

Sample Itinerary – St. Thomas and St. John

Day 1

Your first night will be spent at Honeymoon Beach, Water Island, Christmas Cove, or even at one of the North Shore beaches of St John, depending on your departure time. St John brings a variety of dining, nightlife, and shopping options. Are you looking for a night on the town? Mooring at Caneel Bay puts you just a dinghy ride away from all the Cruz Bay attractions.



Day 2

For your second day aboard, take a sail around Pillsbury Sound. There are multiple North Shore beaches in the National Park to explore, such as Hawksnest Beach, Trunk Bay, Maho Bay, and Francis Bay Beach which are all suitable for a day stop or an overnight stay.



Day 3

Spoil your whole crew with a day or night at Lovango Beach Club. Off the northside of St John lies Lovango and Congo Cays. On Lovango Cay you can reserve a private Mooring, then decide if you want a day pass so you can lounge around the pool, have some drinks, or a bite to eat. You can also make dinner reservations as well and dine under the stars.



Day 4

Next stop – snorkeling! Around the corner from Francis Bay in the narrows between Tortola and St John lies Leinster Bay, a National Park gem. With Waterlemon Cay, as well as the reef along the shore, the snorkeling here is sure to please even the most discerning adventurers. This is also suitable for day stops or an overnight stay.



Day 5

Next, head around to the southeast side of St John. Coral Bay is a unique harbor that is often overlooked with great snorkeling opportunities in the mangroves. The National Park has provided day moorings here. Then, head into Coral Bay where you can anchor out and either venture into town or stop by the Lime Out, a floating Taco Bar.



Day 6

Take a nice sail out to the south and St John and tack back into one of the south side anchorages. You will be greeted by turtles and fish at any of The National Park mooring fields. Salt Pone, Lameshur Bay, or Little Lameshur never disappoint. Wind down your day with a nice meal onboard and gaze at the stars. The seclusion of these bays and the lack of light noise from shore make for spectacular star gazing.



Day 7

Begin your day sailing downwind and head to Magen's Bay on the North Sound of St. Thomas. The huge beach and protected anchorage is one of the most photographed beaches in the world, and is a great stop for your second-to-last night. Enjoy a nice sail downwind around the West End, then head back toward the base for your last night. You have a choice of exploring Brewer's Bay, Lindbergh Bay, or Honeymoon Beach.



Day 8

The last day you will have a quick stop at a marina for fuel and return to our base in Frenchtown. Make sure to send us pictures of your charter trip, and don't forget #WaypointsWanderer on social media!
