2019, along with immediate past president and former University of New Mexico Lobo great Tim Garcia.

SECTION HIGHLIGHTS

Texas hosted its first-ever Fed Cup tie in 2019, welcoming Team USA to Freeman Coliseum in San Antonio. Twenty-year-old Sofia Kenin clinched a 3-1 victory for the U.S. Fed Cup team over Switzerland on April 21. With the win, the Americans clinched a spot in the 2020 Fed Cup Qualifiers.

The University of Texas men's tennis team won its first NCAA Division I National Championship on May 19. The

Longhorns feature two Texas juniors—Nevin Arimilli and Colin Markes—on their roster. Baylor University and Texas Christian University also reached the Elite Eight.

On July 14, Carrollton's Savannah Broadus won the Wimbledon girls' doubles championship. The 16-year-old teamed with fellow American Abigail Forbes to capture her first junior Grand Slam tournament title.

On July 23, USTA Texas announced that the city of Georgetown won the three-year bid to host the Texas Slam, one of the largest junior tennis tournaments in the United States. Georgetown beat out several other applicants for the event, with a special selection committee of volunteers reviewing the bids and ultimately choosing the next host city. Abilene served as the tournament's host from 2017 to 2019, welcoming nearly 1,000 players a year to play in the Texas Slam.

In addition, 2019 marked the third year of the USTA Texas College Showcase, an event that helps high schoolers learn more about the college recruiting process. On July 27-28, 25 coaches from across the country watched more than 130 players at Baylor's Waco Regional Tennis Center.

The USTA announced that Soldier Spring Park of Weatherford, TBarM Racquet Club in Dallas and SMU Tennis

Complex in Dallas were winners in the USTA Facility Awards program. The award recognizes excellence in the construction and/or renovation of tennis facilities throughout the country. The winners were honored at the USTA Semi-Annual Meeting in New York City on August 29.

USTA Texas dominated at the USTA League National Championships, held from October 4 to November 17. Six Lone Star teams won titles, as USTA Texas boasted the largest number of winners from any one section in 2019.

Texas hosted the USTA Junior Team Tennis National Championships in San Antonio in mid-November and defended its home turf. Austin Tennis Academy won both 18U Championships, and the Texas Select Bears (Dallas) won the 14U Intermediate title. King Daddy Tornadoes (Houston) and the Texas Select Longhorns (Dallas) both finished as runners-up.

The Constitution of the United States Tennis Association Incorporated

Bylaws of the United States Tennis Association

Diversity and Inclusion Statement

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES TENNIS ASSOCIATION INCORPORATED



FIRST: The name of the corporation is UNITED STATES TENNIS ASSOCIATION INCORPORATED (hereinafter the "USTA"). SECOND: The USTA is a corporation as defined in subparagraph (a)(5) of Section 102 of the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law and under Section 201 of said law it is a Type A not-for-profit corporation.

THIRD: The purposes for which it is formed are:

To promote the development of tennis as a means of healthful recreation and physical fitness;

To establish and maintain rules of play and high standards of amateurism and good sportsmanship;

To foster national and international amateur tennis tournaments and competitions;

To encourage, sanction and conduct tennis tournaments and competitions open to athletes without regard to race, creed, color or national origin and under the best conditions possible so as to effectively promote the game of tennis with the general public:

To generally encourage through tennis the development of health, character and responsible citizenship; and

To carry on other similar activities permitted to be carried on by such a not-for-profit corporation.

FOURTH: No part of the net earnings of the USTA shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, nor shall it provide athletic facilities or equipment to, its directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the USTA shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in this certificate of incorporation. No substantial part of the activities of the USTA shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the USTA shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. In the event of the liquidation or dissolution of the USTA, whether voluntary or involuntary, all assets of the corporation remaining after payment of, or the provision for the satisfaction of, all liabilities or obligations of the USTA shall be distributed, except as may be provided by law and subject to the direction and control of a court of competent jurisdiction, to one or more organizations selected by the Board of Directors of the USTA which are the type described in Section 170(b) (1)(A) (other than in clauses (vii) and (viii) thereof) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 or the corresponding provision of any subsequent Federal Tax laws. The USTA may engage in the public solicitation of funds. Nothing herein shall authorize the USTA, directly or indirectly, to engage in or include among its purposes, any of the activities mentioned in the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law, Section 404(b)-(t).

FIFTH: The office of the USTA is to be located in the County of Westchester, State of New York.

SIXTH: The territory in which the operations of the USTA will principally be conducted is United States of America.

SEVENTH: The categories of membership in the USTA shall be as set forth in the Bylaws.

The only voting members of the USTA shall be Sectional Associations and **Direct Member Clubs** and **Organizations**. The sectional boundaries and the number of votes of each Sectional Association and of each **Direct Member Club** and **Organization** shall be determined as provided in the Bylaws. Each Sectional Association may contain one or more District Associations, each of which shall consist of the **Member Clubs** and **Organizations** located within boundaries fixed by the Sectional Association.

Membership dues and the qualifications, rights and obligations of all categories of members, to the extent not set forth herein, shall be as provided in the Bylaws.

EIGHTH: The titles, qualifications, duties, terms of office and manner of election or appointment of the officers, directors and assistants shall be as provided in the Bylaws.

NINTH: The USTA shall be managed by its Board of Directors as provided in the Bylaws.

There shall be such Committees as may be named in the Bylaws or appointed by the Chairman of the Board and President or by the Board of Directors.

TENTH: The Annual Meeting of the USTA shall be held on such date and at such place as provided in the Bylaws.

At all meetings of the USTA, the presence, either in person or by proxy, of representatives of a majority vote of the membership shall constitute a quorum and a vote of a majority of those votes present shall constitute the action of the USTA, except that any amendment affecting the composition of, or the method of electing, the Nominating Committee shall be adopted by a vote of two-thirds of the total voting membership.

ELEVENTH: The USTA shall (to the extent permitted by the laws of the State of New York) indemnify each and every officer and director, past or present, of the USTA and his heirs, executors and administrators against all expenses, including amounts of judgments against or amounts paid in settlement by such persons, together with all costs, legal, accounting or otherwise, necessarily or reasonably incurred by or otherwise imposed upon him, in connection with the defense of any action, suit or proceeding to which he may be made a party, or with which he may be threatened by reason of action taken by or on behalf of the USTA, whether or not he continues to be such at the time of incurring such expenses.

The right of indemnification provided by this Article shall not be deemed exclusive of any other right to which those indemnified may be entitled apart from this Article.

TWELFTH: The USTA is an independent tennis organization and, as such, cannot take any action at the request of any international tennis body which is inconsistent with the provisions of this Constitution or any Bylaws or **Standing Orders** issued hereunder.

THIRTEENTH: Amendments to this Constitution may be made at any meeting of the USTA, provided that the notice of the meeting contain the proposed amendment. Amendments may be proposed by a Sectional Association (through its President or Secretary), by a **Direct Member Club** or Organization, or by the Board of Directors. Procedures for submitting proposed amendments shall be the same as set forth for amending the Bylaws and shall be in accordance with the laws of the State of New York.

Offices

1. *Principal Office*. The principal office of the United States Tennis Association Incorporated (hereinafter "Corporation") shall be located in White Plains, New York, or such other location as the Board of Directors (hereinafter "Board") may select. The Corporation may have additional offices at such other locations as the Board may from time to time determine.

Members

- 2. *Membership Categories*. The categories of memberships shall be: Sectional Associations, Direct Member Clubs and Organizations, Organization Members, Individual Members, and Honorary Members.
- 3. Territories of Sectional Associations. The Corporation shall be divided into seventeen geographical "sections." Each Sectional Association shall be identified, and the geographical area assigned to each Sectional Association shall be, as follows:

CARIBBEAN:

The commonwealth of Puerto Rico. The territory of the U.S. Virgin Islands.

EASTERN:

The state of New York.

Of the state of Ossesstic

Of the state of Connecticut, that part which is within 35 miles of New York City Hall, excepting that part which is within the city limits of Stamford (which shall form part of the New

England Section).

Of the state of New Jersey, the counties of PASSAIC, BERGEN, ESSEX, UNION, and HUDSON; the county of MONMOUTH, excepting the townships and boroughs of Manasquan, Sea Girt, Spring Lake, Spring Lake Heights, Avon-by-the-Sea, Bradley Beach, Neptune, Neptune City, South Belmar, Belmar, Wall, Howell, Farmingdale, Millstone, Roosevelt, Upper Freehold, Allentown, Brielle, Freehold, Freehold Townships, and Manalaplan Englishtown (which shall form part of the Middle States Section); the county of MIDDLESEX, excepting the townships and boroughs of Cranbury, South Brunswick, Plainsboro, Jamesburg, and Monroe (which shall form part of the Middle States Section); the county of SOMERSET, excepting the townships and boroughs of Rocky Hill, Montgomery, Hillsborough, Branchburg, and Bedminster (which shall form part of the Middle States Section); and the county of MORRIS, excepting the townships and boroughs of Chester, Chester Township, Washington, Mount Olive, Netcong, Roxbury, and Mount Arlington (which shall form part of the Middle States Section).

FLORIDA: The state of Florida. HAWAII PACIFIC: The state of Hawaii.

The territory of American Samoa.

The territory of Guam.

The commonwealth of the Northern Marianas.

INTERMOUNTAIN:

The state of Colorado. The state of Utah. The state of Wyoming. The state of Montana.

The state of Nevada, excepting CARSON CITY, DOUGLAS COUNTY, and WASHOE COUNTY

(which shall form part of the Northern California Section).

Of the state of Idaho, that part which is south of the 45th parallel of latitude.

Of the state of Oregon, the county of MALHEUR.

MID-ATLANTIC:

The District of Columbia.

The state of Maryland.

The state of Virginia, excepting that part which is within the city limits of Bristol (which shall

form part of the Southern Section).

Of the state of Wisconsin, the counties of BARRON, BAYFIELD, BUFFALO, BURNETT, CHIPPEWA, DOUGLAS, DUNN, EAU CLAIRE, PEPIN, PIERCE, POLK, RUSK, ST. CROIX,

SAWYER, TREMPEALEAU, and WASHBURN.

NORTHERN The state of California, excepting the counties of IMPERIAL, KERN, LOS ANGELES, ORANGE, CALIFORNIA: RIVERSIDE, SAN BERNARDINO, SAN DIEGO, SAN LUIS OBISPO, SANTA BARBARA, and

VENTURA (which shall form the Southern California Section).

Of the state of Nevada, CARSON CITY, DOUGLAS COUNTY, and WASHOE COUNTY.

PACIFIC NORTHWEST: The state of Alaska.

The state of Oregon, excepting the county of Malheur.

The state of Washington.

Of the state of Idaho, that part which is north of the 45th parallel of latitude.

SOUTHERN: The state of Alabama.

The state of Arkansas.
The state of Georgia.
The state of Louisiana.
The state of Mississippi.
The state of North Carolina.
The state of South Carolina.
The state of Tennessee.

The state of Kentucky, excepting the counties of BOONE, CAMPBELL, and KENTON (which

shall form part of the Midwest Section).
Of the state of Texas, the county of BOWIE.

Of the state of Virginia, that part which is within the city limits of Bristol.

SOUTHERN Of the state of California, the counties of IMPERIAL, KERN, LOS ANGELES, ORANGE, RIVER-CALIFORNIA: SIDE, SAN BERNARDINO, SAN DIEGO, SAN LUIS OBISPO, SANTA BARBARA, and VENTURA.

