1.00 GENERAL The Regulations in 1.00 GENERAL in conjunction with USTA National and USTA Southern regulations shall apply to all League Divisions (Adult and Mixed); as well as Southern Combo and Tri-Level.

1.02 Governance

- **1.02A Waiver of Rules and Procedures Prohibited** Printed below are the Lafayette Regulations as authorized by the USTA League Tennis Regulations, USTA Southern Section Regulations, and USTA Louisiana Regulations.
- **1.02B Amendments** Local League Coordinators may amend these Lafayette Regulations with approval from the Acadiana Community Tennis Association Local Leage Council.
- **1.02C Written Interpretation** The Local League Coordinators and/or Local League Council shall have the authority to interpret the Lafayette Regulations.

1.04B Administration.

- **1.04B(3)c Local League Coordinators.** The Board of Directors of the local Community Tennis Associations are responsible for promoting the USTA League Programs in their area. Local League Coordinators are responsible for implementing and administering the USTA League Programs in their area.
- **1.04B(3)c(i)** League Code of Ethics. All league administrators will adhere to the USTA Southern Section League Tennis Officials Code of Ethics (http://www.southern.usta.com/USA-League-Tennis-Pages/9305_USTA_Southern_Section_League_Tennis_Officials_Code_of_Ethics__As_of_21804/)
- **1.04B(3)c(ii)** League Coordinator Responsibilities. Establish procedures and regulations for all aspects of their local league that are not covered by the national, sectional or state regulations. A copy of the local regulations must be submitted to the State/District League Coordinator for review prior to the league's team captain's meeting.

1.04B(3)c(iii) Captains Meeting. A mandatory team captain's meeting must be held prior to the start of league play for each local league program. Topics to be covered include local regulations (provide internet links to National, Sectional, State regulations), championships eligibility requirements, and deadlines. Local league coordinators should review all regulations and procedures with new team captains. The captains meeting may be held by any of the following methods: in person, conference call, video call, webinar or email communications

1.04C(1)a Team Registration. The deadline date must be prior to the start of the local league season and must be no later than one (1) month <u>prior to</u> the state championship with local league schedules published, with times and facilities of local league matches. Team Registration Dates/Deadlines are listed in chart 1.04C

Team name format shall be as follows: Captain's LAST NAME/AGE GROUP/LEVEL/LEAGUE/FACILITY (MAX 4 LETTERS). Example: Smith/55/3.5/WD/ST

Failure to register a team in TennisLink by the established deadline date may result in the team being declared ineligible for the USTA League Program. The Local League Coordinator may amend local league team registration deadline dates in order to optimize flights.

1.04C(1)b Player Additions. All player additions to existing registered team rosters must be prior to the end of the local league season but no later than 14 days prior to the state championship. Players shall not be added to the team roster during local league flight playoffs or at any local leagues played during a state championship. Player Registration Dates/Deadlines are listed in chart 1.04C

1.04C(1)c League Fees & Financial Statement.

1.04C(1)d. The local Community Tennis Associations are responsible for making available a financial statement to the local team captains at the conclusion of each league year.

Any fees paid to the local league coordinator, level coordinators, league assistants, and/or league secretary must be itemized on the financial report.

1.04C(1)e Enrollment Fees. The <u>2025</u> Lafayette league year enrollment fees.

Any increase to Local League head tax must be approved by the USTA Louisiana Adult League Committee prior to the start of the leagues team registration.

1.04C(1)f. USTA Louisiana Head Tax_Local League Refunds.

- Local League player refunds will only be issued for the following: league did not make, injury, illness, or permanent move from local league area.
- If player participated in a later league where registration could have been transferred, a refund will not be issued.
- Refund request must be made prior to the state championship for league in which refund is being requested.
- Refund request must be documented via email to the LLC and that request may be required for refund.

For USTA League Tennis Adult and Mixed Divisions; USTA Southern Combo Division and Tri Level Division League Year 2025 (1/5/2025)

- Local league coordinators may move player registration to another league/team if player has not played any matches on team which requesting refund. Transfer of player registration can only be between 18/40 age group registrations to 18/40 age group team, 55 age group to 55 age group team.
- Refunds will be administered once a year in December for all qualifying refunds <u>requests</u> that could not be transferred.
- Each local league area has authority to decide how to handle their local league head tax refunds.

