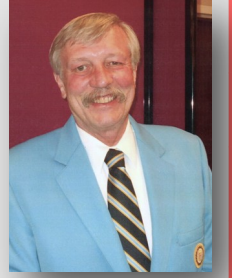

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



Hello Fellow Moose Members,

I have just returned from the Moose International Convention in Milwaukee and as usual, after the many conventions I have had the opportunity to attend over the years, I have come back pumped up with enthusiasm for our mission as members of The Moose. I think doubly so this time, as at this convention we had the opportunity to visit Mooseheart and see first hand the child city and school that we support. It is truly a special place, and I would encourage anyone who has the opportunity to visit to do so.

The primary purpose of The Moose is to support our children at Mooseheart, our seniors at Moosehaven and our local communities. That is why the Moose was founded, and mingling with a couple of thousand Moose members, that truly believe, for a week really drives the mission home.

Of course, it doesn't mean we can't have a bit of fun while we are doing it. The Dan Leary Memorial Golf Tournament on June 7 and the Annual Car Show & Chili Cookoff on August 16 are good examples of our lodge putting on fun events and at the same time, giving back to our community. I hope as many of you as possible can participate in these events.

The convention was not all fun and games. There were some General Law changes which were voted on by the delegates. Primarily these were wording corrections or clarifications in existing sections of the General Laws with no great impact.

There was one item, however, that will have an impact on all our members. "In Sec. 50.2, removes the spouse of a member as an indefinite qualified guest. New language would specify that all qualified family members, over the age of 21, shall be considered a prospective member and limited to two visits before making application for membership." It's pretty much what it says. Your spouse or adult children will be required to join the lodge after 2 visits. It was explained that to remain a private club the member benefits can only be extended to the members. When we became "One Moose" and women could join, they then became potential members of the lodge, and to maintain the private club status with the IRS, could no longer be considered indefinite quests. Although this issue was not widely popular among the delegates, it was approved by a two-third majority and is now incorporated into the general laws of The Moose. We will be reviewing our membership roll and guest logs. If this issue applies to you, we will be contacting you in the future.

Victoria has been very active in the Lodge for some time but has really stepped up with the onset of spring. On top of being on the Sunday breakfast schedule and cooking numerous dinners, Victoria has been seen planting flowers in the back yard and making repairs to the irrigation system. Greetings Moose Family,

I would like to share my experience at Moose International Convention in Milwaukee, along with over 2,000 Moose members from all over the United States, Canada & British Columbia coming together for the same purpose. At our first general session, Scott Hart the CEO, talked about "Expanding our Horizons." This year's Fundraising Campaign will be three fully renovated Mooseheart homes redesigned to serve children with intellectual or developmental disabilities. And, in very early stages of planning, 3 brand-new homes built throughout the US with integrated living arrangements for these children who age-out at 23. The mission statement: Building a Future where EVERYONE BELONGS.

It was truly amazing seeing the Activities Center finally completed. I remember at a convention years ago seeing slides on what the Center would be. To see it finished and the kids enjoying a theater, 4 lane bowling alley, state of the art gym etc. "we" did this together. I was also able to go into one of the houses where 7 boys lived; this home was overwhelming. We provide a safe place where children can learn and grow. One of the boys went up to a visitor and said "Thank you for giving us this, if I didn't have this place I would have been dead by now," He was 9 years old.

There is a quote on the wall in the Activity Center: Be Humble. Be Hungry and Always be the Hardest Worker in the Room – Dwayne "The Rock" Johnson.

After this visit I truly want to work harder...

It was also announced that there will be 2 Grant Programs starting June 7. A Marketing Grant and the Lodge Grant. Our lodge will be applying for the Grants.

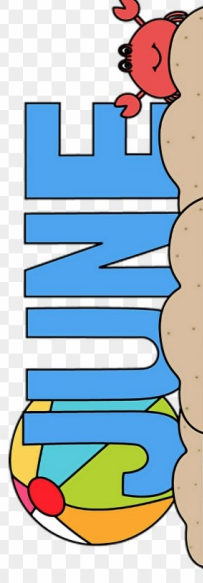
