#### **SLIDELL REGULATIONS**

# For USTA League Tennis Adult and Mixed Divisions; USTA Southern Combo Division and Tri Level Division League Year 2025

1.00 GENERAL The Regulations in 1.00 GENERAL in conjunction with USTA National and USTA Southern regulations shall apply to all League Divisions (Adult and Mixed); as well as Southern Combo and Tri-Level.

#### 1.02 Governance

- 1.02A Waiver of Rules and Procedures Prohibited Printed below are the Slidell Regulations as authorized by the USTA League Tennis Regulations, USTA Southern Section Regulations, and USTA Louisiana Regulations.
- 1.02B Amendments Slidell league coordinators may amend these Slidell League Regulations with approval from the Slidell Tennis Association board of directors.
- 1.02C Written Interpretation The Local League Coordinator and/or Local League Council shall have the authority to interpret the Slidell League Regulations.

#### 1.04B Administration.

- 1.04B(3)c Local League Coordinators. Louisiana Regulation Local League Coordinators are responsible for implementing and administering the USTA League Programs in their area. The Board of Directors of the local Community Tennis Associations are responsible for promoting the USTA League Programs in their area.
- 1.04B(3)c(i) League Code of Ethics. All league administrators will adhere to the USTA Southern Section League Tennis Officials Code of Ethics (http://www.southern.usta.com/USA-League-Tennis-Pages/9305 USTA Southern Section League Tennis Officials Code of Ethics As of 21804/)
- 1.04B(3)c(ii) League Coordinator Responsibilities. Establish procedures and regulations for all aspects of their local league that are not covered by the national, sectional or state regulations. A copy of the local regulations must be submitted to the State/District League Coordinator for review prior to the league's team captain's meeting.

USTA League Tennis Regulations (National, Southern Section, State, Local) are available on slidelltennis.com or louisianatennis.com prior to the start of local league competition.

1.04B(3)c(iii) Captains Meeting. A mandatory team captain's meeting must be held prior to the start of league play for each local league program. Topics to be covered include local regulations (provide internet links to National, Sectional, State regulations), championships eligibility requirements, and deadlines. Local league coordinators should review all regulations and procedures with new team captains. The captains meeting may be held by any of the following methods: in person, conference call, video call, webinar or email communications.

**1.04C(1)a Team Registration.** The deadline date must be prior to the start of the local league season and must be no later than one (1) month prior to the state championship with local league schedules published with times and facilities of local league matches. Team Registration Dates/Deadlines are in chart above.

Team name format shall be as follows: Captain's LAST NAME/AGE GROUP/LEVEL/LEAGUE/FACILITY (MAX 4 LETTERS). Example: Smith/55/3.5/WD/ST

Failure to register a team in TennisLink by the established deadline date may result in the team being declared ineligible for the USTA League Program. The Local League Coordinator may amend local league team registration deadline dates in order to optimize flights.

**1.04C(1)b Player Additions.** All player additions to existing registered team rosters must be prior to the end of the local league season but no later than 14 days prior to the state championship, players shall not be added to the team roster during local league flight playoffs or at any local leagues played during a state championship. Player Registration Dates/Deadlines are in chart above.

#### 1.04C(1)c League Fees & Financial Statement.

**1.04C(1)d** The local Community Tennis Associations are responsible for making available a financial statement to the local team captains at the conclusion of each league year.

Any fees paid to the local league coordinator, level coordinators, league assistants, and/or league secretary must be itemized on the financial report.

1.04C(1)e Enrollment Fees. The 2025 Slidell league year enrollment fees are in chart below.

Any increase to Local League head tax must be approved by the USTA Louisiana Adult League Committee prior to the start of the leagues team registration.

#### 1.04C(1)f USTA Louisiana Head Tax Local League Refunds.

- Local League player refunds will only be issued for the following: league did not make, injury, illness, or permanent move from local league area.
- If player participated in a later league where registration could have been transferred, a refund will not be issued.
- Refund request must be made prior to the state championship for league in which refund is being requested.
- Refund request must be documented via email to the LLC and that request may be required for refund.
- Local league coordinators may move player registration to another league/team if player has not played any matches on team which requesting refund. Transfer of player registration can only be between 18/40 age group registrations to 18/40 age group team, 55 age group to 55 age group team.
- Refunds will be administered once a year in December for all qualifying refunds requests that could not be transferred.
- Each local league area has authority to decide how to handle their local league head tax refunds.

**1.04C(2) Official Score Reporting and Standings System** The initial entry of match scores into TennisLink must take place within 48 hours of the completion of the match. After match scores have been entered in TennisLink, they must be confirmed by the opposing team within 48 hours of the initial entry or the initial score will automatically be considered valid. Failure to comply may subject teams to a grievance and/or double default.

# 1.04D Local League.

**1.04D(3)** Local League Season. All local league matches should be completed two (2) weeks prior to the state championship.