1.04C(2) Official Score Reporting and Standings System The initial entry of match scores into TennisLink must take place within 48 hours of the completion of the match. After match scores have been entered in TennisLink, they must be confirmed by the opposing team within 48 hours of the initial entry, or the initial score will automatically be considered valid. Failure to comply may subject teams to a grievance and/or double default.

1.04D Local League.

1.04D(3) Local League Season. All local league matches should be completed two (2) weeks prior to the state championship.

- All local leagues shall obtain the approval of the State League Coordinator for the dates of the local league season(s).
- Any Local League whose matches are published in TennisLink beyond the Local League deadline date set by USTA
 Louisiana will be ineligible to advance to the league's USTA Louisiana State Championship unless your local league
 has been granted approval by USTA Louisiana due to extenuating circumstances.

1.04D(4). (Local Area decision: There is no limit to a number of teams in a local league or players registered on those teams. Any Age Group consists of only two teams in a level of play, each team must maintain its roster with a minimum of 40 percent of its players at the designated NTRP level of play.

1.04E Player Eligibility

1.04E(1) Domicile and Residency Requirements. Teams that play a local league at a state championship, advance directly to a state championship (if applicable for the Adult 65 & Over league) and/or play in a single-weekend local league tournament may have players from other areas as long as the 51% of players registered on each team, residency as shown in TennisLink is in the state of Louisiana and within 70 miles of Lafayette.

1.04F Official League Rating Program

1.04F(1) Entry Players who do not have a valid NTRP rating level on file in TennisLink shall self- rate in accordance with the General & Experienced Player Guidelines – Supplement to the NTRP Guidelines and complete the self-rating process on TennisLink when registering for a team. Players who allow someone else to complete the self-rating process for them will be ultimately responsible and held accountable for information submitted or omitted. Failure to self-rate in accordance with the Guidelines, or omission of information regarding a player's tennis history, will subject the player as well as the captain and/or others who completed, assisted, condoned and/or approved an inappropriate self-rating to penalties under the League Suspension Point System. Players whose self-ratings are determined to be inaccurate or inappropriate shall be disqualified. (See Reg. 3.03E(1)a).

1.04F(1)c. Match results from Southern NTRP Tournaments in TennisLink and/or Serve Tennis and Southern Tri Level will be included in the 2025 year-end ratings.

1.04G PLAYER PARTICIPATION ELIGIBILITY.

1.04G(6). Any player who qualifies to advance to the USTA Louisiana State Championship in the Adult, Mixed, Southern Combo or Tri Level division may advance on more than one team within an age group only if they are different NTRP Levels. No accommodations for scheduling will be made at the USTA Louisiana Championships for teams with players that may be competing on two or more teams during a state championship.

2.01C(3)a. Team Match - Each match will require the majority of courts be played to qualify as a valid match. When the combination of individual match defaults given by the two teams in the match result in or would result in a majority of the courts not being played, the captains are to notify their local league coordinator immediately and they will schedule the remaining courts so as to make a valid match. Failure to do so may result in suspension points assigned to the captain and the team's removal from the standings.

2.01C(4) Match Scoring and Formats

Refer to chart 2.01(3)

• Match Scoring format – Match scoring format will be the best two of three sets with a ten-point Coman tiebreak in lieu of a third set. Once sets reach six all, a seven-point Coman tiebreak will determine the winner of the set. The team winning the majority of the individual matches shall be awarded one team point. In the event of a tie of Team Points, the tie shall be broken by the first of the following procedures that does so: Winner of the most individual matches (courts); then winner of Head-to-head (only if all tied teams have played each other and one team defeated all the teams that are tied); then least sets lost; then least games lost; then highest game winning percentage; then a coin toss.

2.01C(4)a Scoring of Retirements Below Championship Play.

