

Government issues Best Value Notice on four-day week

At the beginning of November, the government issued a Best Value Notice to South Cambridgeshire District Council – a formal notice expressing concerns over the council's ability to deliver value for money to residents due to the four-day working week trial. This echoes many of the concerns I have raised since the trial began in January 2023. In practise this means that government have requested the council send them performance data on a weekly basis alongside providing them with other historical information such as a business plan for the four-day week.

We called for an Extraordinary Full Council meeting to discuss what has happened in a public forum and to hear what consequences residents face from the administration's decision to continue with the trial despite governments request for it to stop. The meeting was held on Monday 20 November and can be viewed [here](#).

Reports presented to us in the meeting recommended we should provide the data requested by government, consequently proceeding with the four-day week trial. I proposed the following amendment:

To note the report and agree that the Council should request the Best Value Notice to be withdrawn on the proviso that the Four Day Week trial is stopped before March 2024.

One of my reasons for the amendment is that we have no way of knowing the costs incurred in providing the data. The amendment was however voted down 24-8, so the council will provide the government with data and the trial will continue in the meantime.

The council was very clear that as councillors we could only vote on the reaction to the best value notice, so we still have had no vote as to whether the trial should continue which I believe is a huge failure of democracy and disrespectful to many residents.

Free trees for South Cambs towns and villages
