OUR VISION AND MISSION

- Vision To become our regions premier chess club by providing best in class equipment (all provided), leveraging chess technology, and a center with the ability to unite the region under one roof. We have one location, in Brecksville, Ohio; centrally located in our region. Satellite locations may be included. We envision building a model that is profitable and growing along with the growth in interest in Chess nationwide.
- Missions To bring the region together under one club that provides the services listed in this document. We do not intend to be a center that provides services to students other than young players who have advanced beyond basic levels of instruction. We believe there are too many clubs and one club that provides a level of consistency with a center and various services will help the region's chess scene be strengthened and recognized nationally. Our mission is to do all these things with classic levels of profit. Ideally 15% net income and at least 40% gross margin.



OUR FACILITY

- Location: 10060 Brecksville Road, Brecksville, Ohio. Conveniently located by the turnpike, 77, and 271. Across the street from the soon to be complete Valor Acres ® which will have hotels, restaurants, etc. Regardless there are plenty of restaurants and hotels near bye.
- Due to the work from home transition, we are leveraging the space of 'USA Firmware, LLC,' owned by Bob Scaccia who also is President of the club.
- Within the facility is a kitchen, bathrooms, refrigerator, microwave, free coffee, espresso, filtered water, a skittles room, two visitor or player rest lounges, a company store, rooms for private games and private instruction.



OUR FACILITY

- The facility has Wi-Fi connectivity for guests via a Guest network. Look for USAF-Guest in the network list. Use the password that is on a plaque on a table in the main event space. .
- During events, members can still use the facility for other purposes. There are rooms dedicated to this. You can for example study, play against others, quietly review games with friends, etc.
- Please note any signs that state materials within are for USA Firmware employees only. If you wish to store something, please see a GCC representative.



OUR CLUB

- We have a main event room with a registration room that has a glass wall to observe from. We can easily seat 60.
- All equipment is provided! This is a major feature of our club. We continue to invest in luxury sets from Digital Game Technology ®! We are also an approved reseller of DGT products. We own 15 smart chess boards and sets of which about half are super GM wood sets used at the major tournaments including the candidate matches and the world championship.
- Games played on DGT smart boards allow us to retrieve the games in PGN. See section on Club & Center services for more information on purchasing your PGN game files. Broadcasting (under careful controls) is also possible and has been used in the past but cheating concerns need to be considered.
- Our club is primarily based on memberships, but anyone can come to the center and play in any and all tournaments, participate in all events, etc, and not just members. Pricing for non-members and what is provided for members is covered in the 'Members' section.

GAME PRICING CALCULATION

Games are priced based on a time of play calculator (see spreadsheet to the right.) This way a consistent method is used which anyone can calculate. It's based off the time controls and an assumed number of moves. We are not including complex time controls, but a similar calculation could be made.

Time of Play (minutes) per Player = $\{[(seconds \times 40 \text{ moves})/60] + \text{minutes}\}$ Time of Play per player = $(5 \times 40)/60 + 30 = 3.33 + 30 = 33.33 \text{ minutes per player}$ Total Time of Play = $33.33 \times 2 \text{ players} = 66.67 \text{ minutes} = 1.11 \text{ hours per game}$ Cost per Game = \$3.10 (present cost everything is based on)

Therefore, cost for a Quad = $$3.10 \times 1.1 \times 3$ games = \$10 (rounded to nearest number)

STARTING YOUR CHESS TOURNAMENT

Check in with the TD to let them know you are present

Once the TD has completed the pairings, they will announce "Pairings are up!" Pairings may be done electronically in which case you will see a monitor displaying your pairing or done with paper in which the paper will be posted, at our club on the registration rooms glass wall.

The pairings will tell you which color you are, your opponent and which table number. Table numbers are on placards.

Please sit at your table and await announcements. Once your TD says, "Can I have your attention," the room should be quiet.



PREPARING TO START YOUR GAME





DURING YOUR GAME



If you have a concern or see a rule violation, pause your clock, raise your hand, express your concern. The TD may or may not take some form of action after which, resume your game.



You must notate your game per USCF rules. Having the DGT smart boards, which will notate your games for you, is not per USCF rules sufficient for notation.



If you are going to resign, tip your king, or say, "I resign" and shake hands with your opponent.

ENDING YOUR GAME:

Notify DGT

• If on a DGT smart board, follow the procedure to notify DGT of the result.

Reset Clock

• Reset the clock for the next round.

Opening

• If e-DGT, specify the Opening System on your scoresheet if possible.

Set Pieces

• Set the pieces in their starting position.



RECORDING OFFICIAL RESULT

- Paper recording if the tournament is using paper pairing sheets, those sheets are usually posted in plain view. At our club, we will typically post the pairing sheets on the glass wall that separates the play area from the registration room. In this case, either player can record the result to the right of the pairing noted on the sheet.
- Electronic pairing if the tournament is using CaissaChess software for pairings, a computer monitor will be made available. The TD will let you know where the monitor is. In this case, the monitor will display the pairings with box fields to the right of each player's name and a list of result choices will run horizontally above the pairings. Click your result from the list of choices and then click your box field next to your name. This informs the system as to the result and the next pairing can begin.

• <u>Blitz</u>: These are fast and fun. They are not rated and for those of our members who are big fans of this fast and furious format. Format will vary greatly depending upon attendance. These are not rated. Typical time control of G3+2. Tournaments planned to start at 8pm. Remember this are NOT rated but we will use most of the funds collected for the prize fund.





INTERNAL PRIVATE TOURNAMENTS

Internal Club: Members or guests with day passes can hold rated tournaments of their own creation at the club. For example. Say you have a friend, and you want to play a best of 7 with a time control of your own choosing. As long as a TD is on site, which is most of the time, the game will be rated and can be played.



