

# **BISHOP'S EASTER MESSAGE 2023**

My Dear Parishioners,

At Easter we recall that Christ has forever conquered sin and death and so the reason we shout the great "Alleluia" on Easter day. Easter celebration is, therefore, at the centre of our Christian life and faith, for at Easter, we not only celebrate that Christ has risen from the dead as he said, but we also celebrate the triumph of life over death, light over darkness, goodness over evil, righteousness over wickedness, truth over falsehood, for it was for this reason that Christ died and rose again to life.

The central message of Easter is that of renewed life, hope, and strength in the face of all the pain and suffering that may confront us in life. There are struggles, difficulties, pain, and lack we deal with as individuals, community, society, and on the global stage but in all of these, Easter reminds us that we are never alone but to know that Jesus did not die on the Cross to take away our pains, but to fill our pains with his loving presence.

The reason Jesus came to suffer, die, and rise from the dead is to establish God's kingdom of peace, justice, and truth and we have all been called by virtue of our baptism to be agents of God's peace, justice, and light in our society and in our world.

The Easter message reminds us that if we fix our eyes and faith on God, we can be sure of victory in the end for we are meant not to only focus our minds on the pains of Good Friday, but on the joys of the Resurrection morning - Easter Sunday.

I send Easter blessings to everyone as we celebrate the very reason we are Christians. St. Paul writes, "If Christ has not been raised then empty is our preaching, empty too, your faith in Christ Jesus." (1Cor.15: 14)

We pray that the celebration of Easter in these times will continue to offer us all renewed hope, strength, and new life which we celebrate at Easter and beyond. Happy Easter and may God continue to bless and keep us all in His love and peace, Amen!