- All local leagues shall obtain the approval of the State League Coordinator for the dates of the local league season(s).
- Any Local Leagues whose matches are published in TennisLink beyond the Local League deadline date set by the USTA Louisiana will be ineligible to advance to the leagues USTA Louisiana State Championship unless your local league has been granted approval by USTA Louisiana due to extenuating circumstances.
- **1.04D(4)** There is no limit to the number of players that appear on a team roster and no limit to the number of players on that roster that are at a specific NTRP level, with the exception of a two team league. Each team must have the minimum number of players shown in the table in the State Regulations. See 1.04D(5)
- **1.04D(5)** Two Team Leagues. If any Adult Division Age Group consists of only two teams in a level of play, each team must maintain its roster with a minimum of 40 percent of its players at the designated NTRP level of play. A Section may increase the required minimum percentage. The Adult Division 55 & Over Age Group that uses combined NTRP rating levels will not be required to comply with this Regulation.

# 1.04E Player Eligibility

**1.04E(1) Domicile and Residency Requirements** USTA Louisiana will have no residency requirements for local league play. Exception: Teams that play a local league at a state championship, advance directly to a state championship (if applicable for the Adult 65 & Over league) and/or play in a single-weekend local league tournament may have players from other areas as long as the 51% of players registered on each team residency as shown in TennisLink is in the State of Louisiana. Teams in the Slidell league must use either The Henry J. Calamari Memorial Tennis Center or Cross Gates Family Fitness as their home courts.

#### 1.04F Official League Rating Program

**1.04F(1)** Entry Players who do not have a valid NTRP rating level on file in TennisLink shall self- rate in accordance with the General & Experienced Player Guidelines — Supplement to the NTRP Guidelines and complete the self-rating process on TennisLink when registering for a team. Players who allow someone else to complete the self-rating process for them will be ultimately responsible and held accountable for information submitted or omitted. Failure to self-rate in accordance with the Guidelines, or omission of information regarding a player's tennis history, will subject the player as well as the captain and/or others who completed, assisted, condoned and/or approved an inappropriate self-rating to penalties under the League Suspension Point System. Players whose self-ratings are determined to be inaccurate or inappropriate shall be disqualified. (See Reg. 3.03E(1)a).

**1.04F(1)c** Match results from Southern NTRP Tournaments in TennisLink and/or Serve Tennis and Southern Tri Level will be included in the 2025 year-end ratings.

Self-ratings are valid for two years from the date issued or until replaced by a dynamic or computer rating. If there is a change in their playing experience the player may appeal their rating up at that time or they may be promoted by the Sectional coordinator.

# 1.04G PLAYER PARTICIPATION ELIGIBILITY.

1.04G(6). Any player who qualifies to advance to the USTA Louisiana State Championship in the Adult, Mixed, Southern Combo or Tri Level division may advance on more than one team within an age group only if they are different NTRP Levels.

No accommodations for scheduling will be made at the USTA Louisiana Championships for teams with players that may be competing on two or more teams during a state championship.

# 2.01A NTRP Levels of Play. (see chart 2.01C(3))

2.01A(1) When using straight NTRP levels, a player cannot have an NTRP rating higher than the NTRP level in which the player is competing.

**2.01C(3)a** When both teams, of the same scheduled match, show up without the combined minimum number of players present, or to be present, the team must play the courts with the number of players present and reschedule the minimum number of courts to complete a valid played match as per National regulation 2.01c(2). Notify your local league coordinator with the rescheduling of the minimum number of courts in accordance with the rainout procedures as outlined in Local regulation 2.01C(5c).

## 2.01C(4). Match Scoring and Formats.

- Match scoring shall be the best of three tiebreak tie-break sets with a match tie-break in lieu of a third set. The
  match tiebreak shall be scored as one set and one game for tiebreak purposes. There will be a two minute set
  break at the end of each set with no coaching. Coman tiebreak procedure will be used in set tie-breakers and
  match tie-breakers.
- The team winning the majority of the individual matches shall be awarded one team point.
- Procedures in the event of a Match Tie in a 40 & Over 4 court match for local play. If a match is tied 2-2, the tie will be broken by the first of the following procedures: (1) least sets lost, (2) least games lost, (3) highest games won percentage, (4) winner of 1<sup>st</sup> court doubles.
- In the event of a tie, the tie shall be broken by the first of the following procedures that does so: Winner of the most individual matches (courts); then winner of Head-to-head; then least sets lost; then least games lost; then a coin toss.

# 2.01C(4)a Scoring of Retirements Below Championship Play.

A retirement occurs when an individual match has started and a player/doubles team is unable to continue due to injury, loss of condition, emergency, or refusal to play. If a full team retirement or combination of defaults and retirements occurs, a grievance may be filed. If the grievance is upheld, the match may be declared invalid and shall be scored following the local/sectional regulations. The Section and below may impose further penalties on the defaulting and/or retiring team. Such penalties must follow the League Suspension System (See Regulation 3.03A(7) and 3.03D(4)).