SOUTHWEST: The state of Arizona.

The state of New Mexico.

Of the state of Texas, the county of EL PASO.

TEXAS: The state of Texas, excepting the county of BOWIE (which shall form part of the Southern

Section) and the county of EL PASO (which shall form part of the Southwest Section).

4. Governance of Sectional Associations. Each section shall be governed by a Sectional Association which shall be empowered by the Corporation to fulfill the constitutional purposes of the Corporation and to manage the sport of tennis in the section's geographical area in accordance with the Constitution, Bylaws, and USTA Regulations. The governing documents of each Sectional Association shall be subject to review and approval by the Board to ensure their consistency with the Constitution, Bylaws, and USTA Regulations. Failure of any Sectional Association to govern or to manage the sport of tennis in compliance with the Constitution, Bylaws, or USTA Regulations shall subject the Sectional Association to sanctions by the Board. Sanctions may be appealed to the membership at the next Annual Meeting or at a Special Meeting which must be called by the Board if requested in writing. The appeal shall be submitted to the Secretary-Treasurer within 30 days of actual notice of imposition of the sanction. The sanction shall be effective immediately or on the date specified by the Board in the sanction. Notice of appeal stays the sanction. On appeal the ruling of the membership shall be final.

5. Governance of District Associations. Each Sectional Association may contain one or more District Associations or subdivisions, the boundaries of which shall be fixed by the Sectional Association. A Sectional Association that has three or more District Associations or subdivisions shall not have any District Association or subdivision with more than forty percent (40%) of the Sectional Association's adjusted aggregate voting strength. Each district or subdivision shall be governed by such rules and regulations as it shall adopt in accordance with the requirements of its Sectional Association. Such rules and regulations shall not be inconsistent with the Constitution, Bylaws, or USTA Regulations and are subject to review and approval of the Board.

A District Association whose boundaries comprise a territory, commonwealth, or possession of the United States having its own National Olympic Committee duly recognized by the International Olympic Committee, shall have the right to solicit direct affiliation to the International Tennis Federation as an Associate or Full Member and enjoy all the rights and privileges thereof.

- 6. Direct Member Clubs. With the exception of the Bermuda Lawn Tennis Club and Coral Beach and Tennis Club, Bermuda, and any overseas United States Military Organization in control of tennis facilities (which shall be Direct Member Clubs or Organizations), no club or organization is eligible for membership unless it is located within the boundaries of a Sectional Association.
- 7. *Organization Members*. Any organization of a permanent character located within the boundaries of a Sectional Association interested in the purposes of the Corporation is eligible for membership as follows:

Community Tennis Associations

Any multi-purpose, incorporated, geographically defined, not-for-profit, volunteer tennis support organization which supports or provides comprehensive programs.

Clubs

Any private or commercial club, resort, hotel, condominium, apartment complex, or homeowners' association that controls and maintains tennis facilities.

Schools

Any elementary or secondary school, college, university, or other educational institution.

Parks and Recreation Departments

Any municipal, county, or other public entity that fosters tennis activities.

Program Delivery or Service Organizations and Other Entities

Any other organization or private entity, including a limited or single focus tennis association that actively conducts, controls, or supervises tennis activities or is interested in the promotion of tennis.

8. Individual Members. Any individual interested in the purposes of the Corporation is eligible for Individual Membership as follows:

Junior—Any individual under the age of 19 years.

Adult—Any individual 19 years or older and under the age of 70 years.

Senior—Any individual 70 years or older.

Family—Residents of the same household who consider themselves a family.

Life—Any individual of any age.

An individual may have only one membership.

- 9. Honorary Members. Honorary Membership may be conferred upon such worthy persons as may be so elected by the Governance Committee.
- 10. *Discrimination Prohibited.* Membership and all rights of participation in the Corporation, including all tournaments and other events conducted or sanctioned by it, shall be open to athletes, coaches, trainers, administrators, officials, and all other persons without regard to race, age, creed, sexual orientation, color, national origin, or sex. Nonetheless, participation in divisions of tournaments and other events may be restricted on the basis of sex or age.

Dues and Voting Rights

- 11. Dues and Sectional Association Allocations.
 - a. Dues. The Board establishes membership dues. However, before changing membership dues, the Board shall consult with all Sectional Associations and the Membership Services Committee about the proposed changes and receive input from the Chief Executive Officer and Membership Department.
 - b. Sectional Association allocations:
 - i. Adult, Junior, Family, and Organizational Memberships. The Corporation shall pay each Sectional Association a portion of the membership dues (excluding Life Memberships) collected by the Corporation within the geographic area assigned. The Corporation shall determine which twelve-month period each Sectional Association received the most membership dues (excluding Life Memberships) out of the following two periods:
 - Period 1: July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013; or
 - Period 2: September 1, 2012 through August 31, 2013.

The twelve-month period in which a Sectional Association receives the most dues is its "Highest Period." Starting with the payments made to the Sectional Associations for the month of April 2014, each month thereafter the Corporation shall pay to each Sectional Association the same amount that it paid to that Sectional Association in the corresponding month of that Sectional Association's Highest Period.

- ii. Life Memberships. The Corporation shall pay to the Sectional Association in which the Life Member is domiciled on December 31 of each year, \$3 each year if the Life Member enrolled before January 1, 1994, or 2.5 percent each year of the amount of dues previously paid by the Life Member if the Life Member enrolled on or after January 1, 1994.
- c. Temporary test marketing of Memberships. The Board may authorize temporary test marketing of memberships on terms different from those in Bylaws 7 and 8.
- 12. Voting Strength. The only voting members of the Corporation shall be Sectional Associations and Direct Member Clubs and Organizations.
 - a. Sectional Associations. The voting strength for Sectional Associations shall be as follows:
 - *Caribbean* 6,048 votes (approximately 1 percent)
 - Eastern 61,064 votes (approximately 7 percent)
 - Florida 58,151 votes (approximately 7 percent)
 - Hawaii Pacific 7,939 votes (approximately 1 percent)
 - Intermountain 47,353 votes (approximately 5 percent)
 - Mid-Atlantic 47,806 votes (approximately 6 percent)
 - Middle States 37,216 votes (approximately 4 percent)
 - Midwest 95,816 votes (approximately 11 percent)
 - Missouri Valley 28,482 votes (approximately 3 percent)
 - New England 41,982 votes (approximately 5 percent)
 - *Northern* 15,073 votes (approximately 2 percent)
 - Northern California 57,704 votes (approximately 7 percent)
 - Pacific Northwest 28,346 votes (approximately 3 percent)
 - Southern 193,803 votes (approximately 23 percent)
 - Southern California 46,287 votes (approximately 5 percent)
 - Southwest 16,462 votes (approximately 2 percent)
 - *Texas* 58,706 votes (approximately 7 percent)

No Sectional Association's voting strength shall be more than forty percent (40%) of the aggregate voting strength of the Sectional Associations. If the voting strength of any Sectional Association at the end of any calendar year is more than forty percent (40%) of the aggregated voting strength of the Sectional Associations, then the voting strength of that Sectional Association shall be capped at 40% and all non-capped Sectional

Associations' voting strength shall remain unchanged and their voting percentage shall be adjusted upward proportionally. In no event shall the actual number of members in each geographic area assigned be capped, only the voting strength for the sole purpose of corporate governance. The voting strength of each Sectional Association shall be certified by the Secretary-Treasurer in writing before each meeting at which a vote is to be taken.

- b. *Direct Member Clubs and Organizations*. The voting strength of the Direct Member Clubs and Organizations, shall be as follows:
 - Bermuda Lawn Tennis Club 26 votes (approximately less than .5 percent)
 - Coral Beach and Tennis Club, Bermuda 26 votes (approximately less than .5 percent)
- Honorary Members. Honorary Members shall not be counted in calculating the voting strength of Sectional Associations and Direct Member Clubs or Organizations.
- d. Purchase of Memberships. It is against the policy of the Corporation for any Sectional Association or District Association to purchase a membership of any kind; however, any Sectional Association may, on its own behalf or on behalf of its District Associations or subdivisions, purchase up to 15 individual memberships annually for recognition of volunteers. The Board shall be authorized to prescribe the appropriate procedures to enforce this provision, which may include the execution of an affidavit each year by each member of the Board of each Sectional Association and District Association listing all new memberships purchased directly or indirectly by a Sectional Association or District Association during the year.
- 13. Sectional Delegates. The Sectional Delegate shall cast the Sectional Association's votes. Each Sectional Association shall use a proxy to designate its Sectional Delegate. The vote of a Sectional Association may be split.
- 14. Rights of Organization Members and Honorary Members at Meetings of Members. Representatives of Organization Members and Honorary Members are entitled to be present at meetings of members and may be recognized to speak during the meeting, but shall have no voting rights, except in the case of Organization Members, which are represented by their Sectional Associations.

Applications for Memberships

- 15. Approval of Application for Membership as Organization Member. All membership applications for Organization Members shall be submitted in the proper form to the Corporation at its principal office and shall be subject to the approval of the applicable Sectional Association. An Organization Member's application shall be deemed approved unless the Sectional Association notifies the Corporation office of its disapproval in writing within 30 days of the submission of the application to the Sectional Association's office.
- 16. Application for Individual Membership. Application for Individual Membership shall be submitted in the proper form to the Corporation at its principal office.
 - 17. Exhaustion of Administrative Remedies.
 - a. All members agree to follow the Constitution, the Bylaws, and the USTA Regulations. Members shall exhaust all administrative remedies in any controversy or grievance, including, but not limited to, membership, governance, management, or participation in activities or events.
 - b. Sectional Associations, District Associations, or subdivisions of Sectional Associations agree to submit to final and binding arbitration in any controversy or grievance involving their governance or management upon demand of the Board or a vote of no less than 30% of a Sectional Association's Board of Directors. Final and binding arbitration shall be conducted in accordance with procedures approved by the Board.

Reports by Direct Member Clubs or Organizations

18. Reports by Direct Member Clubs or Organizations. Before December 31, each Direct Member Club or Organization shall report its correct address and the number of its courts.

Suspension or Expulsion of Members

19. Suspension or Expulsion of Members. The Board shall have the power to suspend or expel any member for cause. Any member who fails to pay dues when due shall automatically be suspended from membership.

Meetings of Members

- 20. Annual Meeting of Voting Members. The Annual Meeting of the Corporation for the transaction of business that comes before the voting members shall be held between January 1 and April 15 on a date and at a place fixed by the Board.
- 21. Semiannual Meeting of Voting Members. The Semiannual Meeting of the Corporation for the transaction of business that comes before the voting members shall be held in August or September on a date and at a place fixed by the Board.
- 22. Special Meetings of Voting Members. Special meetings of the voting members of the Corporation may be called by the Board at any time, subject to the advance notice provision in **Bylaw 23**. Special meetings shall also be called upon the written request of Sectional Associations and Direct Member Clubs or Organizations having an aggregate vote of not less than one-tenth of the total voting membership. The written request shall state the purpose and the date of the proposed special meeting, which shall not be less than two nor more than three months from the date of the written request, subject to the advance written notice provision in **Bylaw 23**. Only those matters specified in the request may be acted upon at the special meeting. Special meetings of the voting members shall be held at the location that the Board determines before mailing the notice of the meeting.
- 23. Notice of Meetings of Voting Members. Notice of the date, time, place, and purpose of any meeting of the voting members of the Corporation shall be given to each Sectional Association and each Direct Member Club or Organization. Notice of any meeting other than the annual meeting must also indicate that it is being issued by or at the direction of the person or persons calling the meeting. All notices must be sent by first-class mail, facsimile, or electronic mail, and must be given not less than 10 nor more than 50 days before any meeting. All notices must be directed to the addresses then appearing in the records of the Corporation. Only those matters set forth in the notice of a special meeting may be acted upon at the special meeting.
- 24. *Quorum and Voting.* At all meetings of the Corporation the presence, either in person or by proxy, of representatives of a majority of the voting membership shall constitute a quorum and a majority vote of those votes present shall constitute the action of the Corporation, except as restricted in Article Tenth of the Constitution. Except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws, Robert's Rules of Order shall be the rules of order for meetings of the Corporation.
 - 25. Order of Business. The order of business at the Annual Meeting of the Corporation shall be as follows:
 - a. Report certifying voting power and the determination of a guorum:
 - b. Approval of minutes:
 - c. Report of Secretary-Treasurer:
 - d. Report of Chairperson of the Board and President;
 - e. Report of Elections;
 - f. Reports of Committees;
 - q. Miscellaneous or Special Business;
 - h. Adjournment.

