For USTA League Tennis Adult and Mixed Divisions; USTA Southern Combo Division and Tri Level Division League Year 2025

1.0 GENERAL

The Regulations in 1.00 GENERAL in conjunction with USTA National and USTA Southern regulations shall apply to all League Divisions (Adult and Mixed); as well as Southern Combo and Tri-Level.

1.02 Governance

- **1.02A Waiver of Rules and Procedures Prohibited** Printed below are the Ruston Regulations as authorized by the USTA League Tennis Regulations, USTA Southern Section Regulations, and USTA Louisiana Regulations.
- **1.02B Amendments** Ruston League Coordinators may amend these Ruston Regulations with approval from the Ruston League Council.
- **1.02C Written Interpretation** The Local League Coordinators and/or Local League Council shall have the authority to interpret the Ruston Regulations.

1.04B Administration.

- **1.04B(3)c Local League Coordinators.** The Board of Directors of the local Community Tennis Associations are responsible for promoting the USTA League Programs in their area. Local League Coordinators are responsible for implementing and administering the USTA League Programs in their area.
- **1.04B(3)c(i) League Code of Ethics.** All league administrators will adhere to the USTA Southern Section League Tennis Officials Code of Ethics (http://www.southern.usta.com/USA-League-Tennis-Pages/9305 USTA Southern Section League Tennis Officials Code of Ethics As of 21804/)
- **1.04B(3)c(ii)** League Coordinator Responsibilities. Establish procedures and regulations for all aspects of their local league that are not covered by the national, sectional or state regulations. A copy of the local regulations must be submitted to the State/District League Coordinator for review prior to the league's team captain's meeting.

USTA League Tennis Regulations (National, Southern Section, State, Local) are available on louisianatennis.com prior to the start of local league competition.

1.04B(3)c(iii) Captains Meeting. A mandatory team captain's meeting must be held prior to the start of league play for each local league program. Topics to be covered include local regulations (provide internet links to National, Sectional, State regulations), championships eligibility requirements, and deadlines. Local league coordinators should review all regulations and procedures with new team captains. The captain's meeting may be held by any of the following methods: in person, conference call, video call, webinar or email communications

1.04C(1)a Team Registration. The deadline date must be prior to the start of the local league season and must be no later than one (1) month <u>prior to</u> the state championship with local league schedules published with times and facilities of local league matches. Local teams must be included in the local league schedule if the teams have fulfilled this requirement. (see chart above)

Louisiana Regulation: Team name format shall be as follows:

Captain's LAST NAME/AGE GROUP/LEVEL/LEAGUE/FACILITY (MAX 4 LETTERS). Example: Smith/55/3.5/WD/ST

Failure to register a team in TennisLink by the established deadline date may result in the team being declared ineligible for the USTA League Program. The Local League Coordinator may amend local league team registration deadline dates in order to optimize flights.

1.04C(1)b Player Additions. All player additions to existing registered team rosters must be prior to the end of the local league season but no later than 14 days prior to the state championship. Players shall not be added to the team roster during local league flight playoffs or at any including local leagues played during a state championship. (see dates in the chart above)

1.04C(1)c League Fees & Financial Statement.

1.04C(1)d. The local Community Tennis Associations are responsible for making available a financial statement to the local team captains at the conclusion of each league year.

Any fees paid to the local league coordinator, level coordinators, league assistants, and/or league secretary must be itemized on the financial report.

1.04C(1)e Enrollment Fees. The 2025 Ruston league year enrollment fees.

Any increase to Local League head tax must be approved by the USTA Louisiana Adult League Committee prior to the start of the league's team registration.

1.04C(1)f. USTA Louisiana Head Tax_Local League Refunds.

- Local League player refunds will only be issued for the following: league did not make, injury, illness, or permanent move from local league area.
- If a player participated in a later league where registration could have been transferred, a refund will not be issued.
- Refund requests must be made prior to the state championship for the league in which the refund is being requested.
- Refund requests must be documented via email to the LLC and that request may be required for refund.
- Local league coordinators may move player registration to another league/team if the player has not played any matches on a team which is requesting a refund. Transfer of player registration can only be between 18/40 age group registrations to 18/40 age group team, 55 age group to 55 age group team.
- Refunds will be administered once a year in December for all qualifying refund <u>requests</u> that could not be transferred
- Each local league area has authority to decide how to handle their local league head tax refunds.

1.04C(2) Official Score Reporting and Standings System The initial entry of match scores into TennisLink <u>must take place within 48 hours of the completion of the match. After match scores have been entered in TennisLink, they must be confirmed by the opposing team within 48 hours of the initial entry, or the initial score will automatically be considered valid. Failure to comply may subject teams to a grievance and/or double default.</u>

1.04D Local League.

1.04D(3) Local League Season. All local league matches should be completed two (2) weeks prior to the state championship.

 Any Local League whose matches are published in TennisLink beyond the Local League deadline date set by USTA Louisiana will be ineligible to advance to the league's USTA Louisiana State Championship.

