

After brief instructions everyone jumped in and got to work. Now what to do with it all. It could not have been done in such a short time without the work accomplished by those who came. My heart is forever grateful.

Love, Inc and the Baytown police department need totes which take less than an hour to make. At our August 4 meeting, we will be asking you to pick up a kit. You can use fabric that you have to add to the kits. It doesn't matter the prints used for Love, Inc. but please use the kids prints for the police department. The totes are given to each child who is removed from a serious situation, so the child has something to put some treasures, maybe underwear, toothbrush a favorite blanket from home to take with them. The totes for Love, Inc will be used for carrying canned goods or personal hygiene items. You can choose what you would like to make but the totes should be addressed first.