Adoption of that part of the report certifying voting power shall not be subject to challenge during the meeting.

Elite Athletes

26. Elite Athlete. Elite Athlete means a United States citizen who meets any one of the following three requirements: within the last 10 years has been a member of the US Olympic, US Pan American, US Paralympic, US Para Pan American, US Davis Cup, US Fed Cup, or US World Cup teams; within the last 24 months has reached the second round of an open draw of the United States Open Tennis Championships or the World Championships for Wheelchair Tennis; or within the last 10 years was ranked in the top 50 of the USTA Professional Singles or Doubles Rankings.

Solely for purposes of an upcoming election, the term Elite Athlete shall not include any Elite Athlete who has been nominated and designated by the Nominating Committee as a person who is not an Elite Athlete. (See **Bylaw 35.c.**)

A person who qualifies as an Elite Athlete when elected or appointed shall retain this status as an Elite Athlete throughout the term of election or appointment.

The Executive Director shall maintain a current list of Elite Athletes that includes their names, addresses, phone numbers, and bases for qualification.

Board of Directors and Officers

- 27. Board of Directors.
 - Responsibilities. The Corporation shall be managed by its Board, which shall establish the policies and objectives of the Corporation.

The Board shall direct, review, and approve budgets as well as establish capital programs and review Corporation performance against goals, objectives, and budgets.

The Board shall adopt an investment policy.

Members of the Board shall serve without compensation and be individual members of the Corporation.

 Composition. The members of the Board shall be the five officers, the Immediate Past President, and nine at-large members.

At least 20 percent of the members of the Board shall be Elite Athletes. Excluding Elite Athletes, no more than two of the at-large members may be domiciled in the same section when they take office. Elite Athletes may be nominated for officer positions. A President who does not complete the term of office shall not, however, be a member of the Board as Immediate Past President unless confirmed by a majority of the other members of the Board. The Immediate Past President shall serve only two years beyond the elected term as President. A minimum of 50 percent of the Sectional Associations shall have a member on the Board. The domicile of an Elite Athlete shall not be considered when determining whether the 50 percent requirement is met.

- c. Nomination of representatives to ITF. The Board shall nominate to the International Tennis Federation (ITF) persons from the United States to serve on the Committee of Management of the ITF and shall appoint delegates to meetings of the ITF to represent the United States.
- d. Committees of the Board. The following are Committees of the Board:
 - Audit Committee;
 - Compensation Committee; and
 - Investment Committee.

The Secretary-Treasurer shall be a member of the Investment Committee. All other Committees of the Board members are appointed by the President.

- 28. Officers and Terms. The officers of the Corporation shall be a Chairperson of the Board and President ("President"), a First Vice President, two Vice Presidents, and a Secretary-Treasurer, all of whom shall serve without compensation. The titles of all officers may be changed by resolution of the Board, provided that there is adherence to the associated officers responsibilities. All officers take office on January 1 in odd-numbered years and serve for two-year terms or until their successors are elected and qualified. Each officer of the Corporation may be re-elected for an additional term or terms.
- 29. *President*. The President is the Chairperson of the Board. The President presides at all meetings of the membership, the Board, and the Governance Committee. The President appoints committee chairpersons and committee members whose appointments are not otherwise provided for in the Constitution or in these Bylaws. The appointees serve at the President's pleasure. Appointments of Elite Athletes to Designated Committees as defined in **Bylaw 41** are subject to the approval of the Elite Athletes who are members of the Board.
- 30. First Vice President. The First Vice President shall assist the President in the performance of the President's duties and shall exercise all the powers of the President in the case of the President's resignation, incapacity, removal, or death. The First Vice President shall preside over all meetings of the Corporation, the Governance Committee, or the Board at which the President is not present.
- 31. *Vice Presidents.* The Vice Presidents shall assist the President and the First Vice President in the performance of their duties.
 - 32. Secretary-Treasurer.
 - a. Financial management, budgeting, and controls. The Secretary-Treasurer shall monitor the financial management and controls of the Corporation and its budgeting process, including the development of its annual budgets; however, the operational responsibilities shall be carried out by the Chief Executive Officer, chief financial officer, and other staff members designated by the Chief Executive Officer. A nationally recognized firm of independent certified public accountants shall audit the Corporation's financial statements at least annually. The proposed two-year budget for the succeeding calendar years shall be distributed to the Board and the Governance Committee by August 15 of each odd-numbered year. A status report on the budget shall be distributed by August 15 of each even-numbered year. The Secretary-Treasurer shall be a member of the Investment Committee.
 - b. Membership records, certification of voting strength, and meetings. The Secretary-Treasurer shall monitor the keeping of membership records, the calculating of the voting strength of members, and the giving of notice and the keeping of minutes of meetings of the members, the Governance Committee, and the Board. The operational responsibilities shall be carried out by the Chief Executive Officer and those staff members

- designated by the Chief Executive Officer. The notices of these meetings shall be sent out under the name of the Secretary-Treasurer. The Secretary-Treasurer shall certify voting strength.
- c. Other duties. The Secretary-Treasurer shall perform such other duties as may be assigned by the President or the Board of Directors. The Secretary-Treasurer shall also perform the duties set out in **Bylaws 35.f. and g., 37, 38, and 39**.
- 33. Vacancies. If a vacancy shall occur in the officerships or on the Board, the remaining members of the Board may, by a majority vote, elect a successor for the unexpired term, except as otherwise provided in **Bylaw 35** and *except that* a vacancy in the office of the Immediate Past President shall not be filled. If a vacancy is in a non-Elite Athlete position, the remaining members of the Board shall vote to elect an individual to fill the vacant position. If a vacancy is in an Elite Athlete position, only the remaining Elite Athletes on the Board shall vote to elect an Elite Athlete to fill the vacant position.
- 34. Removal of Officers or Directors. At any meeting of the Board, any officer or member of the Board may, by a vote of not less than two-thirds of the entire Board, be removed for cause and a successor may be elected pursuant to the provisions of **Bylaw 33**, provided that Elite Athletes may only be removed for cause by a vote of not less than two-thirds of the total number of Elite Athletes then serving on the Board.

Nominations and Elections

- 35. Nominating Committee. Only candidates nominated as provided in this Bylaw shall be eligible for election.
 - a. Composition. The Nominating Committee shall be comprised of:
 3 Elite Athletes; and
 - 12 at-large members. (No more than two of the at-large members may be domiciled in the same section when they take office. At least one-half of the Sectional Associations shall have a member on the Nominating Committee.)

Nominating Committee members shall take office on January 1 of odd-numbered years and shall serve two-year terms. Five members of each Nominating Committee shall be nominated to serve for a second consecutive term. Up to four members who serve a second consecutive term may be at-large members, and up to two members may be Elite Athletes. If not enough Elite Athletes or at-large members are willing to serve a second consecutive term, the number nominated for a second consecutive term shall be equal to the number willing to serve, but in no event shall more than five members be nominated to serve for a consecutive term. The Chairperson of the Nominating Committee shall have been a member of the immediately preceding Nominating Committee, shall be elected by the immediately preceding Nominating Committee, and shall vote on all matters that come before the Committee.

b. Vacancies in Nominating Committee. If any vacancy occurs on the Nominating Committee before it has filed its report of nominations, the Board shall fill the vacancy. If the vacancy is in an at-large position, the Board shall appoint a person domiciled in the same section as the person unable to serve. If the vacancy is in an Elite Athlete position, the Elite Athletes on the Board shall appoint an Elite Athlete to the position.

If a vacancy should occur in the office of the Chairperson, the remaining members of the Nominating Committee shall select a Chairperson from the remaining members from the preceding Nominating Committee. If the Nominating Committee has filed its report of nominations, it shall not be necessary to fill any vacancy that thereafter occurs on the Committee.

- c. Nominations. The Nominating Committee shall nominate the officers, other members of the Board, and the members of the Nominating Committee. At least 20 percent of the Board and the Nominating Committee shall be comprised of Elite Athletes. If the Nominating Committee submits a slate that consists of more than 20 percent Elite Athletes on the Board or the Nominating Committee, it shall designate those Elite Athletes who are part of the 20 percent minimum and who are therefore voted on by Elite Athletes. (See Bylaw 26.)
- d. Nominating Committee members may not be nominated as officer or director. No member of the Nominating Committee may be nominated for election as an officer or Board member during the individual's term on the Nominating Committee, or any unexpired portion thereof, in the event of resignation from the Nominating Committee by such member.
- e. Two-term waiting period before return to Nominating Committee. A person who leaves the Nominating Committee other than an Elite Athlete may not return to the Nominating Committee until the person has been off the Committee for two full terms.
- f. Nominating report deadline. The Nominating Committee shall file its nominations no later than September 20 of each even-numbered year with the Secretary-Treasurer. A notice thereof shall be mailed by the Secretary-Treasurer to voting members and Elite Athletes no later than September 25 of such year.

- g. Vacancies in Nominating Committee's slate. If before election any person nominated dies, becomes incapacitated, declines nomination, or is otherwise disqualified, the vacancy in the nomination shall be filled as promptly as possible by the Nominating Committee. The name of the person selected shall be filled with the Secretary-Treasurer, who within five days thereafter shall notify the voting members and the Elite Athletes of the new nominee.
- h. Nominations by petition.
 - i. Sectional Associations. Sectional Associations having an aggregate vote of not less than one-third of the voting membership may submit a petition nominating persons to serve as officers, members of the Board, or at-large members of the Nominating Committee except that the Sectional Associations may not nominate a person who is not an Elite Athlete to run against a person who is an Elite Athlete.
 - ii. Elite Athletes. Not less than one-third of the Elite Athletes may submit a petition nominating Elite Athletes to serve on the Board or the Nominating Committee except that the Elite Athletes may not nominate a person who is an Elite Athlete to run against a person who is not an Elite Athlete.

Petitions shall be filed with the Secretary-Treasurer no later than October 15 of even-numbered years.

