
NEPOT GOVERNOR'S BULLETIN



DAC Nominations – Due January 28th

A strong DAC is so important to keeping our clubs strong, as well. And it is never to early to start thinking about people who your club would like to nominate for a position on the DAC for 2025-2026.

Since we already have our governor (Governor-Elect Gina), we will need a Governor-Elect, a Secretary, and a Treasurer for next year. The deadline for nominations is <u>January 28th</u> because after that date, the nomination committee is charged with finding nominees by February 1st.

All that is needed to nominate a member is to write a letter of recommendation. In that letter, the club should state the reasons why their nominee is qualified for the position. Any member may be nominated for Secretary or Treasurer, but to be nominated for Governor-Elect, the member has to have served as a club president.


