## **Block of the Month**

# **Minnette Repsher**

We certainly enjoyed seeing the popsicle and pennant blocks at our last meeting. We are going to double up on blocks for June. Block #5 is the Sailboat. At the meeting we discussed a couple of changes that need to be made to this pattern. Make sure when cutting the background, you change the measurement on the very first piece on the list. It says to cut a rectangle that is 7" x 10" but you will need to make that 8" x 11" instead. Also, in step 2 make sure when you make the diagonal cut you cut just the opposite direction. Pictures are included below.

Then in Step 4 you will use that 8"x11" piece to sew to the blue sail, centering it and using a 3/8" seam allowance. This is to make sure the point of the sail ends at the bottom with a 1/4" left over for the seam allowance. After pressing the block, trim to 12 1/2" square.

The Flag block, #6, will be much simpler. It went together easily.

Fabrics are named by color family with the exact Riley Blake color noted in parentheses, feel free to substitute your favorite fabrics!



Fabric C: Blue (Cadet): 1 piece 2 1/2" x 12 1/2" 1 piece 1 1/2' x 7"


#### STEP TWO:

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the  $6^{\prime\prime}\times6^{\prime\prime}$ piece of Fabric A. Place the unit created in step one on top of the 6" x 6" piece of Fabric A, right sides facing

#### **Minutes – May 5, 2025**

President Sherry Mendenhall called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m. and welcomed members, guests, and new members. She wished all May birthday members a happy birthday. Treasurer Gail Lumus presented the monthly financial report, with a balance of \$42,201.03. Gloria Hill made a motion to approve the financial report. Dorothy Swonke seconded the motion. It passed unanimously. Linda Hord gave a brief report about upcoming speakers and workshops. Upcoming workshops will be held in June (Invisible Machine Applique), and September (Borders, Binding, and More). Members are encouraged to register for workshops early. She also reported that she had purchased a 120" screen for use by speakers who want to give PowerPoint presentations.

Auction: Janie DeStefano and Gail Lumus gave an update on the 2025 auction, which will be held on October 6. Janie displayed a quilt she had donated for the auction. She asked donors to include the name of the quilts, the quilter's name, the pattern designer, the name of the person who pieced it, and a story about the quilt. Gail displayed some of the items donated for the silent auction.

Raffle Quilt Ticket Sales/Show and Tell: Jan Cobb encouraged all members to sell extra tickets to help raise money for the guild. She also reported on Community Service projects on behalf of Cindie Stolz. She asked members to bring hygiene items for donation to Love Network. She then introduced tonight's Show and Tell quilts and encouraged all members to share their work. BOM – Minnette Repsher shared the Block of the Month squares (popsicles and pennants) and she gave hints and tips for next month's blocks (sailboat and flags).

Mini-Raffle – Sharron Wood showed the three prizes that were provided, and tickets were sold for each prize. All proceeds from the mini raffle go back to the guild. Mini raffle winners were selected.

Door Prizes – winners were selected for member, guest, and door prize drawings.

Tool Time – Katrina Sommerfeld introduced a new tool, and a winner was selected to win the tool time raffle.

Linda Hord introduced Lisa Erlandson, who presented a program titled "Star Light, Star Bright, Stars Upon My Bed Tonight". She shared quilts from her extensive personal collection of star-themed quilts. She also invited those who are interested in having quilts appraised to let her know. Thanks to Lisa for this informative program.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:45 p.m.