- President Elect. The person nominated as President by the Nominating Committee may use the designation of "President Elect" after the date for filing a nomination petition, if no petition is filed.
- 36. Election to Board and Nominating Committee. Only Elite Athletes shall vote on Elite Athletes. Only voting members shall vote on persons who are not Elite Athletes.
- 37. Election of Elite Athletes to Board and Nominating Committee. No later than October 25 of each even-numbered year, the Secretary-Treasurer shall send to the Elite Athletes a ballot for election of the Elite Athletes. The ballot shall list the Elite Athletes who are to be voted on by the Elite Athletes. Only those ballots received in the principal office of the Corporation by 5:00 p.m. EST on or before November 15 shall be counted. Those Elite Athletes receiving the most votes shall be elected.
- 38. Consent to Nominations. If no nominations are made by petition as provided in **Bylaw 35**, then the Secretary-Treasurer shall, no later than October 25 of each even-numbered year, send or cause to be sent to the voting members a consent to the election of those persons nominated by the Nominating Committee who are not Elite Athletes. Consents must be written, including electronic signatures. If all the consents are not executed and returned by 5:00 p.m. EST on November 15, the Secretary-Treasurer shall give or cause to be given notice of a meeting of the voting members for the purpose of electing the individuals nominated who are not Elite Athletes.
- 39. Election When Nominations Are Made by Petition by Sectional Associations. If pursuant to **Bylaw 35** the Sectional Associations file petitions to nominate one or more persons who are not Elite Athletes, the Secretary-Treasurer shall give or cause to be given notice of a meeting of the voting members for the purpose of voting. The meeting must be held between November 5 and November 20.

Committees

- 40. Committees of the Board and Committees of the Corporation.
 - a. Committees of the Board. The Board may, by resolution adopted by a majority of the entire Board, designate from its members Committees of the Board, each consisting of at least three members. Committees of the Board have the authority of the Board to the extent provided by Board resolution. The Audit Committee, Compensation Committee, and Investment Committee are Committees of the Board. The Board may establish an Executive Committee as a Committee of the Board.
 - b. Committees of the Corporation. In addition to the committees established in these Bylaws, the Board may also establish other non-Board committees ("Committees of the Corporation"). Each Committee of the Corporation has the responsibilities specified in the resolution creating the committee. Any committee not composed solely of members of the Board does not have the authority of the Board.

The following committees are Committees of the Corporation established in these Bylaws: Governance Committee; Nominating Committee; Sectional Presidents' Committee; Sectional Delegates' Committee; Grievance Committee; Olympic/Pan American Committee; and Past Presidents' Committee. Members of the Committees of the Board and Committees of the Corporation shall serve without compensation and be individual members of the Corporation.

- 41. Elite Athlete Membership on Designated Committees.
 - a. Designated Committees. Designated Committees means: nominating and budget committees;

panels empowered to resolve grievances; and

- committees which prepare, approve, or implement programs in the following areas:
 - expenditure of funds allocated by the United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee; and selection of international Olympic and Pan American Games team members, including athletes, coaches, administrators, and sports staff.
- Minimum membership requirement. At least 20 percent of the members of the Designated Committees shall be Elite Athletes.

42. Governance Committee.

- a. The Governance Committee is comprised of each member of the Board, a sectional delegate from each Sectional Association elected or appointed by such Sectional Association, each past president, not more than five other persons appointed by the President, and two leading players (a man and a woman) selected by the President with the advice and consent of the Board and after consultation with organizations representing the players. The Governance Committee shall meet not less than twice a year, at which meetings current matters involving the Corporation are reported upon and discussed and recommendations with respect to policies may be made to the Board. During all meetings of the Governance Committee, the voting strength of the past presidents shall not exceed the lesser of the number of past presidents present or five. If, at any meeting, more than five past presidents are present, the five votes are pro-rated among those present. If a past president is elected to some other office or as a sectional delegate, his or her vote on the Governance Committee is not included in the voting strength of the past presidents.
- b. Written notice of the time, place, and purpose of Governance Committee meetings must be given to each member not less than 10 days nor more than 50 days before a meeting. Notice may be by first-class mail, electronic mail, or facsimile, *provided* any member who requests notice by first-class mail must be given notice by this method.

43. Grievance Committee.

- a. Composition. The Grievance Committee shall be comprised of the number of members that the President appoints, of which at least 20% shall be Elite Athletes.
- b. Chairperson. The Chairperson shall preside at all Committee meetings and hearings. In the absence of the Chairperson or at the request of the Chairperson, the Vice Chairperson shall have the same powers as the Chairperson.
 - i. The Chairperson shall determine whether the Committee has jurisdiction;
 - ii. The Chairperson may investigate and render an Initial Decision;
 - iii. The Chairperson may assign to any Committee member the power to investigate and render an Initial Decision on a grievance or an appeal of a suspension and the Committee member shall have the powers as set forth in **Bylaw 43.f.**;
 - iv. The Chairperson, upon written request and good cause shown, may stay the imposition of any disciplinary action, penalty or suspension pending outcome of a request for a hearing before the Grievance Committee or an appeal to the Board or Arbitration Panel;
 - v. The Chairperson shall, in the event of a dispute, render the final Decision as to whether an appeal from a Decision of the Grievance Committee is subject to final and binding arbitration or falls under the jurisdiction of the Board.
- c. *Jurisdiction.* The Grievance Committee shall be responsible for investigating and deciding matters related to the following:
 - Unless specifically limited herein, the Constitution and the Bylaws and the standards of conduct, fair play, and good sportsmanship;
 - ii. Grievances arising out of or concerning tournaments as listed on the **USTA Regulation V.B.**;
 - iii. Grievances concerning USTA players participating in international competitions;
 - iv. Appeals from tournament suspensions imposed under the USTA Junior Suspension Point System as set forth in **USTA Regulation IV.F.10.**;
 - v. Appeals of Sectional Association tournament suspensions of six months or longer (two or more current suspensions may be aggregated to meet the jurisdictional requirement);
 - vi. Requests for reinstatement from professional to amateur status as provided in **USTA Regulation XVIII.E.**:
 - vii. Appeals from Decisions denying a request for a waiver of a **USTA Regulation** as provided in **USTA Regulation XX.**:

- viii. Matters referred to it by the Board:
- ix. As specifically set forth in **USTA Regulations**, as amended from time to time;
- d. Filing a Grievance or an Appeal of a Suspension. Any grievance or any appeal of a suspension must be in writing on the form designated by the Grievance Committee available at www.usta.com, and sent by first-class, certified, or registered mail to the Grievance Chairperson, c/o USTA Office of the General Counsel, 70 West Red Oak Lane, White Plains, New York 10604, within 30 days following the date on which the alleged grievance or final suspension occurred, except as provided in Bylaw 43.g.ii.; provided, however, if the alleged grievance is based on a falsification of age or other information, the written grievance must be mailed within 30 days after the Tournament Chairperson has been advised of such falsification. Absent good cause shown, grievances or appeals from suspensions not mailed within 30 days are barred.
- e. Timeline for a Grievance or Appeal of a Suspension. The Grievance Committee shall use best efforts to investigate, hear, and issue a Decision within 30 days of receipt of the Grievance, Suspension Appeal, or Appeal from an Initial Decision or Decision. The Chairperson may shorten or lengthen this timeline based on facts and circumstances.
- f. Investigation and Initial Decision on a Grievance **or** an Appeal from a Suspension.
 - i. Investigation and Initial Decision. The Chairperson, or the Committee Member assigned by the Chairperson as applicable, may decide any grievance filed or any appeal of a suspension based on such investigation as deemed appropriate (Initial Decision). The Chairperson, or the Committee Members assigned by the Chairperson as applicable, shall be free from conflicts of interest with respect to the matter. The Chairperson or the Committee Member shall use best efforts to investigate, hear, and issue an Initial Decision within 30 days of receipt. The Chairperson, or the Committee Member assigned by the Chairperson, may shorten or lengthen this timeline based on facts and circumstances.
 - iii. Relief or penalties authorized. Unless specifically limited herein, the Chairperson, or the Chairperson's designee, has the discretion to take the disciplinary action deemed appropriate. This includes, but is not limited to: issuing verbal or written reprimands; imposing conditions upon the acceptance of entry into any tournament; fining a player in an amount up to \$1,000.00; and suspending a player from participating or attending any tournament or international competition.
 - iii. Notice of Initial Decision. The Chairperson, or the Chairperson's designee, shall notify in writing the person who is the subject of the grievance and the person who filed the grievance of the Initial Decision, including but not limited to the Sectional Association in the case of an appeal involving a suspension by a Section.
 - iv. Effective date of Initial Decision. The Initial Decision shall become effective upon the earlier of date of mailing, the date of courier delivery or the date of confirmed electronic mail, unless otherwise stated or unless a stay is granted.
 - v. Hearing instead of Initial Decision. Instead of issuing an Initial Decision in accordance with Bylaw 43.f., the Chairperson may bring the matter directly to the Grievance Committee for hearing in accordance with the procedure in Bylaw 43.i.

g. Suspensions.

- i. Appeal involving suspension by Sectional Association. A player who has been suspended by a Sectional Association for a period of six months or longer and who has exhausted all appeals within the Sectional Association's grievance procedures may appeal the suspension to the Grievance Committee; provided, however, if a suspension prohibits play in:
 - USTA League play and Sectional Association Tournaments; or
 - USTA Junior Team Tennis play and Sectional Association tournaments; the Chairperson shall
 undertake review only as the penalty relates to tournaments.
- ii. Appeal of Suspension under USTA Junior Suspension Point System. A player suspended under the USTA Junior Suspension Point System may appeal to the USTA Grievance Committee in the time frame and in accordance with **USTA Regulation IV.F.10.**
- iii. Relief authorized. The Chairperson, or the Chairperson's designee, may consider any extenuating circumstances involved in the accumulation of points counted toward the suspension and may only modify a suspension or the accumulation of points.
- h. Appeal from an Initial Decision of a Grievance or Appeal from a Suspension. Within 30 days after the effective date of the Initial Decision, the person penalized or suspended, the person who filed the grievance, or the Sectional Association (but only in the case of a suspension by the Sectional Association) may mail to the Grievance Chairperson, c/o USTA Office of General Counsel, 70 West Red Oak Lane, White Plains, New York 10604, a written request for a hearing before the Grievance Committee. Absent good cause shown,

requests for a hearing not mailed within 30 days are barred.

