SOUTHERN CARES TO WRAP UP IN SEPTEMBER

After establishment by the USTA SOUTHERN BOARD OF DIRECTORS in May, the \$2 million Southern Cares initiative has been moving full speed ahead. The three segments are in different areas of their timelines.

Here is where the programs stand:

Teaching pros: All pros receiving funds have been selected and checks have been mailed.

Facilities: Most facilities have been notified and checks are in the process of being processed and mailed.

Others in tennis industry (tournament directors, CTAs, officials, NJTLs, local league coordinators, wheelchair and adaptive programs, media, etc.): Applications are being reviewed. Selections will be made and checks mailed in August or early September.
