letter to the brethren in Colosse, he instructed them to pass the letter to others so that they might read it also. "And when this epistle is read among you, cause that it be read also in the church of the Laodiceans; and that ye likewise read the epistle from Laodicea" (Col. 4:16). He also informed the brethren at Ephesus that they would be able to understand the mystery that was in Christ by reading the epistle, "Whereby, when ye read, ye may understand my knowledge in the mystery of Christ)" (Eph. 3:4). Reading is thus an essential part of our need so that we might grow as newborn babes should. "As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby:" (1 Pet. 2:2). Peter also said, "But grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. To him be glory both now and for ever. Amen." (2 Pet. 3:18). Reading and studying go hand in hand, and by this means, we begin to grow in the knowledge of our Lord. (Please read Jimmy Clark's article in this issue).

Growth in the word of God has always been a problem for some in the church. Even in the early church, some were falling back into their old habits. The Hebrews write stated, "Of whom we have many things to say, and hard to be uttered, seeing ye are dull of hearing. For when for the time ye ought to be teachers, ye have need that one teach you again which be the first principles of the oracles of God; and are become such as have need of milk, and not of strong meat. For every one that useth milk is unskilful in the word of righteousness: for he is

a babe. But strong meat belongeth to them that are of full age, even those who by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil" (Heb. 5:11-14).

In chapter six, he begins by saying, "Therefore," that is, we need to move forward unto perfection because of these things. There comes a time when each child of God must leave the drinking of milk and move on to eating meat. If one does not do so, one may fall from the grace of God.

"For it is impossible for those who were once enlightened, and have tasted of the heavenly gift, and were made partakers of the Holy Ghost, And have tasted the good word of God, and the powers of the world to come, If they shall fall away, to renew them again unto repentance; seeing they crucify to themselves the Son of God afresh, and put him to an open shame" (Heb. 6:4–6).

Hence, it is imperative that we study more each day to grow and not fall by the way-side. I have for some time marked out on my desktop calendar a daily reading for the New Testament. If I stay on track by using this method, I can read through the New Testament in one month; by doing these each month at the end of the year, naturally, I will have read through the New Testament twelve times. Surely as one does this, they will learn along the way. Each month, I take one New Testament book and read it each day, such as the book of Ephesians.

Whatever means one chooses to use, please give attention to reading and studying God's word daily for your soul's sake.

DO I NEED TO IMPROVE MY BIBLE STUDY?

The fact that we are commanded to study is quite evident. "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth" (2 Tim. 2:15). Notice, we are to study to have God's approval. The ASV translates this phrase, "Give diligence to present thyself approved unto God...." Furthermore, it states that we are to "handling (handle) aright the word of truth." This is to be done so as a workman, we need not be ashamed of our knowledge of God's holy word and how we handle His word. Studying God's word is a process by which we come to an understanding of the things God has revealed to us through His word. This process does not end in one's lifetime. Some of these things are pretty simple, but others can be somewhat complex.

Sometimes this process can become a difficult proposition for some. Far too often, members of the body of Christ would rather just accept what the preacher and teachers say instead of searching for the truth on their own. When Luke was writing about the brethren in Berea, he stated that they "...were more noble than those in Thessalonica, in that they received the word with all readiness of mind, and searched the scriptures daily, whether those things were so. Therefore many of them believed; also of honourable women which were Greeks, and of men, not a few" (Acts 17:11,12). As a result of their searching the scriptures, many believed, both women and men. Hence, the growth of their faith was a direct result of their studying the word of God.

We all need to improve our Bible Study habits. I know that I do, and I often search for ways in which I can do just that. I recall growing up in South-West Missouri on a farm where we worked from sun-up to sun-down. We were loggers, and we often would be in the woods with our headlights on and often leave with them on also. But no matter how much time we spent working, I remember seeing my dad sitting at the kitchen table, studying his Bible daily. He would work all week, study at night and be ready to preach on Sunday. So from an early age, I understood that to learn the Bible, you would need to put some time into reading and studying what it says. Unless you are willing to put the required time into your Bible study, you will not be able to improve your knowledge about God and His word.

Reading the word of God is very important. Paul told the young evangelist Timothy, "Till I come, give attendance to reading, to exhortation, to doctrine" (1 Tim. 4:13). When Paul sent the