- i. Grievance Committee Hearing.
 - The Committee shall hear matters pursuant to Bylaw 43.f.v., or from a timely appeal from an Initial Decision. The Chairperson and all Committee Members shall be free from conflicts of interest with respect to any matter they hear.
 - ii. Upon receipt of a timely request for hearing, the Chairperson shall set an appropriate time and place for a hearing considering the nature of the case and the penalty imposed. The Chairperson shall give not less than eight days written notice of the hearing date. The Chairperson shall decide whether the hearing is in person or by telephone. Requests for in person hearings, may be conditioned upon prior payment by the party requesting such hearing of the anticipated reasonable expenses of the Committee and interested parties. Committee members may participate in any hearing by telephone. Evidence may be presented by letter, by affidavit, by telephone, or in person. Strict rules of evidence shall not apply. The person penalized may appear in person, by telephone, or by representative and may present testimony and cross-examine other witnesses who appear at the hearing in person or by telephone.
 - iii. The committee member rendering the Initial Decision appealed shall not attend or participate in the Decision of the Committee. The Committee shall give such weight as it deems appropriate to the evidence. The Committee may affirm, modify, or reject the Initial Decision and may impose any additional penalties that it deems appropriate, including a fine in excess of \$1,000.00. The Committee shall prepare a written Decision that includes findings of fact and issue the Decision to the person penalized, the parties of the grievance or appeal of the suspension, the player's Sectional Association and such others as is appropriate.
- j. Appeal of Grievance Committee Decision.
 - i. Appeals involving participation in USTA competition or USTA program. When a grievance or appeal of a suspension involves participation in a USTA competition or USTA program, then the Organization Member, Individual Member, Honorary Member, or Sectional Association aggrieved by the Decision may appeal the Decision to the Board. The Sectional Association's right of appeal shall be limited to cases involving the suspension of a member or individual. The written appeal shall be mailed within 30 days after the date that the Decision was mailed. The appeal shall be addressed to the Chief Executive Officer c/o Office of the General Counsel, 70 West Red Oak Lane, White Plains, New York 10604. Absent good cause shown, written appeals not mailed within 30 days are barred. If an appeal is filed, the Decision of the Board shall be final and binding. If no appeal to the Board is filed, the Decision of the Grievance Committee shall be final and binding. Any Decision by the Board involving protected competitions under the Ted Stevens Olympic and Amateur Sports Act is subject to binding arbitration in accordance with Bylaw 62.
 - ii. Hearing before Board or Special Committee. In lieu of a hearing before the full Board, the President may appoint a Special Committee of not less than three Board members to hear an appeal. Any member of the Board or Special Committee shall be free from conflicts of interest with respect to any matter they hear. The Board or Special Committee shall thereupon review the findings of fact and the Decision of the Grievance Committee. The Board or Special Committee may make its Decision on the basis of the written submissions or may hear further testimony and receive further evidence as it deems appropriate. Following its review, the Board or Special Committee may affirm, modify, or reject the Decision of the Grievance Committee, but may not impose any harsher penalties. The Board or Special Committee shall use best efforts to issue the Decision within 30 days of receipt of the notice of appeal. The Decision of the Board or Special Committee shall be final and binding.
 - iii Appeals not involving participation in USTA competition or USTA program (e.g., governance or management). When a grievance does not involve participation in a USTA competition or USTA program, any Sectional Association, Organization Member, Individual Member, or Honorary Member aggrieved by the Decision may appeal the Decision to binding arbitration pursuant to **Bylaw 17** and in accordance with the Arbitration Procedures approved by the USTA Board. The written appeal shall be mailed within 30 days after the date that the Decision was mailed. The appeal shall be addressed to the Chief Executive Officer c/o Office of the General Counsel, 70 West Red Oak Lane, White Plains, New York 10604. Absent good cause shown, written appeals not mailed within 30 days are barred. If an appeal is filed, the Decision of the Arbitration Panel shall be final and binding. If no appeal for binding arbitration is filed, the Decision of the Grievance Committee shall be final and binding.
- k. Reinstatement. Any person who has been suspended pursuant to this Bylaw may be reinstated at any time by the Chairperson or Grievance Committee upon written application and presentation of satisfactory

- evidence that reinstatement is merited.
- Protected Competitions. The Corporation shall provide fair notice and opportunity for a hearing by the
 Grievance Committee to any athlete, coach, trainer, manager, administrator, or official before declaring any
 individual ineligible to participate in protected competitions or trials for protected competitions, such as the
 Olympic Games, Pan American Games, ParaPan American Games, Paralympic Games, or World University
 Games in accordance with the rules governing such competitions.
- m. USTA League grievances. There shall be no right to appeal Decisions of USTA League Grievance Appeal Committees to the Grievance Committee, except as such Decisions relate to a Sectional Association suspending a player from tournaments as set forth in Bylaw 43.q.i.
- n. USTA Junior Team Tennis grievances. There shall be no right to appeal Decisions of the USTA Junior Team Tennis Grievance Appeal Committee to the USTA Grievance Committee, except as such Decisions relate to a Sectional Association suspending a player from tournaments as set forth in Bylaw 43.g.i.
- 44. Sectional Presidents' Committee. The Sectional Presidents' Committee shall be comprised of the presidents of the Sectional Associations. The Sectional Presidents' Committee shall meet at least twice a year, at which meetings current matters affecting the Sectional Associations shall be reported upon and discussed. The Chairperson and such other officers as may be desired shall be elected by the Committee. If a president of a Sectional Association is unable to attend any meeting of the Committee, the Sectional Association may authorize a substitute to attend in the president's place.
- 45. Sectional Delegates' Committee. The Sectional Delegates' Committee shall be comprised of the sectional delegates elected or appointed by the Sectional Associations to the Governance Committee. The Sectional Delegates' Committee shall meet at least twice a year, at which meetings current matters affecting the Sectional Associations shall be reported upon and discussed. The Chairperson and such other officers as may be desired shall be elected by the Committee.
- 46. Past Presidents' Committee. The Past Presidents' Committee shall consist of all past Presidents of the Corporation. The Chairperson shall be the Immediate Past President. This Committee shall meet at each meeting of the Governance Committee.
- 47. Appointment of Committees and Duties of Committee Chairpersons. The President shall be an ex-officio member of all committees, except the Nominating, Sectional Presidents', Sectional Delegates', Past Presidents', and Grievance Committees. Except as otherwise provided, the President shall appoint the chairperson and the members of each committee, other than the Governance, Nominating, Past Presidents', Sectional Presidents', and Sectional Delegates' Committees. In the event of the President's failure to make such appointments, the Board shall do so. The chairperson of each committee shall preside at all committee meetings, be responsible for the functioning of the committee; and, unless the chairperson appoints a secretary to the committee, the chairperson shall be responsible for giving notice of all meetings and shall be responsible for keeping a record of its proceedings.
- 48. Appointment and Service on Committees. Except as otherwise provided, the chairpersons and members of all Committees of the Board are appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Board. Except as otherwise provided, the chairpersons and members of all Committees of the Corporation are appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the President.
- 49. *Meetings*. Meetings of the Board or of any committee are held at the time and place fixed by the President or the chairperson of the committee. One-half of the members of the Board or of any committee have the power to call a meeting.
- 50. Notice of Meetings. Meetings of the Board or any committee are held not less than 10 nor more than 50 days after notice to each member. Notice must be given by first-class mail, facsimile, or electronic mail. Notice of meetings may be waived by written or electronic waiver executed before or after the meeting. Attendance at a meeting constitutes waiver of notice.
- 51. *Quorum.* The following shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business by the Board and the following committees:

Board—not less than two-thirds of its members;

Governance Committee—not less than one-half of its members;

Nominating Committee—not less than 11 of its members;

Grievance Committee—not less than three-fifths of its members.

A quorum for the transaction of business for any other committee shall be not less than one-third of the members of the committee.

- 52. Action of Committee. Except as otherwise provided, whenever a quorum is present, the vote of a majority of the members present shall constitute the action of the committee. If in connection with any proposed new Bylaw or USTA Regulation a vote is conducted by telephone or mail, a majority of all committee members shall constitute the action of the committee.
- 53. *Minutes of Meetings*. The Board and all committees shall keep minutes of their proceedings, copies of which shall be sent by the Secretary-Treasurer, committee chairperson, or secretary to the Chief Executive Officer for filing with the records of the Corporation.

A summary of the minutes of each meeting of the Board shall be sent to each member of the Governance Committee and to each sectional president within 15 days after adjournment of the meeting at which the minutes are approved.

The results of any vote of the Board or of any committee shall be recorded in the minutes of the meeting of the Board or committee. Minutes should be reviewed and approved at the next meeting.

- 54. *Consents*. Any action required or permitted to be taken at any meeting of the Board or of any committee, other than the Grievance Committee or the Nominating Committee, may be taken without a meeting upon unanimous written consent. The written consent is filed with the minutes. Consents must be written, including electronic signatures.
- 55. *No Proxies.* No member of the Board or of any committee has the power to appoint a proxy to attend or to vote at any Board or committee meeting.
- 56. Telephone Conference Meetings. Members of the Board or of any committee may participate in a meeting by means of a conference telephone or similar communications equipment by means of which all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other, and participation in a meeting pursuant to this section shall constitute presence in person at such meeting.
- 57. Reimbursement of Expenses. On application for reimbursement, the Corporation shall, subject to its reimbursement policy, reimburse authorized persons (including, but not limited to, officers, members of the Board and of the Governance, Nominating, and Grievance Committees and the chairpersons of the Corporation's other committees designated by the President) reasonable amounts paid by such persons for authorized trips to meetings of such committees. Reimbursement shall be made for two meetings per year of the Governance Committee, the Nominating Committee, and the Grievance Committee, if held. In addition, the Board may authorize the reimbursement of reasonable amounts paid by any individual for travel or other expenses in connection with official Corporation business. The Board shall adopt a detailed written reimbursement policy that includes, but is not limited to, a specification of the types of reasonable expenses and definitions of reasonable expenses.
 - 58. Indemnification, Advancement of Expenses, and Insurance.
 - a. The Corporation shall indemnify any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending or completed action, suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative, by reason of the fact that such person, or such person's testator or intestate, is or was a director or officer of the Corporation, a committee member who is not a director or officer of the Corporation, or an employee or agent of the Corporation designated for indemnification by the Board, or is or was selected at the request of Corporation as a director, trustee, officer, employee or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trustee or other enterprise ("indemnified parties"), against expenses (including attorney's fees), judgments, fines and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by such person as a result of such action, suit, or proceeding to the full extent permitted by applicable law, upon such determination having been made as to such person's good faith and conduct as is required by applicable law.
 - b. Expenses incurred in defending a civil, criminal, administrative or investigative action, suit or proceeding shall be paid by the Corporation in advance of the final disposition of such action, suit or proceeding to the extent, if any, authorized by the Board in accordance with the provisions of applicable law, upon receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of the indemnified party to repay all or a portion of such amount if it shall ultimately be determined that such indemnified party is not entitled to be indemnified by the Corporation or that the expenses so advanced exceed the indemnification to which the indemnified party is entitled.
 - c. The Corporation may purchase and maintain insurance to indemnify the Corporation and the indemnified parties in a manner and to the fullest extent permitted by law.

Staff and General Counsel

59. Executive Director and Chief Executive Officer, Staff, and Consultants. The Executive Director is the Chief Executive Officer, who also may be given other titles as designated by resolution of the Board. The Chief Executive Officer is subject to the direction of the Board and is fully accountable to the Board. The Chief Executive Officer manages the day-to-day operational programs, policies, and procedures of the Corporation and the functioning of the office or offices of the Corporation.

The Chief Executive Officer is directly responsible for executing all Board decisions, contract processes, staff work for Board decisions, and performs additional duties as may be requested by the President or the Board. The Chief Executive Officer is directly responsible for the employment, supervision, and dismissal of all employees of the Corporation. The Corporation shall have executive managers and program and staff support as may be hired or appointed by the Chief Executive Officer.

The Chief Executive Officer carries out the operational responsibilities of financial management and controls the budgeting process including the development of its annual budgets, the keeping of membership records, the calculating of voting strength, and the giving of notice and keeping of minutes of meetings of the voting members, the Governance Committee, and the Board.

The Chief Executive Officer is hired by and serves at the pleasure of the Board. The Board sets the Chief Executive Officer's compensation. The Chief Executive Officer is an ex-officio member of all committees, except the Nominating Committee.

The Chief Executive Officer may execute all bonds, notes, debentures, mortgages, and other contracts requiring a seal, under the seal of the Corporation, may cause the seal to be affixed thereto, and may execute other contracts and instruments for and in the name of the Corporation.

The Chief Executive Officer shall be directly responsible to report to the Board any violation of the rules and regulations, keep records in the form prescribed by the Board, and report when requested by the Board.

