- 1. Project completion final signoff.
  - a. When you complete your project, finish the last part of the project application, the project report.
  - b. At the end of this report, you will need to get the signature of your beneficiary.
  - c. You will also need to arrange a project completion meeting with the SM. At that meeting, the SM will review the project with you, including what your learned from the project. If everything is satisfactory, the SM will sign the project paperwork and sign completion of the project in your handbook.
  - d. Your project is not complete until you have the signature on the project report and in your handbook!!
- 2. Provide a summary of service hours to the SM or Eagle Coordinator. This is for proper credit for scout service hours. The data needs to be done by date since the days of the work could make a difference for scouts earning credit for rank. Provide the following information for <u>each date</u> worked, and include all scouts, including those from other troops. Sometimes we have to confirm service work hours with those troops.