1.04D(4). To promote more than two-team leagues, there will be an initial maximum limit on the number of players that can be added to a roster and is subject to change if and only if reviewed and approved by that League coordinator(s). The limit is calculated by using local requirements. The local requirement for a minimum roster will be the same as the USTA national requirement for minimum team composition, as outlined per the league and age group. The local requirement for a maximum roster = (minimum roster * 2) - 2. For example, if a team has a local minimum of eight, then twice that number is sixteen, then subtract two, and the maximum number on the roster is fourteen. This is true for all leagues except Tri-level, where the maximum roster = (minimum roster *2) + 2.

1.04E Player Eligibility

1.04E(1) Domicile and Residency Requirements. USTA Louisiana will have no residency requirements for local league play. Exception: Any team playing a local league at a state championship and/or advance directly to a state championship (if applicable for the Adult 65 & Over league) and/or play in a single-weekend local league tournament may have players from other areas as long as the majority of players reside in the State of Louisiana.

Ruston leagues will be played at the following locations:

- Choudrant High School
- Squire Creek Country Club
- RPAR Sports Complex (Ruston High Courts)

1.04E(3) Electronic Devices. A player may not use electronic devices such as cell phones, smart watches, digital messaging systems, radios, mp3 players, or any device capable of receiving communication during USTA League (FAC USTA Comment 30.1.). If a cell phone rings during a point, the opponent may stop the point and claim the point based on deliberate hindrance (FAC USTA Comment 26.3).

1.04F Official League Rating Program

1.04F(1) Entry Players who do not have a valid NTRP rating level on file in TennisLink shall self- rate in accordance with the General & Experienced Player Guidelines – Supplement to the NTRP Guidelines and complete the self-rating process on TennisLink when registering for a team. Players who allow someone else to complete the self-rating process for them will be ultimately responsible and held accountable for information submitted or omitted. Failure to self-rate in accordance with the Guidelines, or omission of information regarding a player's tennis history, will subject the player as well as the captain and/or others who completed, assisted, condoned and/or approved an inappropriate self-rating to penalties under the League Suspension Point System. Players whose self-ratings are determined to be inaccurate or inappropriate shall be disqualified. (See Reg. 3.03E(1)a).

1.04F(1)c. Match results from Southern NTRP Tournaments in TennisLink and/or Serve Tennis and Southern Tri Level will be included in the 2025 year-end ratings.

Self-ratings are valid for two years from the date issued or until replaced by a dynamic or computer rating. If there is a change in their playing experience the player may appeal their rating up at that time or they may be promoted by the Sectional coordinator.

1.04G PLAYER PARTICIPATION ELIGIBILITY.

1.04G(6). Any player who qualifies to advance to the USTA Louisiana State Championship in the Adult, Mixed, Southern Combo or Tri Level division may advance on more than one team within an age group only if they are different NTRP Levels.

No accommodations for scheduling will be made at the USTA Louisiana Championships for teams with players that may be competing on two or more teams during a state championship.

2.00 USTA LEAGUE REGULATIONS

2.01 NTRP Levels of Play

2.01A(1) When using straight NTRP levels, a player cannot have an NTRP rating higher than the NTRP level in which the player is competing.

2.01C(3). For each team match, a majority of the individual matches must actually be played to constitute a valid team match. When the combination of individual match defaults given by the two teams in the team match results, or would result, in a situation where the majority of the individual matches would not be played, captains shall notify the Local League Coordinator who will reschedule the remaining un-played individual matches.

2.01C(4) Match Scoring and Formats - see chart above

- Match scoring shall be the best of three tiebreak sets with a set tiebreak at 6-all. In the event of split sets, a match tie-break (10-point) shall be played in lieu of a third set.
- There will be a two-minute set break at the end of each set with no coaching.
- Coman tiebreak procedure will be used in set tie-breaks and match tie-breaks.
- The team winning the majority of the individual matches shall be awarded one team point.
- **4-court match:** If tied 2-2, the tie shall be broken by the first of the following methods to do so: a) least sets lost; then least games lost; then game winning percentage; then winner of 1st court doubles.
- In the event of a tie, the tie shall be broken by the first of the following procedures that does so: Winner of the most individual matches (courts); then winner of Head-to-head (only if all tied teams have played each other and one team defeated all the teams that are tied); then least sets lost; then least games lost; then highest game winning percentage; then a coin toss.
- If a Local League has a playoff, championship procedures must be used in the event of a tie. Please refer to national regulation 2.03H.

2.01C(4)a Scoring of Retirements Below Championship Play.

A retirement occurs when an individual match has started and a player/doubles team is unable to continue due to injury, loss of condition, emergency, or refusal to play. If a full team retirement or combination of defaults and retirements occurs, a grievance may be filed. If the grievance is upheld, the match may be declared invalid and shall be scored following the local/sectional regulations. The Section below may impose further penalties on the defaulting and/or retiring team. Such penalties must follow the League Suspension System (See Regulation 3.03A(7) and 3.03D(4)).

