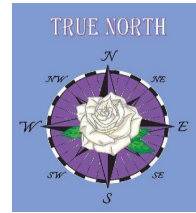

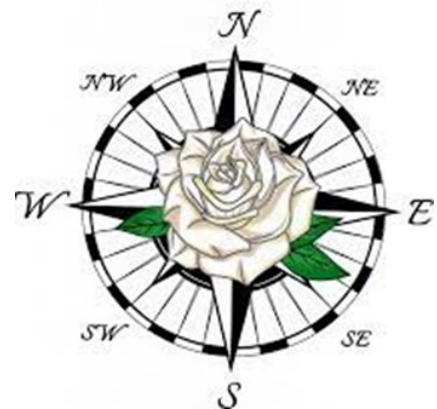

My name is Cindy Eberspacher.

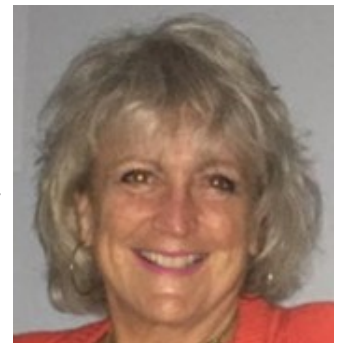