LADDER

A ladder goes on all year. The prize fund is held and grows through the year. **Structure**: Players are assigned a rung on the ladder. Initially they are placed at the bottom. If more than one at a time join, it's randomized. Lower rung number, the higher the position and rank. The goal is to reach the coveted #1 position. **How it Works**: Players move up by winning games. Challengers challenge players that are at a higher rank. If the challenger wins, the swap places on the ladder. If challenger loses, no change and challenger must play someone else at least once before re-challenging. A draw has no impact, and the challenger cannot re-challenge for one turn.

Time Control: G30 d5 (other if both players agree)

Entry Fee: See Fee/Prize Chart.

Frequency: Anytime that the club is open.
USCF Membership NOT Required.

End of Year Prizes: 1st in Section, Top Rank, Years biggest upset,

and best won/lost ratio.

Note! If the players are within 100 rating points, they will play

rated if both players have USCF memberships.



There is interest in club to club tournaments. For example vs. Pittsburgh Chess Club, or Dayton, or Columbus and so on. The details would need to be worked out between the clubs.




CLUB VS. CLUB



PLACE AN ORDER FOR A PRODUCT FROM OUR STORE





You can ask for the PGN file later but this requires more work for us and an additional fee will be added.



Include in there your name, USCF ID, rated or not,, desired time control(s), no. of games, opponent rating range, type (double, single round robin..) in the email.

We will confirm and then place you on our list of interested players, post it on the website and notify you when we receive other players who have close or identical requests.

If you see another request on the website that is of interest to you, please notify us and we will contact the person to see if they are interested.

Once you have a match confirmed, please pay via the various payment methods. Preferably please pay the full amount but you can also play game by game.



CREATE YOUR OWN CHESS TOURNAMENT

- You can play a rated game spontaneously at the center as long as the TD is on site.
- You can also look at the sheet that shows players interested in creating a game or playing for example a best of seven round robin with long time controls over a period of several weeks.
- Have enough for a Quad? Go ahead and set one up and arrive at the club to play it.
- P Be sure to review the pricing and pay for your game(s) before you leave.





OUR CHESS LIBRARY

- There are between 50 and 100 chess books and growing at the center.
- You can use one at the center or check one out.
- There is a sign-out sheet in the library. You can check out a book for 30 days after which a fee will apply.
- If a book you want is checked out, put your name on the waiting list.
 Otherwise, the person who has checked the book out can check it out for another month.



CHESS INSTRUCTION SERVICES

Tokens Based – to utilize our chess instructors, you will need to purchase tokens. Each token gives you one hour of instruction. Regular price for one hour token is \$100. Members will receive a set of free tokens as part of their membership which will be on their membership card. After those are consumed, they need to purchase tokens. Tokens given to a member are not allowed to be exchanged with other members.

Private Lessons – these are lessons provided at the center during center hours. So if you wish to hold an hour lesson with one of our masters, please just provide the token to the master you wish to work with and you can either start at that time, or schedule another time.

Five Week Classes – Al-Shami School of Chess will be putting on 5-week consecutive courses on a variety of topics and these will be held at least one evening per week. These courses cost all players 3 tokens. Obviously you can use your tokens you receive upon becoming a member.

NON-TOKEN-BASED INSTRUCTION



Simultaneous Chess Exhibitions: Depending on the number of players, we will or will not allow you to 'pass' when it's your turn to make your move. When the exhibitor reaches your table, make your move; no sooner. Be sure to record all your moves.



A prize to be determined will be provided to the first to beat the master, or first to draw if no winners. If no wins/draws, master will select best game played.



Lectures: These are typically held by IM Calvin Blocker who is the best lecturer in the region bar none.



CHESS BOARDS

Smart DGT Boards. Place the white pieces on the side of the board that has the USB and Smart Clock connector. Make sure pieces are in the correct positions before starting your game. When you finish your game, let the DGT software know your game result. To do this, perform the following steps:

- 1. Immediately pause the clock when the game is done.
- 2. If White won, place the white king on the e4 square and the black king on the d5 square.
- 3. If Black one, place the black king on the e5 square and the white king on the d4 square.
- 4. If it was a draw, place the white king on the e4 square and the black king on the e5 square.
- 5. Wait 5 seconds and then you can do what you would like to with the pieces but once you are done with some review of the game with your opponent, please set the pieces up in the ready position, and reset the clock (see Clock section on how to do this).



CHESS CLOCKS

DGT3000: clocks are used with DGT Smart Boards. Make sure the cable coming out the side of the clock is connected to the board. The settings should be already set for a tournament. To turn on the clock, toggle the white button found on the bottom of the clock. The clock should come up and flash the correct time and increment for the tournament you are attending. Be sure to have the white bar up on the side of the white pieces. To get the clock ready to play the game, toggle the right triangle and then toggle the pause/start button. Once you are ready to play, have black toggle the pause start button after shaking hands. At this point the clock should be running. When you finish your game, pause the clock and set the pieces up to inform the DGT system of the game result. To reset the clock so that the next player has a clock ready to go, toggle the on/off button on the bottom of the clock and follow the above procedure again.

CHESS CLOCKS

POGT Easy Clocks: These are simple clocks but they have all the features we need for all forms of play. The clocks should be present upon your arrival to a tournament. We don't recommend using these for play that is unguided by a TD. There is an on button on the front of the clock. When you toggle this button, the time control should already be set and ready for play. Toggle the black bar with white side in the UP position. To start your game, shake hands and have black start the clock by toggling the center circle button with both a right triangle and a pause symbol. This starts the clock running. When you are done with the game, toggle the on button off and on again to return to the starting position of the clock and return the black bar to it's correct position.



EVENT PREP -FACILITY

CLOSE OUT EVENT

- Fill the dishwasher and run it if necessary.
