



1795, under the teaching of Reverend Childers, is considered the official starting date of the African Freedmen's Society in Rhode Island, Second African Methodist Episcopal Church, Providence – changed to Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church of Providence, Jan. 1895. A former slave, Ichabod Northrup, was among the founders of the church; Northrup fought in the Revolutionary War.

During those early years, men and women of color were ostracized, criticized, arrested and even convicted of the crime of organizing a church of their own. But Bethel continued to prosper, meeting in the homes of members as well as in a Quaker meeting house on North Main Street. When one meeting place was removed by the authorities, it was replaced by another, and sometimes two or three. As the significance of the church began to grow, its reputation as a monument of freedom and destination on the Underground Railroad reached many slaves in the South.

The lot on which the church was eventually located was purchased in 1820, and a building was constructed on the site in 1866. After 95 years of worship in the building, the walls began to crumble, and the congregation grew smaller. In 1961 the property was sold to Brown University, and the church purchased its building on Rochambeau. The first service at that site was conducted in February 1962.

Bethel was not just a place of worship. It hosted a Sunday lyceum, bringing in speakers to educate and inspire the community on various topics. A testament to faith, education, and community strength. Since 1838, Bethel A.M.E. Church Providence, Rhode Island has had a rich history where African American's have gathered for worship for generations. We invite communities of all cultures and ethnicities to join us in worship and in community collaboration to Renew, Rebuild, and Restore the people of God.

We encourage you to experience God in a unique way through the various ministries we are called to deliver to our neighbors and friends.

Today, Bethel remains a home for those souls that are looking to find their way into the redeeming arms of our Lord and Savior, Jesus the Christ.

It serves over one hundred members under the teaching and guidance of Reverend Wayne S. Daley, MDiv.



Reverend Wayne Sylvester Daley, MDiv., earned his Master of Divinity form Andover Newton Theological School, an affiliate of Yale Divinity School. He previously served as an associate minister for St. Paul African Methodist Episcopal Church, under the leadership of Rev. Dr. Ellis Ishmael Washington, and he previously served as the Minister to Men and Sr. Associate Minister under the leadership of his father in the ministry, Rev. Dr. Gregory George Groover, Sr., Pastor of The Historic Charles Street African Methodist Episcopal Church.

Rev. Wayne previously served as a Boston Reentry Coordinator, and the Community Relations Director for the Boston TenPoint Coalition, under the leadership of Rev. B. Christopher Sumner and Rev. Jeffery Lamont Brown. Rev. Wayne served as the Pastor for St. Mark Congregational Church, United Church of Christ, while serving as a

part-time Protestant Chaplain for the Suffolk County Sheriff's Department. He currently serves as a Chaplain for Curry College.

Rev. Daley served as the Intergenerational Justice Program Coordinator, and then the Technical Training & Assistance Coordinator, and a Peace From Within Instructor at Plymouth County House of Corrections for The Louis D. Brown Peace Institute. Rev. Wayne went on to serve as the Bridging the GAP Director (a diversion program in partnership with the Suffolk County District Attorney's Office, and the Teen Center Manager for the Salvation Army Ray & Joan Kroc Corps Community Center. Rev. Wayne served as the Deputy Director of Community Engagement for the Suffolk County District Attorney's Office before going full time in the ministry.

Rev. Daley has partnered with many agencies, and institutions in the community such as; The Boston School Police, The Transit Police, The Department, Project Right, Inc., Haley House, Massachusetts Black Alcoholism & Addiction Council, Access To Recovery Coach, and Neighborhood Community Walk Trainer. Rev. Wayne served on the board of the Quincy-Geneva New Vision, and the Cooperative Metropolitan Ministries. Rev. Daley was appointed by Mayor Michelle Wu to the Boston Police Accountability and Transparency Civilian Review Board; he serves on the board for The Black Ministerial Alliance of Greater Boston, Inc., and My Life My Choice.

On Monday, June 24, 2024, Rev. Wayne Sylvester Daley, was appointed Pastor of Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Providence, Rhode Island by Bishop Julius H. McAllister, Sr. Lastly, during the 174th Session of the New England Annual Conference Bishop Samuel L. Green, Sr., reappointed Rev. Daley back to Bethel Providence.

Bishop Samuel Lawrence Green Sr.



Bishop Samuel L. Green Sr. discovered his calling to ministry at a young age, driven by a profound sense of purpose. As the newly appointed presiding prelate of the First Episcopal District of the African Methodist Episcopal Church, he oversees the Bermuda, Delaware, New England, New Jersey, New York, Western New York, and Philadelphia annual conferences. His ministry is rooted in the belief that when we put God first, He will 'Do It Again.'

From 2016 to 2024, Bishop Green led the Seventh Episcopal District of the AME Church (South Carolina) with dynamic leadership, affectionately known as "The Green Effect." He founded the Vision Center, a 218-acre Conference and Retreat Center, fulfilling a long-held dream of providing a comprehensive meeting facility for the AME Church. Bishop Green's ministry is also marked by his innovative and record-breaking conferences and events, designed to reach members of all ages and to support local churches in expanding their ministries.

Bishop Green's legacy is highlighted by his passion for expanding God's kingdom, supporting pastors and local churches, and advocating for justice and equality. He established the Dickerson-Green Theological Seminary, the first and only ATS-accredited African American seminary in South Carolina.

Elected as the 125th bishop in the history of the AME Church, Bishop Green has served faithfully across several districts. He is also the founder of God First Ministries, a platform designed to promote evangelism, discipleship, and church growth.

Despite his many achievements, Bishop Green remains focused on his mission, guided by Matthew 6:33: "But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and His righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you."