2.01C(5)e Team Defaults. Louisiana Regulation: USTA Louisiana adopts the following regarding teams defaulting an entire team match during local league competition:

- Team remains obligated to play the remainder of all local league matches. These matches will be recorded in TennisLink for the purposes of satisfying match play requirements for opponents and NTRP calculations.
- All matches of a defaulting team may be removed from the stats and standings in TennisLink (if multiple round robins, the defaulting team may be removed from that round of play) UNLESS:
 - All teams with a mathematical chance to advance have already played the defaulting team in good faith, the matches shall stand as played when determining standings.
 - Extenuating circumstances presented by the Local League Coordinator may be considered by the USTA Louisiana Adult League Council prior to the team being removed from standings.

• In addition, the USTA Louisiana Adult League Committee may file a grievance and impose further penalties on the defaulting team. Such penalties will follow the League Suspension System (See Regulation 3.03A(7) and 3.03D(4)).

2.01C(6) Team Lineups.

2.01C(6)c. Team captains shall exchange their lineups simultaneously prior to the start of team match. No substitution may be made in an individual match after the lineup has been presented, except for injury, illness or no-show of a player prior to the start of an individual match. A team may substitute a player in the affected position within the 15-minute default time, using a player not already listed on the lineup. The substitute player is entitled to a five-minute warm-up.

Each local league will decide how to regulate rescheduling of team matches due to rules for making up matches rescheduled due to rain, inclement weather, and/or USTA League-related conflicts. In the event a match is rescheduled AFTER it has started, the default will stand in the local league. If a match is rescheduled BEFORE it has started AND captains choose to exchange lineups for players to schedule their own courts, those players are considered the committed and intended match players. No substitutions/changes can be made to the lineup prior to the start of the match unless agreed upon by the two captains.

One hour before the scheduled match the captains will talk and decide what to do. They will let the Local League Coordinator know what has been decided and/or the date/time of the new match. If they can't agree then the Local League Coordinator will make a determination if the match can be played and if the match can't be played then the Local League Coordinator will set a new date/time for the match. All matches must be made up at least two weeks prior to the state tournament.

If a team advances to a state or above championship, the Local League Coordinator will work with the captains to reschedule the match(s). All matches must be completed and entered in TennisLink no later than fourteen days prior to the state tournament.

2.02 Progression

2.02A(1) Local Competition All local matches should be completed two (2) weeks prior to the USTA Louisiana State Championship. At the conclusion of the local league competition and/or local playoff, the Local League Coordinator shall notify the State League Coordinator of teams advancing to the state championships.

The team with the most team points in the final standings, as listed in TennisLink, will be declared the winner.

2.02A(2) Local Champion

See the 2025 USTA Louisiana Championship Procedures for deadline dates and deposit hold requirements for advancing teams to guarantee spot in the state championship draw.

Please refer to the 2025 USTA Louisiana Championship Procedures for full championship details including registration information, dates, location and procedures.

2.04B NTRP Dynamic Disqualification Procedures. Dynamic ratings will be calculated for all Adult **and Mixed National Championship Advancing League Division** players during local league competition and at every level of championship competition including National Championships to determine if any players have reached the NTRP Dynamic Disqualification criteria stated in the USTA NTRP Computer Rating System Procedures. Players subject to NTRP Dynamic Disqualification, as described in the *NTRP Dynamic Disqualification Table* will be dynamically disqualified if they reach the disqualification level three times based on all matches except retirements received.

2.05C Appeal of Year-End Ratings.

Year-end NTRP valid computer rating levels may be appealed or denied through TennisLink except for 2.05D *Medical Appeals*.

For USTA League Tennis Adult and Mixed Divisions; USTA Southern Combo Division and Tri Level Division League Year 2025

2.05D Medical Appeals. A \$100 filing fee will be required for all Medical Appeal submissions. The filing fee will only be returned to the filing party if the medical appeal is submitted to the USTA National Medical Appeals Committee.

3.00 GRIEVANCE PROCEDURES

3.01 ADMINISTRATION 3.01 ADMINISTRATION.

All local league regulations will include the names of grievance and grievance appeal committee members and will be distributed to captains prior to the beginning of the local league season. Grievance decisions that impose sanctions will be upheld throughout the USTA Southern Section.

3.01A(1) Local. Each local league shall appoint a Local League Grievance Committee (listed at end of regulations). USTA Louisiana shall approve all Local League Grievance Committee. Additional members may be added as needed.

3.01B(1) Local Grievance Appeals Committee Each local league shall appoint a Local League Grievance Appeals Committee (listed at end of regulations). USTA Louisiana shall approve all Local League Grievance Committee. Additional members may be added as needed.

3.03 Grievance Complaints

3.03B(1) Local League Procedures All local grievances, appeals and NTRP complaints and appeals will be submitted to the Leagues Local League Coordinator. The Ruston Coordinators' contact information is at the bottom of these regulations.
3.03E(4) NTRP Grievance Complaint NTRP Grievances shall be filed in writing with the Local/District/Area League Coordinator or designee having jurisdiction. NTRP Grievances shall be administered by the USTA Southern Grievance Committee.
