



Hello to all of you!

The blocks should all be finished very soon and the final stage of completing the quilt will begin. I am including instructions for the sashing and border, but you are welcome to complete your quilt any way you like. I can't wait to see them in December!

Thanks for participating in making this Summer Block Party quilt. I'm looking forward to showing you the upcoming quilt for 2026.

Instructions for sashing and border:
Cut 6 2.5" squares for cornerstones
Cut 17 2.5" x 12.5" rectangles for sashing
Cut 7 2.5" x WOF strips for borders
Cut 7 2.5 x WOF strips for binding
Sew two cornerstones between 3 of the 12.5" rectangles for the horizontal sashing. Make 3 of these.

Sew a 12.5" rectangle between the blocks for the vertical sashing.

Then sew the rows together and add the border.

At the auction you may have noticed us giving bags to our different charities along with a check from the guild. These bags were full of the donations made or provided by guild members.

Baytown Homeless shelter received over 70 pillowcases for their clients. These will be gifted to take when they leave.

The Pregnancy Resource Center received over 30 blankets, and burp cloths along with a basket containing baby items.

The Baytown Police Department Special Victims Unit received two bags, one filled with stuffed animals and one with over 20 bags containing toothbrushes, toothpaste, books and miscellaneous toys for the children they remove from dangerous situations.

We also gifted Love, Inc with 20 tote bags. Tote bags are definitely needed for Love, Inc. Baytown Police Department Special Victims Unit.

There will be more kits available in January. We also have over ten blankets to be donated.
