

Death of Ammon.

The well known Utah Indian Ammon, half brother to the late celebrated chief, Walker, died in his camp at the mouth of Bingham's kanyon, on the 12th instant, as reported by Mr. Huntington, Indian interpreter. He had been sick a long time, of disease contracted by coming in contact with christian civilization, as practised by a Federal prosecuting Attorney at Nephi, while a District court was in session there some years since, but whether the disease was engendered at that time or since the army came to Utah, our informant saith not.

His death is said to have been extremely agonizing, and one of his horses was killed before the vital spark had fled, and four afterwards in accordance with the religious rites and ceremonies of the Indians on such occasions.