- 60. Consultants. The Corporation shall have the authority to employ the services of a recognized firm of independent certified public accountants and such other legal, accounting, financial, and other consultants as may from time to time be appointed by the Board or by the President.
- 61. *General Counsel*. The General Counsel is the chief legal officer of the Corporation. The General Counsel reports directly to the Board on any assignment made by the Board. The Board sets the General Counsel's compensation. The General Counsel advises and represents the Corporation in all legal matters and proceedings, including legislative proceedings and designating those employees who are eligible to accept service of process on behalf of the Corporation. The General Counsel supervises the property, business, and affairs of the Office of the General Counsel. The General Counsel reports to the Chief Executive Officer and performs the duties and responsibilities designated by the Chief Executive Officer. The General Counsel shall be a member of the Bar in good standing or comply with in-house counsel requirements.

Arbitration

62. Arbitration under Sports Act. The Corporation agrees to submit, upon demand of the United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee, or upon demand of any Member who is protected under the Ted Stevens Olympic and Amateur Sports Act and who has exhausted the administrative remedies of the Corporation, to binding arbitration conducted in accordance with the commercial rules of the American Arbitration Association in any controversy involving its recognition as a national governing body, as provided for in the Ted Stevens Olympic and Amateur Sports Act or involving the opportunity of any amateur athlete, coach, trainer, manager, administrator, or official to participate in amateur athletic competition, as provided for in the United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee's Constitution and Bylaws.

63. Athlete Safety.

- a. Jurisdiction and Authority of U.S. Center for SafeSport. If any Member is alleged to have violated the Corporation's Safe Play Policy prohibiting sexual abuse or misconduct (see current edition of the USTA Safe Play Policy at www.usta.com), or if the Corporation receives a report that is required by the USOC to be referred to the U.S. Center for SafeSport ("Center"), the Center shall have exclusive jurisdiction and authority to investigate such allegation or report, to issue any interim suspension, to take any measures pending conclusion of the investigation, to make recommendations of sanctions or disciplinary action as a result of such investigation, and to adjudicate such matter according to the Center's procedures for adjudication; provided that, the duty to report to the Center and the Center's jurisdiction to investigate shall not supersede any local, state, or federal reporting requirements or jurisdiction.
- b. Appeal Rights. There shall be no appeal of any decision adjudicated by the Center except through arbitration as set forth in the Center's governing documents or the USOC's governing documents.
- Investigation or Disciplinary Process. Neither the Corporation nor any Member shall engage in its own investigation or disciplinary process related to any allegation or report that are within the exclusive jurisdiction of

- the Center. Upon the issuance by the Center of any interim suspension or other measures, or any other suspension or other sanction issued by the Center after conclusion of the adjudicative process, or by agreement with the party subject to suspension or other sanction, the Corporation and its Members shall enforce such suspension or other sanction issued by the Center even if arising from allegations outside of the Corporation's or Member's programs.
- d. Scope of Authority and Jurisdiction. The delegation of authority and jurisdiction to the Center as set forth above, and the restrictions on the Corporation and its Members, shall also include the investigation and issuance of sanctions related to allegations of other violations of the Corporation's Safe Play Policy (e.g., physical misconduct, emotional misconduct, bullying, harassment, and hazing) which involve sexual abuse or misconduct. Furthermore, in the Corporation's discretion, the Corporation may request the Center to accept jurisdiction of matters that do not involve allegations of sexual abuse or misconduct but do involve allegations of physical misconduct, emotional misconduct, bullying, harassment, or hazing.
- 64. Anti-Doping. The Corporation is committed to ensuring fair and drug free competition. Athletes bear the ultimate responsibility to compete fairly and drug free. Participation in USTA tournaments constitutes consent to be tested for drugs. Use of banned substances and doping methods may result in penalties, including suspension and permanent disqualification. It is the duty of all Members of the Corporation to comply with all anti-doping rules of the ITF, the World Anti-Doping Agency ("WADA"), World Anti-Doping Code ("WADA Code"), the U.S. Anti-Doping Agency ("USADA"), including the USADA Protocol for Olympic and Paralympic Movement Testing ("USADA Protocol"), and all other policies and rules adopted by the ITF, USADA, and the USOPC National Anti-Doping Policy. Members agree to submit to drug testing by the ITF and/or USADA or their designees at any time and understand that the use of methods or substances prohibited by the applicable anti-doping rules make them subject to penalties including, but not limited to, disqualification and suspension. If it is determined that a Member may have committed a doping violation, the Member agrees to submit to the Results Management Authority and processes of USADA, including arbitration under the USADA Protocol, or to the results management of the ITF or the Corporation, if applicable or referred by USADA. Members who fail to comply with these requirements face suspension or termination of their membership by the Corporation.
- 65. United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee Athletes' Advisory Council Representative and Alternate Representative. The United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee ("USOPC") has established a committee of athlete representatives referred to as the Athletes' Advisory Council ("USOPC AAC"). The Corporation's representatives shall be known as the USOPC AAC Representative and the USOPC AAC Alternate Representative.
 - a. Eligibility to be elected or appointed to serve as the Corporation's USOPC AAC Representative and the USOPC AAC Alternate Representative. The USOPC AAC Representative and the USOPC AAC Alternate Representative shall be of the opposite gender. Unless a USOPC AAC Representative is still competing and receiving benefits from the Corporation or the USOPC, a USOPC AAC Representative cannot be a paid employee of the Corporation or the USOPC and simultaneously serve on the USOPC AAC. The representatives shall be USOPC Eligible Voters who have not exceeded the term limit ("USOPC Eligible Athlete").
 - b. Term. A term shall begin with the first meeting of the USOPC board after the Summer Olympic Games and shall extend until the first meeting of the board following the next Summer Olympic Games. This time period is called a Quadrennium. A USOPC Eligible Athlete may serve as the USOPC AAC Representative for a maximum of two terms. If the USOPC AAC Alternate Representative replaces the USOPC AAC Representative and attends over one-half of the meetings in a Quadrennium, then one term shall be deemed to have been served.
 - c. Election by USOPC Eligible Voters. Every four years representatives shall be elected by those athletes who represented the United States in the Olympic, Paralympics, Pan American, or Parapan American Games; World Championships; Davis Cup; Fed Cup; World Team Cup; or an event designated as an Operation Gold event by the USOPC within the preceding ten years as measured from the first USOPC AAC meeting of the Quadrennium ("USOPC Eligible Voters").
 - d. USOPC AAC Election Committee. The USOPC AAC Election Committee shall be comprised of the Chairperson of the Olympic/Pan American Committee, the Corporation's staff person who is a member of the Olympic/Pan American Committee, and the current USOPC AAC Representative (or if the USOPC AAC Representative is unable to serve, then the USOPC AAC Alternate Representative). The Committee shall oversee the nominations and election of the USOPC AAC Representative and the USOPC AAC Alternate Representative.
 - e. Nomination procedure. No later than in the year preceding a Quadrennium, the USOPC AAC Election Committee shall send a letter to each USOPC Eligible Voter requesting nominations. The letter shall contain:
 - a description of the duties and operation of the USOPC AAC;
 - the Corporation election procedure;

- the eligibility criteria:
- a list of the USOPC Eligible Athletes;
- the deadline for the nominations: and
- a nomination form that shall include a line for the athlete to self-nominate and attest to willingness to serve.
 The Board shall set the date that nominations are due.

f. Election procedure.

- The USOPC Election Committee shall mail a ballot listing the USOPC Eligible Athletes to the USOPC AAC Eligible Voters. The ballot shall state that all ballots are due at the USTA office no later than 5:00 p.m. EST on a date set by the Board;
- ii. The Committee shall tally the votes received by the deadline. The USOPC Eligible Athlete who receives the highest number of votes shall be the USOPC AAC Representative. The athlete of the opposite gender who receives the highest number of votes for that gender shall be the USOPC AAC Alternate Representative.
- iii. If there is a tie, the President shall cast the deciding vote.
- iv. If no votes are cast, the President shall appoint the USOPC AAC Representative and the USOPC AAC Alternate Representative.
- g. Resignation or removal. If a USOPC AAC Representative resigns or is removed, the USOPC AAC Alternate Representative shall serve as the USOPC AAC Representative. A new USOPC AAC Alternate Representative of the opposite gender shall be elected following the procedures established in this Bylaw.
- h. *Grievance procedure.* Any grievance that arises out of this Bylaw shall be filed in accordance with the procedures established in **Bylaw 43**.

Adoption and Amendment of Bylaws and USTA Regulations

- 66. *Bylaws*. These Bylaws shall be subject to amendment, and new bylaws not inconsistent with any provision of the Constitution may be adopted, by the affirmative vote of a majority of the voting members present at any meeting of the voting members, *provided* notice of the proposed amendment be included in the notice of the meeting.
- 67. Process for submitting Amendment of Bylaws. A proposed new bylaw or amendment may be submitted only by a Sectional Association (through its president or secretary), by a member of the Governance Committee, by the Board, or by a committee (through its chairperson). A committee may only submit a proposed new bylaw or amendment if the committee, by a majority vote, has voted to submit the proposal. The chairperson shall forward the proposal to the Secretary-Treasurer and shall circulate it to such other bodies as the committee may direct.

All proposals shall be submitted in writing to the Secretary-Treasurer at least 90 days before the meeting at which they are to be considered. However, if notice is provided to all sectional delegates at least 15 days before that meeting, any proposal concerning a matter of extreme urgency that could not have been foreseen 90 days before the meeting may be considered, provided such proposal be determined to be of extreme urgency by a majority vote of the members present and voting.

- 68. *USTA Regulations*. USTA Regulations not inconsistent with the Constitution or these Bylaws, setting forth rules, regulations, and policies of the Corporation may be adopted and amended by the voting members, Governance Committee, or Board. Amendments to the USTA Regulations shall be adopted in accordance with **USTA Regulation XIX**. Amendments to the USTA Regulations adopted by the Governance Committee or Board, shall be subject to the approval, disapproval, or amendment at the next annual, semiannual, or special meeting of the voting members upon the request of voting delegates at the meeting with sufficient aggregate vote strength to constitute a majority vote of the membership.
- 69. Gender and titles of Chairpersons. All references to the male gender in the Constitution, Bylaws, and USTA Regulations shall refer to and mean equally the female gender, and the singular shall include the plural, each where the context so indicates.

Any chairperson or vice chairperson may use any commonly recognized title such as "chairperson," "chairman," "chairwoman," or "chair."

70. Stylistic and conforming changes. The Chairperson of the Constitution and Rules Committee in consultation with the Corporation Legal Department may make language and stylistic changes considered advisable by them to implement the intent of the Bylaws and USTA Regulations and may make conforming changes required to avoid inconsistencies or conflicting provisions. The Chairperson of the Constitution and Rules Committee shall inform the Governance Committee of language, stylistic, and conforming changes.



The US Open showcased the sport of tennis to a record number of fans in 2019. Over the course of three weeks—beginning with US Open Fan Week, followed by the two-week Main Draw event—total attendance surpassed 850,000 for the first time in tournament history, with 853,227 fans coming to the USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center.

US Open Fan Week, the tennis and entertainment festival that helps raise awareness of the US Open and drives attendance, gave fans of all ages the opportunity

to experience the excitement and atmosphere of the US Open for free. Fan Week kicked off on Monday, August 19, with the US Open Qualifying Tournament, which for the first time offered more than \$3.5 million in prize money, nearly a 20 percent increase over 2018 (and a doubling of prize money over the past four years). The fifth-biggest tennis tournament in the U.S., the Qualifying Tournament was expanded to five days—beginning a day earlier than in previous years—to allow for greater scheduling flexibility in case of weather issues, as well as to broaden its role as the anchor of Fan Week. A record total of 115,355 fans came through the facility's gates over the seven days of Fan Week.

