Whereas the jurisdiction quadrennial meetings (also held every 4 years, but not in the same year) are to elect leadership, the Assembly is purely a time of celebration, inspiration, and rejuvenation. Exciting workshops and town halls are planned to produce a memorable weekend for attendees. I have been blessed to attend two Assemblies - the most recent one in Orlando and way back in the day in Cincinnati, Ohio. I promise that the occasion will not disappoint. You will be sure to return with wonderful stories. My Cincinnati trip involved helping a woman on her first escalator ride. She was at the foot of the escalator looking bewildered. In her stilted English, she said she had never ridden such a contraption. I took her hand and, fortunately, we made it to the top.

Early bird registration of \$365 continues through November 29. After that time, the price increases. We are working on bus transportation with North Georgia. Conference Treasurer Diane James is serving as Assembly liaison. A block of rooms has been reserved. Please contact Diane if you are attending and especially, if you want to secure a seat on the bus. We need to determine interest, so if there might be a remote possibility, please let Diane know. Southeastern Jurisdiction has funds available for one scholarship per conference. The scholarship, up to \$500, should be used to cover the cost of Early Bird registration. The following criteria will be used:

- First time attendee to Assembly, or
- A woman under the age of 40, or
- A woman who has joined United Women in Faith in the last year

The SEJ will reimburse the recipient at the end of Assembly when they present their registration receipt, an expense voucher, and a brief report of their Assembly activities. Please send names of possible scholarship recipients to sgaumw@gmail.com..

# SGA UWFaith Annual Meeting 2025


The SGA Conference UWFaith 2025 Annual meeting was opened with greetings from Rev. Christy Bandy, the







# Spiritual Growth Retreat and FaithWorks

Mark your calendars for the **2026 Spiritual Growth Retreat on March 20th to 22nd** at Epworth by the Sea on St. Simons Island. Our retreat leader will be Rev. Jenna Kennedy who serves as the Minister of Operations for FaithWorks, a ministry based in Brunswick, Georgia. The retreat will be held at Epworth by the Sea on March 20th—22nd.

FaithWorks ministry is currently featured in an article on the South Georgia UMC Conference website to advertise the launching of their "Love Thy Neighbor" campaign in response to the growing needs in the Brunswick, Georgia community.

Among the people FaithWorks serves are those facing chronic illness, poverty, and homelessness. According to the article, during the first 9 months of 2025, community support has helped FaithWorks to:

- Provide food or utility assistance to 2,400 families
- Help 170 people move out of homelessness
- Serve over 3,200 patients and families at Southeast Georgia Health System
- Provide \$2,600 in meal vouchers for cancer patients at Nunnally House
- Offer over \$30,000 in benevolent aid for medicine, IDs, and utility bills
- Deliver food monthly to 1,132 children and 325 seniors
- Make 570 home visits to those who are shut in and alone

Spiritual Growth Coordinator, Martha Ray, is working hard on pulling together a wonderful retreat experience. More details about the retreat will be coming out in January. We are looking forward to Rev. Jenna Kennedy's leadership!

FaithWorks began in 1995 as a ministry of the United Methodist Church to identify, study, and create models for ministry beyond the walls of the local church. From its early years, FaithWorks has evolved into a community-focused ecumenical ministry that focuses on -- but is not limited to -- community healthcare services and poverty needs in Glynn County, GA and the surrounding Southeast Georgia area.

Because of all the government cuts, many of our mission agencies that serve women, children and youth are hurting. I pray your heart is in missions.

Each unit needs to have their mission giving to the District treasurer by December 5th so I can send in our pledge and our support for Wesley Community Center, Open Door Community Center and Vashti Center by December 20. This way our three South Georgia mission agencies will receive their gifts by January. What a great way to start 2026!

Remember 4th quarter supplementary giving will go to our three South Georgia mission agencies.
