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INT. DAY DOCTOR'S OFFICE.

MR. HUBAND  
Dr. Sillee?

DR. SILLEE  
Ah, Mr. Huband. Come in. I have some bad news for you. Your mother's gone.

MR. HUBAND

DR. SILLEE  
No, she's gone to the cafeteria. She'll be back in twenty minutes.

MR. HUBAND  
Oh.

Pause.

MR. HUBAND (CONT'D)  
You said on the phone you wanted to see me?

DR. SILLEE  
No, I'm already in a relationship.

MR. HUBAND  
What about my test results?

DR. SILLEE  
You're failing math, and you shouldn't look at girls so much in class.

MR. HUBAND  
I mean, what about my medical records?

DR. SILLEE  
Your records are off the charts.

MR. HUBAND  
You said I have acute angina?

DR. SILLEE  
Yes, it's very cute.

MR. HUBAND  
(pointing to his heart)  
It's my heart, isn't it?

DR. SILLEE  
Of course it's your heart. And  
that's your brain. What are you,  
stupid?

MR. HUBAND  
Give it to me straight, doc.  
What are my chances?

DR. SILLEE  
I'd say, better than even.

MR. HUBAND  
That's good, isn't it?

DR. SILLEE  
Evan died an hour ago.

MR. HUBAND  
Doctor, I'm worried. I keep seeing  
pink striped crocodiles when I go  
to sleep.

DR. SILLEE  
Have you seen a psychiatrist?

MR. HUBAND  
No, just the crocodiles.

Dr. Sillee gives him 3 pills to take.

DR. SILLEE  
Here, take this red pill in the  
morning with a glass of water, the  
green pill at lunch with a glass of  
water, and the blue pill at night  
with a glass of water.

MR. HUBAND  
Gosh, doc, what exactly is my  
problem?

DR. SILLEE  
You're not drinking enough water.

MR. HUBAND  
Doctor, will I ever live to be a  
hundred?

DR. SILLEE

Only if you give up rich foods and partying.

MR. HUBAND

Then will I live to be a hundred?

DR. SILLEE

No. But it sure as hell will seem like it. Look, Mr. Huband, the fact of the matter is, you've got heart disease and Alzheimer's.

MR. HUBAND

Well, at least I don't have heart disease.

DR. SILLEE

Look, Mr, Huband, I've got some bad news and some very bad news. What do you want to hear first?

MR. HUBAND
