KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION – WELLINGTON CATHOLIC DISTRICT SCHOOL BOARD

The Wellington Catholic District School Board will be accepting registrations for kindergarten at our schools beginning January 9th, 2023. <u>Kindergarten Eligibility</u>: must be 4 years of age on or before December 31, 2023, to attend Year 1 Kindergarten; must be 5 years of age on or before December 31, 2023, to attend Year 2 Kindergarten. <u>Required Documents</u>: child's birth certificate; a parent or child's Baptismal certificate; proof of tax support for families new to the system (i.e., most recent tax bill); proof of address (government document, mortgage, or rental agreement, Hydro bill, credit card statement); proper immigration documentation; custody documents (if applicable).

Students currently attending a WCDSB Year 1 Kindergarten program are NOT REQUIRED to register for Year 2 Kindergarten. Should you have any questions about registration procedures or requirements, please call the school.

A Catholic parish was established in 1873 for the Townships of Erin and Eramosa. IN 1959, Bishop Ryan asked the Jesuits to establish a mission in Erin. Masses were said at the Legion Hall until the Church was opened in 1965, with Jesuit Father Frederick Elliott serving as the pastor until 1981. Since then, the parish has had the following pastors: Father Edward Grace OSA, 1981-1986; Father Charles Lagan SFM, 1986 to 1990; Father Gus Arthurs CSSp, 1990-2001; Father Joe Kelly CSSp, 2001-2015; Father Ralph Diodati, 2015-2017; Father Don Sanvido, 2017-2021; and our current pastor, Father Gordian Okpuruka.
