Kniffen requested signs, bags and bag dispenser for collection of dog feces to be placed at south and north end of city's baseball field. Council agreed to order the signs and supplies to be placed at the city's baseball field.

Darrin Kriz provided an update from last council meeting that the baseball and softball association Softball Friday nights were ok with the co-ed teams to play softball on Friday evenings. Council agreed to co-ed teams to play softball on Friday evenings at the city softball parks.

Ron Wagner reported the Tyndall ambulance has items to be declared surplus. Finance officer requested a list to be provided to include in the May council meeting.

Gina Lhotak is not responding to certified mail that has been sent to her from the city. The contract between the Tyndall Development Company and Gina Lhotak specifies Lhotak is responsible for repairs to the outside north wall, which was to be completed within one year of signing the contract. No decision was made.

Austin Koch, Marty Koch, Ron Wagner and Kassidy Schonebaum discussed development to build a house on the Foley lots between 18th and 19th Avenues and Birch and Elm Streets. Council agreed to contact Schmucker, Paul, Nohr and Associates to survey the property before a decision is made.

Lee and Cheri Wittmeier of County Road Auction & Sales made a request to use part of Main Street or the city park on May 21st to showcase vehicles for their consignment sale. Council agree to the closure of Main Street and Dick Jones will be the contact for the street closure.

Kendra Krueger and Lisa Sobatka requested expenses for the swim team season. Council approved swim team expenses purchase laptop computer \$400-\$500; pay for head coach to be hourly instead of salary, estimate hours 24-30 hours per week for six weeks; and dues for swim team members, no amount provided except 2021 cost was \$15 per member for a total of \$750.

Moved by Soukup, second by Stepka to approve a special 1-day liquor license to Tyndall Fire Department on April 30 at the Auditorium. All voting in favor of. Motion carried.

Bob Foley presented an update on the Pocket Park design contest for the lots on main street between Cahoy's General Store and The Original Gym. Council agreed to the next step, to contact District III to create a formal design for cost estimates and finance officer will be the contact person for the city.

No Council reports from K Ranek, Soukup, Skorpik, Stepka, and J Ranek. Chester received a nuisance complaint on Ivy Street.

Bon Homme County Treasurer has started tax deed proceedings on the property of Sharon & Robert Bell located at Lot Four (4) and the East Half (E ½) of Lot Five (5), Block Nine (9) of Currier's 2nd Addition to the City of Tyndall, in Bon Homme County, South Dakota. Council did not have interest in the property.

Moved by Chester, second by Stepka to approve the purchase of a camera to be used for city business. All voting in favor of. Motion carried.

K Ranek, Chester, and Mayor Elsberry has discussed with Adrianna Petersen about the Daycare Center lease and the Daycare may be sold. Petersen wants to continue until end of lease. No further action was taken.

Skorpik would like more water in city pond. Jones stated the reason for not filling the pond at the park is the outside temperature is low and could freeze the pipes, which the last three-four feet of pipe is above ground. No decision was made.

Moved by K Ranek, second by Soukup to approve the special meeting to canvas results of April 12 municipal election for April 14 at 6:30. All voting in favor of. Motion carried.

Moved by K Ranek, second by Chester to appoint Ginger Peschl, Connie Hawks and Diane Bauder to the Election Board for the April 12 Municipal Election and set their pay at \$12.00/hr. and \$20.00 for attending election school. All voting in favor of. Motion carried.

Mayor Elsberry discussed a South Dakota Transportation Grant for sidewalks. Application deadline is July 15. Council will have the finance officer verify deadline date. Council is interested in pursuing grant.
