Sample Itinerary – St. Thomas and Spanish Virgin Islands

Caribbean Charm with a little Latin flair. The Spanish Virgin Islands consisting of Culebra and Vieques as well as several smaller cays beckon back to a simpler time in the Caribbean.

If you are doing a sleep-aboard, you can spend your first night at our marina in Frenchtown with multiple dining options and provisioning nearby. If your charter begins at noon, we will get you on board, do a boat review, and then get you underway.








Day 1

Depending on your arrival time, you will either spend the first night on the dock or at one of the western anchorages around St Thomas. Honeymoon Beach, Lindbergh Bay, or Brewers Bay all make good jumping off points for your sail to the SVI's.





Day 2

Rise and shine because it is time to make a downwind run. Typically, the next stop is Ensenda Honda on Culebra. It is roughly twenty miles from the west end of St Thomas to Culebra. You will carefully follow the ships' channel into the harbor. Once you are anchored in the harbor you can use the ROAM APP to clear your vessel and crew into customs. Then, it is time to explore the town of Dewey. Dewey is home to multiple dining and shopping options. The Dinghy Dock, Zaco's Tacos, or Mamacita's are just a few of the great options available.



Day 3

How about a little land-based excursion? You can rent street-legal golf carts from Jerry's Jeeps in Dewey. Pack your beach gear and head out for the day. First stop – Zoni Beach! This is a turtle sanctuary located on the North Shore. A long stretch of white sand with views for miles. Then, you can drive to Flamenco Beach on the northwest side of Culebra and explore the large natural beach. With food vendors, pristine white sand, and even a photo op or two on old tanks used for target practice, it is an experience not to be missed. Leave yourself enough daylight to move the boat around to the anchorage Ensenda Dakity. This is a great snorkel spot tucked in behind a barrier reef.





Day 4


Culebrita, the name sounds as pretty as the Cay. Culebrita is home to a spectacular beach, a historic lighthouse, and a natural "hot tub". There is a lot to see and do here. Or you can choose to do nothing at all. Either way, it is not to be missed. You have your choice of several anchorages depending on the weather.






Day 5 Set sail for Vieques. In most instances you will run around the east end of Vieques, then work your way to any number of south side