Along with the Qualifying Tournament, Fan Week highlights included fan access to player practices in Arthur Ashe Stadium for the first time; top ATP Tour and WTA players participating in Featured Practices in the Grandstand; Doubles Clinics and Legends Matches with tennis greats such as Tracy Austin, Jim Courier, Lindsay Davenport, John McEnroe, Martina Navratilova and Andy Roddick; the US Open Draw Ceremony, which was staged for the public on the US Open grounds for the first time; US Open Media Day, with fans in Louis Armstrong Stadium invited to watch the media interview leading players; a US Open Pride Panel Discussion, presented in association with the Billie Jean King Leadership Initiative; a nightly Heineken Happy Hour; Chase Sound Check evening concerts in the South Plaza; a new Net Generation Kids' Zone in Backyard Court 17; and the 24th annual Arthur Ashe Kids' Day, whose stadium show included guest artists Blanco Brown

and Meg Donnelly, who co-hosted the show with JD McCrary and Radio Disney's Morgan.

When the Main Draw event began on Monday, August 26, the tournament continued its tradition of combining sports and enter-

tainment and using its global stage to champion key initiatives and beneficial causes. On Opening Day, the USTA honored trailblazer and tennis great Althea Gibson by unveiling the tournament grounds' newest attraction, the Althea Gibson Sculpture Garden, located in front of

Arthur Ashe Stadium. That evening, Broadway came to Ashe Stadium as part of the Opening Night Ceremony, in which Grammy, Emmy and Tony Award—winning actor and singer Ben Platt performed on center court and Tony Award—winner Ali Stroker sang the national anthem. Billie Jean King also took part in the festivities before Serena Williams and Maria Sharapova put on a show of their own, playing each other for the first time ever at the US Open. Opening Night also featured the USTA Foundation's 19th annual Opening Night Gala, which raised more than \$1.2 million for the Foundation.

All told, Opening Day drew a record 41,050 for the day session and concluded with more than 68,000 fans visiting the US Open grounds (27,009 attended the evening session) for the highest-ever Opening Day daily gate. The 2019 US Open also set a tournament mark for a night session, when 29,053 fans attended the evening matches on Saturday, August 31. The next day, the tournament established a record for first-week attendance with 481,508 fans.

Special events added to the fans' US Open experience, including the annual US Open Food-Tasting Preview with celebrity chefs; Kim Clijsters's induction into the US Open Court of Champions on Wednesday, August 28; the renaming of Military Appreciation Day on Monday, September 2, in honor of Lt. Joe Hunt, who in 1945 became the only U.S. Nationals or US Open champion to lose his life in service to his country; and the honoring of Rod Laver on Friday, September 6, during an Ashe Stadium ceremony in which he was presented with a plaque by representatives from each of the four Grand Slam tournaments in tribute to his second Grand Slam, which he completed at the 1969 US Open. In-stadium entertainment also made the tournament more fan-friendly. For the first time, specialized LED screens surrounded the backwalls and sidewalls of Ashe Stadium, allowing the entertainment to be amplified prior to matches, during changeovers and in the middle of set breaks.

Ninety-seven percent of the US Open attendees rated their overall experience as "Good," "Very Good" or "Excellent." Half of the attendees came to the tournament for more than one session, and 85 percent of the fans stayed at their session for five hours or more.

The 2019 US Open averaged 1.28 million viewers across ESPN and ESPN2, up 23 percent compared to 2018, which is the largest-ever average audience for the US Open on ESPN, as well as the largest cable audience since 2001. The women singles final averaged 3.3 million viewers, and the five-set men's singles final telecast averaged 2.8 million viewers. Additionally, coverage of the men's singles semifinals averaged 1.5 million viewers, up 20 percent compared to 2018. The average audience on ESPN and ESPN 2 increased on 13 of the 14 days of the Main Draw, and 28 of the 29 live telecasts were up year over year.

In total, the 2019 US Open on ESPN and ESPN2 reached 44 million people, and Time Spent Viewing also increased by 12 percent. ESPN networks aired 178 total hours of coverage during the three weeks of the US Open. Also, more than 1,300 hours streamed live on the ESPN app, featuring all 11 court feeds, and the new US Open Now channel, which debuted as a digital-first lifestyle companion show, as well as daily press conference and Spanish-language feeds. Worldwide, the tournament was broadcast in more than 200 countries and territories, with global coverage totaling 76,129 hours.

The tournament's official digital properties, USOpen.org and the US Open app, resulted in 40 million visits and 15.6 million content views, a 35 percent increase over 2018. US Open social channels drove record engagement across all platforms with 321 million total interactions and video views, a 72 percent gain over 2018. On Facebook and Instagram, there was a 115 percent increase in interactions over the previous year. US Open Radio, which featured improved user experience across owned and operated platforms. provided 24-hour coverage for the first time and had a quarter of a million unique listeners. A total of 1,346 media credentials were issued to representatives from 49 countries. The 2019 US Open aimed to create an impactful message to help change a statistic that showed only four percent of media coverage featured female athletes. Partnering with the women's equality organization, ShelS, as well as other sports entities around the country, the USTA designed a campaign that invited fans to take matters into their own hands and help change the way women athletes are seen not only in tennis, but in all sports. The USTA also celebrated the 12th year of its US Open sustainability initiative to drive global climate awareness and action.

All the while, the 2019 US Open provided an opportunity to strengthen the tournament's new brand story, capitalize on the momentum and excitement of the 2018 US Open and propel the event into the future. Keeping the "Built for Glory" tagline from 2018,

the advertising campaign evolved from looking back on US Open history to focusing on the present and what is to come. The creative was enhanced with a new design and new "Built" adaptations and expanded with new high-impact, out-of-home opportunities.


The 2019 US Open offered the richest purse in the history of the sport, with total compensation for the players topping \$57 million, including a record \$3.85 million to both the men's and women's singles champions. Throughout the Main Draw, the tournament's headlines were filled with upsets and up-and-comers. None of the four top-seeded women made it through the first week, marking the first time in either the women's or men's field that all four of the top seeds failed to advance to the quarterfinals, while rising young stars such as 15-year-old phenom Coco Gauff created a great deal of excitement.

History loomed over the entire tournament as Serena Williams reached the women's singles final in pursuit of her elusive 24th Grand Slam singles title, seeking to tie the all-time mark held by Margaret Court. But in the women's singles title match, Williams came up against Bianca Andreescu, a supremely talented teenager with a surprisingly mature game, and fell short of making major history. Adding to the record books did not elude Rafael Nadal, however. In a grueling, utterly compelling and intense four-hour, 49-minute slugfest against Daniil Medvedev, Nadal held on for a five-set victory in the men's singles final to earn his fourth US Open title of the decade and his 19th major title overall. Meanwhile, three U.S. players came away with titles at the 2019 US Open: Bethanie Mattek-Sands, who teamed up with Jamie Murray to successfully defend their mixed doubles title, and Eliot Spizziri and Tyler Zink, who captured the boys' doubles crown.

Kicking off the second 50 years of US Open tennis, the 2019 US Open closed out the Grand Slam tournament calendar as it always does—in memorable fashion.





US OPEN SERIES



Serving up the best of summer, the US Open Series brought together the world's leading players on the WTA and ATP Tour in its 16th season, linking seven WTA and ATP Tour tournaments to the US Open. Forming a true summer

season of North American tennis, the Series in 2019 featured a cohesive schedule that not only allowed for appointment television, but also centralized the way tennis is viewed in North America, across multiple television and digital platforms. Fans saw top champions go head-to-head with emerging stars for five consecutive mid-summer weeks.

Since its inception in 2004, the US Open Series has been responsible for the introduction of cutting-edge innovations in the sport, including instant replay technology and "US Open" blue tennis courts for improved visibility of the ball. The Series also has helped to grow the game by making it possible for the next generation of tennis talents to compete against the tours' best players and see if they have what it takes to succeed at the sport's highest level.

In 2019, each US Open Series tournament had activities in place to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the National Junior Tennis and Learning (NJTL) network. These activities

included honoring local NJTL chapters with a wide range of Net Generation experiences, including high school days, kids' tennis clinics, on-court demonstrations, coin tosses and player escorts. Each tournament also engaged its

local community with such experiences as adult league initiatives, Hispanic community outreach and player appearances that help attract new players and fans. Through these efforts, the Series supported the USTA mission "to promote and develop the growth of tennis" both on and off the court.

Bianca Andreescu and Daniil Medvedev were named the Breakout Performers of the 2019 US Open Series. Following the Series, Andreescu captured the women's singles title and Medvedev reached the men's final at the 2019 US Open.

In November, it was announced that the new WTA event to be hosted in Albany, N.Y., the week prior to the US Open, as well as the Hall of Fame Open in Newport, R.I., are officially joining the US Open Series. In becoming part of the Series, the Newport event will kick off the 2020 summer tennis season and also connect the US Open with its original home.


USTA PRO CIRCUIT



The USTA Pro Circuit serves as America's main pathway for men and women who seek to compete at the highest levels of professional tennis. Formed in 1979 to provide additional competitive opportunities on American soil for players who aspire to earn the professional ranking points needed to gain entry into the higher-level tournaments, the USTA Pro Circuit has since grown into the largest Pro Circuit in the world.

In 2019, the USTA Pro Circuit offered more than \$4 million in

prize money and served up five times as many tournaments in the United States as the ATP Tour and the WTA tour combined. Tommy Paul was the American man who earned the most ATP ranking points on the 2019 USTA Pro Circuit (295), followed by J.J. Wolf (231) and Marcos Giron (215). Ann Li led the American women in WTA ranking points earned on the 2019 USTA Pro Circuit (330), edging past Whitney Osuigwe (328) and Usue Arconada (311).

DAVIS CUP



In 2019, Davis Cup, the premier international team event in men's tennis, introduced a new World Cup-like format that kicked off in February with a preliminary round of 12 head-to-head matches hosted by national federations. The winners of those home-and-away matches—along with the previous year's semifinalists and two wild-card nations—then advanced to the 18-team Davis Cup by Rakuten Finals, which were played November 18-24 at La Caja Magica in Madrid, Spain.

The United States earned an automatic entry into the 2019 Davis Cup Finals by virtue of its semifinal finish in 2018, which marked the end of Jim Courier's eight-year tenure as U.S. Davis Cup captain. His replacement—former world No. 7 player and Davis Cup veteran Mardy Fish—was named in January 2019.

"Ever since I started playing professionally and started understanding what the Davis Cup was and how special it was, even as a player, I wanted to be the Davis Cup captain," said Fish, who became the 41st captain in the team's 120-year history but had to wait 10 months for the Davis Cup Finals to begin before he could make his debut courtside for Team USA.

The 18 nations taking part in the 2019 Davis Cup Finals were divided into six round-robin groups of three teams each, with the winner of each group and the two top-finishing second-place teams advancing to the knockout quarterfinal stage. Each tie consisted of two singles and one doubles match, all best-of-three tiebreak sets. The U.S., as the No. 6-seeded nation, was placed in Group F, to which Italy and Canada were also drawn.

To represent the United States in the 2019 Finals, Fish picked two Davis Cup newcomers: Taylor Fritz and Reilly Opelka, whose respective world rankings of No. 31 and No. 37 made them the top-ranked members of the squad. Joining them on Team USA were Sam Querrey, Frances Tiafoe and Jack Sock.