A retirement occurs when an individual match has started and a player/doubles team is unable to continue due to injury, loss of condition, emergency, or refusal to play. If a full team retirement or combination of defaults and retirements occurs, a grievance may be filed. If the grievance is upheld, the match may be declared invalid and shall be scored following the local/sectional regulations. The Section below may impose further penalties on the defaulting and/or retiring team. Such penalties must follow the League Suspension System (See Regulation 3.03A(7) and 3.03D(4)).

• If a Local League has a playoff, championship procedures must be used in the event of a tie. Please refer to national regulation 2.03H.

2.01C(6) Team Lineups.

2.01C(6)c. In the event a match is postponed due to weather, the line-up would stand only for those positions (courts) that have started (first service attempt). For the reschedule, a team may substitute a player in positions (courts) that have not started (first service attempt), using a player not already listed in the original lineup. Teams may not alter player positions from the original lineup. If a team defaulted a court in the original lineup, that default would stand for the match. Only host the host facility can make the determination to cancel matches due to rain and such a determination will be made 30 minutes prior to match time.

2.01(6)d. Local league matches will be cancelled when, extreme weather conditions including temperatures below 40°F (wind chill) and above 106°F (heat index) at the start of match time, unless both captains agree to play.

Should the scheduled match be delayed for extreme weather, it will be treated as a makeup. It is the responsibility of the home team captain to let the hosting facility know as soon as the determination not to play is made that the courts will be available for other use. Rescheduled matches should be made up within two (2) weeks of the originally scheduled match unless the state deadline is prior to the two (2) weeks, then matches would need to be completed prior to the state deadline.

2.01C(6)e Team Defaults ._Louisiana Regulation: USTA Louisiana adopts the following regarding teams defaulting an entire team match during local league competition:

- Team remains obligated to play the remainder of all local league matches. These matches will be recorded in TennisLink for the purposes of satisfying match play requirements for opponents and NTRP calculations.
- All matches of a defaulting team may be removed from the stats and standings in TennisLink (if multiple round robins, the defaulting team may be removed from that round of play) UNLESS:
 - All teams with a mathematical chance to advance have already played the defaulting team in good faith, the matches shall stand as played when determining standings.
 - Extenuating circumstances presented by the Local League Coordinator may be considered by the USTA Louisiana Adult League Council prior to the team being removed from standings.
- In addition, the USTA Louisiana Adult League Committee may file a grievance and impose further penalties on the defaulting team. Such penalties will follow the League Suspension System (See Regulation 3.03A(7) and 3.03D(4)).

2.02 Progression

2.02A(1) Local Competition All local matches should be completed two (2) weeks prior to the USTA Louisiana State Championship. At the conclusion of the local league competition and/or local playoff, the Local League Coordinator shall notify the State League Coordinator of teams advancing to the state championships.

Levels with a single flight: Advancement will be based on order of finish in the final local league standings as reported in TennisLink.

flight. Advancement to the playoff will be based on the order of finish in the final local league standings as reported in

Partial Round Robins: For a partial round to be played, consent will be required from all captains participating in the round. Advancement will be based on order of finish in the final local league standings as reported in TennisLink. **Multiple/Split Flights:** If flights are split into multiple flights, a playoff will be held between the winning teams of each

TennisLink and the winner of the playoff will advance to state tournament.

2.04B NTRP Dynamic Disqualification Procedures. Dynamic ratings will be calculated for all Adult **and Mixed National Championship Advancing League Division** players during local league competition and at every level of championship competition including National Championships to determine if any players have reached the NTRP Dynamic Disqualification criteria stated in the USTA NTRP Computer Rating System Procedures. Players subject to NTRP Dynamic Disqualification, as described in the *NTRP Dynamic Disqualification Table* will be dynamically disqualified if they reach the disqualification level three times based on all matches except retirements received.

2.05C Appeal of Year-End Ratings.

Year-end NTRP valid computer rating levels may be appealed or denied through TennisLink except for 2.05D Medical Appeals.

2.05D Medical Appeals. A \$100 filing fee will be required for all Medical Appeal submissions. The filing fee will only be returned to the filing party if the medical appeal is submitted to the USTA National Medical Appeals Committee.

3.01B(1) Local Grievance Appeals Committee Grievance appeals committees will be chosen from the list of USTA League players listed at the end of these regulations. Additional members may be added as needed.