• If a Local League has a playoff, championship procedures must be used in the event of a tie. Please refer to national regulation 2.03H.

## 2.01C(6) Team Lineups

**2.01C(6)c Rescheduling of Team Matches.** Each local league will decide how to regulate rescheduling of team matches due to rules for making up matches rescheduled due to rain, inclement weather and/or USTA League-related conflicts. See below:

Make up matches will be played before the second Sunday from the date of the match at the latest except at the end of the season where they would have to be made up by the last day of the league. If the match is not made up, then the coordinator will set a date the match must be played. If no one shows up then a double default will be awarded. Once the lineups have been exchanged, no changes may take place in a make up match. If the original line-up had a defaulted court, that position may be changed and played.

## 2.01C(6)e Team Defaults.

USTA Louisiana adopts the following regarding teams defaulting an entire team match during local league competition:

- The defaulting team may be ineligible to advance beyond local league as determined by the USTA Louisiana Adult League Council based upon the facts and circumstances presented by the local league coordinator.
- Team remains obligated to play the remainder of all local league matches. These matches will be recorded in TennisLink for the purposes of satisfying match play requirements for opponents and NTRP calculations.
- All matches of a defaulting team may be removed from the stats and standings in TennisLink (if multiple round robins, the defaulting team may be removed from that round of play) UNLESS:
  - All teams with a mathematical chance to advance have already played the defaulting team in good faith, the matches shall stand as played when determining standings.
  - Extenuating circumstances presented by the Local League Coordinator may be considered by the USTA Louisiana Adult League Council prior to the team being removed from standings.
- The local league coordinator may recommend the filing of a grievance with the local grievance committee.
- In addition, the USTA Louisiana Adult League Committee may file a grievance and impose further penalties on the defaulting team. Such penalties will follow the League Suspension System (See Regulation 3.03A(7) and 3.03D(4)).

## 2.02 Progression

**2.02A(1) Local Competition** All local matches should be completed two (2) weeks prior to the USTA Louisiana State Championship. At the conclusion of the local league competition and/or local playoff, the Local League Coordinator shall notify the State League Coordinator of teams advancing to the state championships.

Team with the most team points in TennisLink will advance. If they choose not to go, the 2nd place team will be asked. If they choose not to go, then the 3<sup>rd</sup> place team will be asked.

# 2.02A(2) Local Champion.

See the 2025 USTA Louisiana Championship Procedures for deadline dates and deposit hold requirements for advancing teams to guarantee a spot in the state championship draw.

Please refer the 2025 USTA Louisiana Championship Procedures for full championship details including registration information, dates, location and procedures.

**2.04B NTRP Dynamic Disqualification Procedures**. Dynamic ratings will be calculated for all Adult and Mixed National Championship Advancing League Division players during local league competition and at every level of championship competition including National Championships to determine if any players have reached the NTRP Dynamic Disqualification criteria stated in the USTA NTRP Computer Rating System Procedures. Players subject to NTRP Dynamic Disqualification, as described in the NTRP Dynamic Disqualification Table will be dynamically disqualified if they reach the disqualification level three times based on all matches except retirements received.

#### 2.05C Appeal of Year-End Ratings.

Year-end NTRP valid computer rating levels may be appealed or denied through TennisLink except for 2.05D *Medical Appeals*.

**2.05D Medical Appeals**. A \$100 filing fee will be required for all Medical Appeal submissions. The filing fee will only be returned to the filing party if the medical appeal is submitted to the USTA National Medical Appeals Committee.

# 3.00 GRIEVANCE PROCEDURES 3.01 ADMINISTRATION.

All local league regulations will include the names of grievance and grievance appeal committee members and will be distributed to captains prior to the beginning of the local league season Grievance decisions that impose sanctions will be upheld throughout the USTA Southern Section.

**3.01A(1)** Local. Grievance committees will be chosen from the list of Slidell USTA League Players and listed at the end of these regulations. Additional members may be added as needed.

**3.01B(1)** Local Grievance Appeals Committee Grievance appeal committees will be chosen from the list of Slidell USTA League Players and listed at the end of these regulations. Additional members may be added as needed.

#### 3.03 Grievance Complaints

**3.03B(1) Local League Procedures** All local grievances, appeals and NTRP complaints and appeals will be submitted to the Local League Coordinator. Their names and emails are on the STA website <u>slidelltennis.com</u>. See USTA National League Tennis Regulations 3.00 for procedures that must be followed to file local grievances, appeals and NTRP complaints.

**3.03E(4) NTRP Grievance Complaint** NTRP Grievances shall be filed in writing with the Local/District/Area League Coordinator or designee having jurisdiction. NTRP Grievances shall be administered by the USTA Southern Grievance Committee.
