#### BAQG Members' Meeting Minutes – April 7, 2025

President Sherry Mendenhall called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and welcomed members, guests, and new members. She wished all April birthday members a happy birthday.

President Mendenhall stated that the minutes of the previous BAQG meeting has been printed in the newsletter. Kelly Pilkinton made a motion to approve the minutes; Becky Wilson seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer Gail Lumus presented the monthly financial report, with a balance of \$43,818.75. Kelly Pilkinton made a motion to approve the financial report. Lois Tandy seconded the motion. It passed unanimously. Linda Hord gave a brief report about upcoming speakers and workshops. She reported that the Linda Hahn workshop still had available seating. Upcoming workshops will be held in May, June (Invisible Machine Applique), and September (Borders, Binding, and More). Members are encouraged to register for workshops early.

Auction: Janie DeStefano and Gail Lumus gave an update on the 2025 auction, which will be held on October 6. Janie displayed a quilt she had donated for the auction, and Gail asked donors to include the name of donated quilts, the quilter's name, the pattern designer, the name of the person who pieced it, and a story about the quilt. Gail also asked for donations of Hot Wheels for a silent auction basket, and for the donation of empty baskets.

Community Service – Cindie Stolz reported that she has fabric available for use on Quilt of Valor blocks. If members want to make a quilt of valor for a specific person, they are asked to inform her of the quilt and the person honored. She reported that she has bibs for members to embellish for donation to the Pregnancy Resource Center. She also has batting for quilts to be donated, bags for the Police Department, and pillowcases for the homeless shelter. And, she reported that the BAQG By-laws currently states that each service project calls for a separate Community

Service chair, and she asked members to consider chairing a project.

Hospitality – JoAnn Massony reminded all that all members are required to serve on the monthly hospitality team at least once each year and is expected to participate by bringing food. She passed around the sign-up list. She also asked for members to think about whether they would rather continue with the full-meal method of hospiltality, or if they would be more interested in a coffee-and-dessert hospitality program.

BOM – There was no Bock of the Month this month. In May, the pennants and popsicles are due.

Raffle Quilt Tickets/Show and Tell – Jan Cobb thanked the members for picking up their raffle tickets. She then introduced tonight's show and tell quilts and encouraged all members to share their work.

Mini-Raffle – Sharron Wood showed the three prizes that were provided and tickets were sold for each prize. All proceeds from the mini-raffle go back to the guild. Mini raffle winners were selected.

Door Prizes – winners were selected for member, guest, and door prize drawings.

Tool Time – Katrina Sommerfield introduced a new tool, the Creative Friends Spiderweb ruler. A winner was selected to win the tool time raffle.

Program – Linda Hord introduced Linda Hahn, who spoke on "New York Beauty" quilts blocks. She shared many examples using the New York Beauty pattern, and she regaled the group with stories about her book-writing experiences. Thanks to Linda for this informative program.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:45 p.m.
