



Minutes – November 3, 2025

Vice-president, Linda Hord called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm and welcomed members and guests. She wished Happy Birthday to members with October and November birthdays.

Vice-president Linda announced the membership forms for the 2026 membership year would be coming out soon, as well as information about the raffle tickets for the 2026 donation quilt. She also stated that the minutes of the September 2025 BAQG meeting were printed in the newsletter. Kelly Pilkinton made a motion to approve the minutes; Angie Brown seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer Gail Lumus presented the monthly financial report. The current balance on hand as of October 31, 2025, is \$41,221.78. Cathy Carnew made a motion to approve the financial report. Gina Miller seconded the motion. It passed unanimously.

Linda Hord gave a brief report about upcoming speakers. She directed members to the most recent BAQG newsletter which includes a detailed month by month list of all 5 workshops for 2026. January's workshop will be presented by Patti Roebuck. February's 2-day workshop by Toni Oyler will be a Judy Neimeyer quilt. The April workshop will be presented by Scott Flanagan. In June, Lisa Ellis will present a cathedral windows machine quilted projects. The August workshop will be by Joyce Hughes and will feature a project using dimensional thread painting. Gina Miller is already taking registrations for all 2026 workshops.

Gail Lumus gave a summary of the successful 2025 auction, which was held on October 6. Gail announced that the auction produced a profit of approximately \$9,400 and she thanked all members and donors for their contributions. Jan Cobb thanked all members who bought or sold raffle tickets, and it was announced that the 2026 donation quilt is currently being quilted.

Hospitality Chair JoAnn Massony announced that there would no longer be a hospitality meal at meetings. There will be holiday meal in December

Christmas party. The guild will provide the meats and drinks for the party, and all members in attendance will bring side dishes and/or desserts to share.

BOM – Minnette Repsher shared the Block of the Month square, the Starburst. She reminded all members that the completed project, "Summer Block Party", will be on display at the December Meeting. Jan Cobb then introduced tonights Show and Tell quilts and encouraged all members to share their work. Six members shared their work with the membership.


BREAK