The United States opened its group play on November 19 against Canada, with Fish calling on his two rookies, Opelka and Fritz, to play singles, and tiebreaks featured prominently in both

of their matches. Opelka faced Vasek Pospisil in the opening contest and served 28 aces, but fell short in two tiebreak sets, 7-6(5), 7-6(7). A tiebreak also decided the first set in Fritz's match against Denis Shapovalov, who won the set, 7-6(6), and then captured the second set, 6-3, to give Canada an insurmountable 2-0 lead in the tie, as well as its first victory over the United States in 16 tries. The doubles point went to Team USA when Sam Querrey and Jack Sock won in a walkover.

The next afternoon, the United States faced Italy, with both teams seeking one of the quarterfinal spots available to second-place Group teams. Fabio Fognini defeated Opelka in the opener, 6-4, 6-7(4), 6-3, before Fritz evened the score with an upset victory over Matteo Berrettini, 5-7, 7-6(5), 6-2—effectively ending either nation's chance of advancing to the quarterfinals before the decisive doubles match was played.

Even so, both the Americans—Querrey and Sock—and the Italians—Fognini and Simone Bolelli—did not let up when the doubles teams took the court at 1:15 a.m. Neither side could generate a break of serve in the first two sets. The Italians won the first set tiebreak, 7-6(4), and the Americans captured the second set tiebreak, 7-6(2). In the third and final set, Italy finally earned a break for a 3-1 lead, but Querrey and Sock broke back, then broke again at 4-4 and served out the match to give the United States a second-place finish in Group F, behind Canada, in the first Davis Cup under the new format.

"They were firing on all cylinders for a while; so we had to stay with it," said Sock. "We could have gotten down, especially at this time of night. Just happy we regrouped."

The match ended at 4:04 a.m. and was the latest-finishing match in Davis Cup history. In fact, it was the second latest finish of all-time, surpassed only by a match between Lleyton Hewitt and Marcos Baghdatis at the 2008 Australian Open that ended at 4:34 a.m. Most of all, it reminded observers near and far how Davis Cup can bring out the very best in players when they compete for their countries.

FED CUP



The United States began 2019 intent on advancing to the Fed Cup Final for the third consecutive year. In 2017, under the guidance of first-year captain Kathy Rinaldi, the U.S. Fed Cup team won the Fed Cup championship for a record 18th time. In 2018, Team USA again reached the Fed Cup Final, only to cede the crown to Czech Republic.

Ready to regain the title in 2019, the U.S. Fed Cup team opened its campaign on February 9-10 at the U.S. Cellular Center in Asheville, N.C., where it hosted Australia in a World Group first-round matchup. The tie made the Asheville arena the first site in the U.S. to host consecutive Fed Cup ties since the Delray Beach Tennis Center in Delray Beach, Fla., in 2005-07. It also brought together two longtime rivals. The United States had defeated Australia in the first Fed Cup Final in 1963, and the two nations had faced one another 14 times over the years, although only once since 1985, in a 2016 World Group Playoff in Brisbane. Australia.

The 2019 first-round tie in Asheville marked Australia's first World Group appearance in four years, and Australia captain Alicia Molik and her squad embraced the opportunity. Ashleigh Barty opened the tie with a 6-1, 7-6(2) win over Sofia "Sonya" Kenin. Next, Madison Keys leveled the score by defeating Kimberly Birrell, 6-2, 6-2, to set up a climactic second day of competition.

When Day 2 got underway, Barty restored Australia's lead with a 6-4, 6-1 victory over Keys. The tie became knotted once again when Danielle Collins, substituting for Kenin, recorded her first win in Fed Cup by besting Daria Gavrilova, 6-1, 3-6, 6-2, to set up a winner- take-all doubles match for the decisive point. Barty, who teamed with Priscilla Hon, became the first player to win three points in a Fed Cup tie against the United States since Caroline Garcia of France in the 2014 World Group Playoff when the Aussies defeated Collins and Nicole Melichar, 6-4, 7-5, to clinch the tie. Australia ultimately advanced to the 2019 Fed Cup Final, which was won by France, 3-2.

For Team USA, the 3-2 loss to Australia meant that instead of advancing to the semifinal round, it entered the World Group

Playoffs, with a spot in the World Group in 2020 on the line. For its opponent, the United States drew Switzerland. The United States entered the tie with an 8-0 record against Switzerland, although the two nations had not met since 1993, when they played in Frankfurt, Germany. Six of their other encounters were also contested at a neutral site, as Fed Cup was held at a single location rather than home or away sites until 1995. The only time either nation enjoyed a home-court advantage was in 1976, when the event was staged in Philadelphia in honor of America's bicentennial year.

The 2019 tie between the United States and Switzerland was staged on April 20-21 at the Freeman Coliseum in San Antonio, Texas, and marked the U.S. Fed Cup team's first appearance in the Lone Star State. Team USA experienced an early scare when Viktorija Golubic swept past Madison Keys, 6-2, 6-3, to start things off. Sloane Stephens evened the tie with a 6-4, 6-3 win over Timea Bacsinszky and then gave the Americans the lead on Day 2 with a 6-3, 6-2 victory against Golubic. Rinaldi then subbed Kenin, who was originally nominated to play doubles, for the fourth rubber, and Kenin wrapped up the tie for the United States with a 6-3, 7-6(4) win over Bacsinszky.

"We have confidence in everybody, and we're one team. And when one player is down, another player picks up, and that's what Sonya and Sloane did this weekend," Rinaldi said after the tie, which ended at 3-2 when Conny Perrin and Ylena In-Albon defeated Jessica Pegula and Jennifer Brady, 7-5, 6-2, in a dead doubles match.


In June 2019, the ITF announced that Fed Cup was undergoing a restructuring and would feature a "World Cup of Tennis" format beginning in 2020. The competition was slated to kick off with 16 teams competing in eight home-and-away Fed Cup Qualifiers and would culminate in the Fed Cup Finals, with 12 teams—the previous year's two finalists, the host nation, a wild card nation and the eight winners of the Fed Cup Qualifiers—competing during one week at a single location. By winning its 2019 World Group Playoffs, the United States earned a spot in the 2020 Fed Cup Qualifiers.









USTA LEAGUE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS



USTA League, the nation's largest recreational tennis league, celebrated its 39th year in 2019. Developed and piloted in 1978 and given national status in 1980, USTA League provides adult recreational tennis players with the opportunity to compete against players of similar ability levels. USTA League totaled more than 310,000 participants in 2019.

The 2019 USTA League season culminated in the USTA League National Championships, which were spread among four locations during the course of seven weeks, from Oct. 4 through Nov. 17. Each national championship division had men's and women's

teams representing each of the 17 USTA sections, and 14 different sections captured titles at NTRP levels ranging from 2.5 to 5.0+, as well as doubles-only teams ranging from 2.5 (individual NTRP) to 6.0 through 10.0 (combined NTRP). More than 6,660 players competing on nearly 600 different teams participated in the fall USTA League Championships. A total of 36 national championship titles were awarded, generating a flood of social media activity—more than 7 million impressions across Facebook, Instagram and Twitter.

The NTRP National Championships were launched in 2018 and leverage the National Tennis Rating Program (NTRP) rating system to create level-based competition at the 18 & Over and 50 & Over age groups. Competitors in the NTRP National Championships represent their sections, qualifying for the national event either through sectional playoffs, their sectional rankings or other means of sectional endorsement. The NTRP National Championships feature round-robin draws that lead into non-elimination playoffs.

A best-of-three-short-sets format is played, with no-ad scoring and a nine-point tiebreak at three-all.

In 2019, the 18 & Over championships were held at Academia Sánchez-Casal Florida in Naples, Fla., with the singles taking place March 29-31 and the doubles played April 5-7. The 50 & Over championships were held at the Surprise Tennis & Racquet Complex in Surprise, Ariz., with the singles contested March 29-31 and the doubles April 5-7.

USTA TENNIS ON CAMPUS NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP



Tennis On Campus is the USTA's program for college club tennis players. It has been designed for and organized by college students who want to stay involved in the game, make friends and compete in events all around the country. Over 400 colleges and universities participate and compete in the program, with more than half of them competing to make it to the National Championship. Originally developed by the USTA in partnership with the National Intramural Recreational Sports Association, World TeamTennis and the Intercollegiate Tennis Association, Tennis On Campus has been enabling college students across the country to enjoy the excitement of tennis through coed team play since 2000.

The 2019 USTA Tennis On Campus National Championship featured a 64-team field and was held April 11-13 at the Surprise Tennis & Racquet Complex in Surprise, Ariz. In an all-California final, the University of California—Los Angeles defeated the University of California—Berkeley, 23-22, after trailing, 19-17, heading into the fifth and decisive mixed doubles set. For the Bruins of UCLA, who had finished in the top five the past two years, it was their second national championship; they won their first title in 2011. The Golden

Bears of California were looking to capture their fifth national championship, having won its most recent crowns back-to-back in 2014-15. Seven schools made their Tennis On Campus National Championship debut: Lone Star College—CyFair, the University of Texas—Dallas, the U.S. Air Force Academy, the U.S. Naval Academy, Valley City State University, Winona State University and Wesleyan University.

USTA Tennis On Campus also stages a pair of national invitational events each year: the Spring Invitational, which complements the National Championship, and the Fall Invitational, which serves as a national kickoff tournament. At the 2019 Spring Invitational, held March 29-31 at the USTA National Campus in Orlando, Fla., the University of Georgia, which was the national champion in 2013 and winner of the Fall Invitational in 2015 and 2018, defeated Boston University for its first Spring Invitational title. At the 2019 Fall Invitational, held November 1-3 at Cary Tennis Park in Cary, N.C., Cornell University defeated fellow first-time Fall Invitational finalists North Carolina State University to claim the championship.

USTA JUNIOR TEAM TENNIS



USTA Junior Team Tennis, the largest youth tennis program in the country, was established in 1991 to provide girls and boys with

all of the health and social benefits of tennis in a coed, fun and competitive team environment. For kids ages 6 to 18, USTA Junior Team Tennis enables them to play the sport with friends and against individuals of similar ages and skill level by bringing them together on teams

and having them compete in singles, doubles and mixed doubles against other teams. Teams are coed and made up of at least six players (three boys and three girls) based on similar ages and skill levels, with more than 85,000 players participating nationwide.

The emphasis is on skill development, fun, teamwork and friendly competition, all with the possibility of advancing to the crown

jewel of the USTA Junior Team Tennis season—the National Championships. Teams compete for a national championship at intermediate and advanced skill levels in two divisions: 14 and under, and 18 and under.

The 2019 USTA Junior Team Tennis National Championships were held at the McFarlin Tennis Center in San Antonio, Texas. The 14-and-under divisions played November 7-10, while the 18-and-under divisions competed November 14-17.

Upon request, the USTA will test tennis ball brands that are "generally available" in the United States for compliance with the Rules of Tennis specifications upon: 1) payment of the prescribed testing fee, and 2) the manufacturer's agreement to make no claim other than "USTA Approved" accompanied by the approved USTA logo (a registered trademark).

Approval

The ball used in USTA-sanctioned tournaments and leagues must be on the list of balls approved by the USTA in that tournament year or must be otherwise authorized by the USTA. For a published listing of approved tennis balls, visit usta.com and then follow the links to Organize > Program Resources > Resources & Tools > USTA Approved Tennis Balls.


